

Trust on Him, for only He understands.


There are mountains to conquer and castles to build. It may just be a dream now, but tomorrow fulfilled.

Dappled or pied.


Dusky or blue -

# INTERCLASS CHINESE DEBATING CONTEST



#### LUNAR NEW YEAR GATHERING



# SECOND OMEGA ROSEBOWL FOR CSK



The highest award a school can get for sport is the Omega Rosebowl. Every year Omtis present Rosebowls to the Hong Kong Schools Sports Association for the Champion and Runners-up schools in three categories — Boys schools, Girls schools and Co-ed schools. They also present a Rosebowl for the Most Progressive school in each category.

#### SWIFTER



The Champion and Runners-up are decided on a points scoring system whereby each team is awarded points according to the league position in each sport. The points vary from sport to sport and depend on the number of teams taking part and the Division that a team is in. The Most Progressive School is selected by the Executive Committee of the HKSSA and they consider such things as the facilities and size of a school as well as past performance.

CSK was awarded the Most Progressive Rosebowl (Boys Section) back in 1974 when we were only five years old — not a bad achievement! At that time we had fifteen teams taking part in five sports. We had a total of 31 points and we were in 6th position overall. Since then we have slowly improved and added more sports. Now we have teams competing in ten sports.

The Rosebowls were first introduced in 1966 and since then the Boys Section has been dominated by DBS at first and more recently by La Salle. DBS have been Champions eight times while La Salle have won the trophy seven times. Ying Wa is the only other school to have won it — that was in 1971. Since 1975 La Salle have been Champions with DBS taking the Runners-up Rosebowl. This year La Salle have totalled nearly 200 points and will retain the Champions Rosebowl, but a new name — CSK — will be inscribed on the Runners-up



Trophy as we have finally overtaken DBS and now lead with 143 points to their 140.

So after 12 years CSK has risen from nothing to holders of the Omega Runners-up Rosebowl, an excellent performance. Congratulations to all members and coaches of the teams who helped make this possible. Also special thanks to the supporters of CSK who turned out to cheer on the teams to victory.





# SPORTS REPORT

Once again the season saw further expansion with a B grade volleyball team joining the other twenty six teams wearing our colours and competing in ten sports. The results were mixed but, in general, showing overall improvement. During the year we had boys selected to represent the Hong Kong Schools Teams in both basketball and football for the Interport against Macau and we also had the satisfaction of watching one of our athletes set a new record at the Inter School Meet. Chau Man Wah, Pang Kwan Lung and Chan Chi Ming were selected for the Interport basketball team, while Lee Sai Ho was on the Football team for the Interport. He was also sent to Manila to represent the Hong Kong Youth team in the Asian Youth Cup. Sung Ka Chun put his mane in the record book when he won the B grade 400m in a time of 52.19 seconds - a time which was better than the A Grade winner. Not content with that he also went on to win the 200m quite comfortably. Another first of a different kind was recorded when Woo Pak On got himself out of bed at 3.00 one Sunday morning and got down to Dai Mong Tsai to start the 42.195 Km Coast of China Marathon at 6.30. Four and a half hours later he crossed the finishing line in position 196. Quite a good result considering it was an open event with almost 400 starters including the famous International Marathon Runner, Ron Hill,

who personally autographed the special Coast of China Marathon Finishers Shirt awarded to all those who finished. As far as is known Woo Pak On is the first CSK boy ever to enter and finish a full Marathon.

Full results of all sports can be found at the end of the report, here is a brief summary of each sport starting with Athletics. At the Tercentenary Year meet held at the Wanchai Stadium we retained the SJCOBA A Grade trophy for the third time in a row. Unfortunately we had to surrender the B Grade to La Salle who also won the C while we were runners-up. Luck let us down badly at the Inter School Meet when our 4 x 400m relay team had the baton knocked from our hand in the second leg. The last two runners made up some ground to finish sixth but the eight points that we lost dropped us from second to fourth in the A Grade placings. It was very disappointing for our team as they had gone all out to try and be the first team to bring home a Division One banner. Despite Sung Ka Chun's double gold our B team finished eighth and C Grade were one behind in ninth place. Lady Luck was kinder to us in Badminton as we won the B Grade league and we were runners-up in both C Grade competitions league and knockout. A Grade finished fifth in the league and the results were good enough for us to declared the overall Champions.

This season our Basketball also showed improvement. B and C grades finished third in the leagues while the A position was not decided until June when we beat La Salle after six postponements. This win gave us third place also for A and enough points to lead the table as Basketball Overall Champions.

There was a large increase in entries for Cross Country this year with eighteen schools reporting for the start of the Kowloon races. The results were quite pleasing as we finished runners-up, fourth, and fifth in A, B and C Grades respectively. The worst results of the season were recorded by the football teams, they were probably the worst we have ever had! Nothing went right for us and

at the end of the league programme we were in second last place and relegated to Division Two. If our football was down then our Life Saving was certainly the opposite as we took the C Grade title, runners-up in A Grade and fourth in B, results which also earned us the Overall Trophy and promotion to Division One.

That brings us on to a sport which is not organised by the HKSSA but one at which we have been making steady progress over the past few seasons — Softball. With one more game to go we are top of the Third Division in the open league having won nine out of ten games so far. It now looks as if we will certainly be promoted to the Second division next season. Thanks to the availability of La Salle's new pool our swimming is beginning to improve. In the Inter School competition our C Graders were very good coming runners-up but we didn't have very much success in A and B. Our table tennis teams were competing in Division One for the first time this year and while we didn't win any grades we are now

established there having finished overall sixth. In fact our B and C teams were unlucky in that both beat teams who qualified for the Finals but then dropped games to weaker teams and missed the finals on games counts. Last of our list of sports is our youngest — Volleyball. Again success didn't come our way and both teams failed to get past the first round.

Finally to close this report we offer congratulations and thanks to all the boys who helped to win honour for the school and also to the teachers who gave up much of their free time to help coach and encourage the teams. However, it must be pointed out that without the support of the student body in general our teams would not be as good as they are, and there were occasions this season when the expected support failed to appear. This is not a good sign. Let us hope that in the future we will get the support that we used to get in the past and it will help us on the way to putting CSK on the Omega rosebowl for the best school in sport.

The four aims of the Board are:

- To promote the general welfare of the student body. 1.
- To bridge the gap between the school authority and the student body. 2. 3.
- To help to maintain discipline inside and outside the school premises.
- To maintain the working spirit among the student body.

With the co-operation of all the prefects and the support of the students, many activities including some new one, have been held successfully in this academic year. These activities include:-

#### 1. Maintaining Discipline in School.

Soon after the new school year began, we (the executive members of the Prefectorial Board) decided

to use every possible means to improve the discipline in the Canteen. After careful consideration, we put into practice some new regulations which soon proved effective. The regulations are:—

- a) Students who want to buy anything from the Canteen must queue up at the designated place and wait for their turn.
- b) Bottles and dishes should be returned to the Canteen at the places indicated by posters.
- c) Each student should not buy more than two tickets of the same kind.
- d) From 12:00 noon to 12:30 p.m., table-tennis is not allowed.

With the co-operation of all the students, the discipline in the Canteen has improved a lot.

Moreover, during the Annual Swimming Gala and Sports Day, we have used rather strict methods to maintain order and discipline both in the sports-field and on the spectator stand. Therefore, we succeeded in avoiding confusion and disorder on these two occasions.

Meanwhile, we have seen a much inspiring improvement in that all the students put on proper uniform when they come to school every day. However, the discipline in the library and in the playground whenever there are matches taking place still needs to be improved.

#### 2. Setting up the Suggestion Box Committee.

The more suggestions we get, the more we can improve. The more improvement we have, the better school welfare students can get. This is why the Suggestion Box Committee was established in October, 1980. The Committee is under the Executive Committee of the Prefectorial Board. Since the setting up of the Committee, many students have sent us their opinions. We find that many of them are useful. The Suggestion Box is indeed a strong and an effective bridge between the students and the School.

#### 3. Designing, Purchasing and Selling School Cardigans.

To change the style of our sweater is a great challenge to us. At first, we are afraid that it is not easy for the students to accept our new style sweater, but facts have shown us that the students like our new one. They enjoy what we have done for them. 'It fits my mind. It fits my soul. It fits my generation.' I think this statement describes well and exactly what students want to say about our new sweater.

#### 4. Holding the 'Make C.S.K. Tidy' Campaign.

With the success we have in last year's 'Clean Our School' Campaign, we have another campaign named 'Make C.S.K. Tidy' this year. At the beginning of October, 1980, the organizing committee was formed by one F. 6 prefect and 5 other F. 4 prefects. The names of the students caught for being Lap Sap Chung were put on the notice board. We hope that through this campaign students can understand the importance of keeping our school tidy.

#### 5. Running Two Stalls in the Caritas Bazaar.

The annual Caritas Bazaar was held on 2nd November, 1980. As in the previous years, it took place in Kowloon Wah Yan College. This year our school had run two stalls providing several interesting games to entertain the visitors. The stalls were well received by the visitors.

#### 6. Participating in the Secondary School Invitation Concert.

As in the previous years, our school joined the Secondary School Invitation Concert organized by the Hong Kong University Students' Union. On 21st February, 1981, two programmes from our school, a song and a play, were performed at Loke Yew Hall, H.K.U. Our students did very well indeed!

The above list of activities is by no means complete. There were many other activities held during this academic year. We helped in the Arts Exhibition Day, the New Year Concert, the Parents-Teachers Day and the Orientation Day. The most important of all is that we have participated in the C.S.K. 


In this academic year, about thirty students joined us and shared our club activities.



# The Young Christian Student Movement







## The Scheme

The Duke of Edinburgh introduced this Award Scheme in order to present a challenging programme of activities to all young people between the ages of 14 and 25. The Scheme has three separate Awards — bronze, silver and gold. For each award, the participant has to fulfil the requirements of each of the four sections — service, expeditions, skills and physical recreation. Each participant also has a record book for recording his progress through the scheme.

## CSKDEA

The CSKDEA has been functioning ever since 1973. At present it has 70 members. With the assistance of two voluntary school advisors and nine executive committee members, the CSKDEA has provided our students with a series of challenging activities through this year.

- To broaden interest and to deepen experience.
- To provide a very wide range of adventurous, cultural and practical activities.
- To erode barriers between the young and the not-so-young.



This year the Photographic Club has recruited over 40 darkroom members. The number is increased by about 50% when compared with last year's figure. We can see that more and more students are interested in photography. Our club welcomes enthusiasts.

To achieve the aim of arousing our fellow schoolmates' interest in photography, we have organized a series of activities.

- Bi-weekly meetings were held after school. Different topics on photography were introduced to our members, for example, techniques in taking sports' photographs, scenery pictures, film developing and photo printings. Theories and demonstrations were given by our advisors. There was always a large attendance in these meetings.
- We have the chance to practise what we have learned on the Sports' Day and the Swimming Gala. Our members displayed their efficiency at their best.
- An outing was held in November. Our destination was Yuen Yuen Institute. This was a chance for us to take different kinds of photographs.
- 4) In February, a joint club function was held. D.E.A., Astronomy Club and our club organized a camp. Our destination was Nam Se Shim. This camp was
  - a) to promote friendship between the clubs and their members, and
  - b) to take astronomical photographs.

In the camp, members of our club showed the other participants how to take astronomical photographs.

In the near future, the following activities will be held:

- 1) a colour photo printing course.
- 2) a photo contest which is open to all C.S.K. students.
- 3) another outing for photo-taking practice.

Besides holding these activities, the club also supplied the members with high quality film (Kodakplus X) at extremely low price. Members can also borrow photographic books and magazines from the club's library.

This year, in order to enable our members to produce photographs of higher quality, a new electric heater, a new film developing tank, tongs and a light box have been added to our darkroom equipment. We also plan to buy a new colour head enlarger in the near future. These new equipment will save our members a lot of time in making colour prints.

The photographs of various clubs, societies and classes were taken in October by our committee members. Unfortunately, the weather was quite bad during this period, so the taking of photographs had to be postponed many times. However, all the difficulties in photo-taking and printing were overcome by our committee members. All photographs were completed during the X'mas holidays.

We have the honour to supply photographs of various school functions and activities to the School Magazine and the Press Club.

Finally, all the exco-members must be thanked for their help which really brought life to the club. We are greatly indebted to the teacher advisors for their invaluable advice and help throughout the year.



## Interview with Our School Librarian

Besides the classrooms, the canteen and the playground, our school library is perhaps the place we always visit. As a matter of fact, many students are anxious to have a clear picture of the library. Moreover, they also currently give a lot of comments and look for amendments. To meet these demands, we are very glad to have Mr. T. Ng, our teacher-librarian, to tell us things concerning the library, to answer common questions posed by students and to reveal his personal opinions.

(R and L stand for 'Reporter' and 'Librarian' respectively)

- R: Where did you work before coming here?
- L: I've been teaching for over ten years in secondary schools.
- R: Why did you apply for this job?
- L: This is the first time I apply for this post as a librarian. I think it is new and challenging. Therefore I take it.
- R: What is meant by the term 'teacher-librarian'?
- L: In 1979, the government started the library scheme and stressed that the school library should be a place for the extension of classroom study. The teacher-librarian who is in charge of the library should have had at least 2 years of teaching experience. Besides, 2-year course on library management has been arranged. Funds have been given to schools to buy new books. I am now still attending the course on every Monday.
- R: What do you think of the conduct of our schoolmates in the library?
- L: Most of them obey the library regulations.

- However, some students sometimes make noise which disturbs others.
- R: We have received complaints about students making noise in the library. Do you think it is necessary to introduce strict rules?
- L: When some students disturb others, or I should say when they are talking loudly, I will warn them first. And if they don't improve their behaviour, they may have to be prohibited to use the library again.
- R: Can you tell us about the stock of books in our library? Do you think it is enough?
- L: We have a collection of over 4000 English books and 2000 Chinese books. Some of them are out of date. Most of them have turned yellow because they cannot be shielded from the sunlight. There is a lack of books on the subject of art, but the number of science books is satisfactory.
- R: Many students say that there are still not enough reference books? What do you think

of this?

- L: As I've mentioned previously, the government gives money to school to buy books, so I think this problem will be solved very soon.
- R: There are comments about the lack of seats in the library. In the present situation, what opinion do you have?
- L: Well, there are at present more than 150 seats in the library. I think this number, compared with most other schools, should be adequate, provided that students do not regard the library as a place for them to do their homework assignments.
- R: Students criticize that there is not enough time for borrowing books. What do you feel about this?
- L: Since the library is now open to students who can bring in their school-bags and textbooks for doing homework assignments, it is difficult to open all the cupboards at the same time. I would like to have another room open for doing homework assignments so that students do not rush into the library for this purpose.
- R: What amendments would you like to make on our library?
- L: First of all, I would like to say we need to divide the library into two parts, one as a study room and the other as a stock room. The school library should be used only for pleasure reading and borrowing reference books. Secondly, I hope to have open shelves, just like that in the Urban Council Libraries. A comfortable condition for reading should be provided. I am now classifying and cataloguing books in Dewey Decimal Classification method. Thirdly, stools should be provided to help those short readers to get books placed on the shelves. Fourthly, as I've said before, shelters are necessary in order to protect books from the sunshine.
  - R: As you know, senior students want a lot of books. Then, is it right for them to borrow more than one book at the same time?
  - L: I find out that most students want to get those textbooks on the same topic at the same



time. They are not fully aware of the correct use of the library — we should get information from reference books. In a nutshell, higher form students indeed need more books. However, as they want to get the same books, this suggestion can work if there is a sufficient supply of such books.

- R: Do you think it is good to have student assistants in the library?
- L: I think it is good to have several Form 4 students as assistants. They are better than those higher formers because they have less examination pressure. With their help, I think it will be more efficient to make the library function better.
- R: What is your impression of our school, both in academic field and extra-curricular activities?
- L: In my opinion, our school has got adequate extra-curricular activities. By holding more quizes, topic displays and project competitions, we can advance further in the academic field.

## PARENTS-TEACHERS MEETINGS

The main purpose of the Parents-Teachers Meetings is to provide opportunities for parents and teachers to know one another so as to discuss freely about the studies, general behaviour and activities of their wards or students and to encourage close co-operation of parents and teachers in future.

This year we had two Parents-Teachers Meetings. The first meeting was held in October for forms one and two. Most parents showed great concern about the studies of their wards who have just begun their secondary schooling. They asked a lot of questions about the school, curriculum, homework and examinations. Both parents and teachers felt happy in meeting one another and in their discussions.

The second meeting was held in January for all forms after the Mid-year Examination. A very big number of parents attended. Parents and teachers were enthusiastic to talk about the examination results of their wards or students and their behaviour in school and at home. They exchanged ideas to help their wards or students improve their weaknesses and develop their potentials in their studies and activities. Parents of lower forms were often interested in the methods of teaching, assignments, tests and the Junior Secondary Education Assessment while those of upper forms wished to know about the streaming of the Arts and Science classes, choice of careers and further studies of their wards in

the future.



自一九七五年七月本校跆拳道學會成立 以來,今年已是第六年了。在過往的五年中 ,本校的跆拳道學會亦曾發生過些微變動: 除了更換過由館方派來的本校道場教練外; 我們的師範亦於數年前由現時的黑帶四段譚 僑光先生代替了前往挪威開設分館的麥健偉 先生;而本校的跆拳道學會原本是香港跆拳 道武道館屬下的一個道場,但後來在譚僑光 先生接任師範後不久,我們就在師範的帶領 下,轉加入了香港跆拳道青濤館(世界跆拳 道聯盟的會員單位),而這個轉變亦使到本 會的會員,在升獲黑帶或以上的資格時,能 得到世界各地跆拳道協會的承認。

回顧去年,發生了一件使到我們感到遺憾的事,就是曾在本校擔任過兩年道場教練的陳光耀先生,因今年要應付大學畢業試而不能繼續任教,故只有暫時由師兄們瓜代;不過,雖然如此,今年我們亦有一件令人興奮的事:在悠悠的五年中,本校的第一批黑帶學員(三位就讀中四班連續學習了跆拳道三年多的學員)將於今年內誕生。他們已於今年初接到師範的通知,準備參加黑帶考試,如果他們能在考試中得到合格而升獲黑帶資格,對於本會來說,就好像在成長的旅程上,又向前邁進了一步。

今年本會的註册學員人數爲三十八人, 分別爲白帶二十二人、黃帶四人、綠帶四人 、藍帶五人和棕帶三人。本會今年除了維持 每週兩次的常規練習外,還間有安排學員到 其他我們師範轄下的道場(例如伍華書院) 和其他的學員一同練習,藉以進行武術上的 交流,而在道館方面,他們今年亦爲我們安 排了一次各道場一同的大旅行,和分別前去 參觀數場跆拳道的比賽和表演。在本學期初 ,本會更曾舉辦過一次招收會員的電影欣賞

, 成績亦頗令人滿意。

跆拳道是集韓國多種古代武術於一身而 演變而成的一種技擊法,它是於一九六六年 才首次介紹來香港的,而於七十年代才開始 發揚開來。學習跆拳道是最著重學習者的個 人品格修煉的,而本會亦很希望做到這點, 所以本會十分著重紀律、武德和修養,嚴禁 學員私關或恃强凌弱。

在每週兩次兩個多小時的練習時間內, 有不少會員,不論是新加入的或舊的,都可 能發現在鍛煉過程上有障礙,或因在技術上 停滯不前而感到灰心、氣餒,繼而產生了放 棄繼續學習的念頭,不過,本會仍很希望各 學員能拿出毅力、恆心和百折不屈、克己忍 耐的精神,繼續練習下去;本會謹此對於那 些仍能堅持着原則,邁向自己的理想和目標 的學員,表示一點鼓勵和敬意。最後我們很 感謝本會的顧問老師在這一年來的幫助,並 歡迎各級同學隨時報名加入和我們一起練習


## 我校的 —— \* 壘 \* 球 \*

當你在看壁報板上的運動項目成績時, 可曾留意到一張有關壘球隊的比賽時間和成 績的告示?我相信不少同學看到後也不會注 意的,因爲對它有興趣的同學實在很少。而 且,它在大部份同學眼中就像傳說的龍一般 見首不見尾。

看到那告示,引起了我的好奇心——爲什麼這支隊伍不像其他校隊一樣定時在校操練呢?爲什麼校方不舉辦一些足球、籃球一類活動以增加同學對它的興趣呢?爲什麼這麼少人關心它?畢竟,這支陌生的隊伍是我校校隊的一份子,故此我特别和壘球隊的領隊崔致榮老師作了一次訪問,探討一下這些問題。

從崔老師口中,我得到很多的資料,包括壘球隊的簡史,它在我校鮮為人知的道理 和它的簡介:

我校的壘球隊是在七三—七四年度由一 羣有興趣的同學所創立的。當時一切用具和 費用都是自資的。同年,本校加入了校際比 賽的行列,成績也頗不錯。在翌年的校際比





賽中,更得到了亞軍!可惜自那年起,由於 參加的學校太少,所以校際賽便停頓下來。 然而,那批同學的熱情卻毫不消退。壘球隊 的訓練依然繼續,間中並和别校作友誼賽, 結果多獲勝利之神眷戀。

到了本學年,同學們的努力終於沒有白費,因為校長答應了贊助一部份經費,於是同學們決定加入公開賽。雖然入會費和比賽費用相當高昂,但隊員都願意自費參加。

由於入了壘球總會的關係,隊員可在天 光道的正式場地練習,不用像以往的情況一 樣,要在不合規格的校園內練習。成績方面 ,由於隊員的努力,至三月初止,我校在丙 組公開賽事中的七隊裏排名第二。

根據崔老師的分析,壘球隊在我校鮮為 人知的原因可能是校際賽停辦使同學們失去 了爭勝的機會,不能像其他校隊般有榮譽感 。而且用具的價錢太貴,使很多同學對這項 運動都裹足不前。練習的場地不在本校,也 使同學們沒有機會對它有所認識。另一方面 ,同學也欠缺了正式的教練,而且大家對球 例又不大熟悉,自然提不起興趣。 現在輪到介紹一下壘球的賽例和玩法了 。首先我們要解釋一下壘球場上的一些術語:

好球 當投球手擲出的球在擊球手的肩膊與膝蓋之間或本壘板之上經過,便稱之為好球。還有另一個解釋,就是當球並不在上述區域經過,而擊球手卻揮動球棒又擊之不中時,這也算是一個好球。


壞球 就是上述所說,不在本壘板之上,擊球手的肩膊與膝蓋之間經過的球。相對於好球一詞。

一場壘球比賽共有七局,由雙方輪流攻守。當攻方的擊球手無法擊中投球手的三個「好球」,擊球手便被「震」出局(strike out)。三個擊球手被「震」出局後,就算完了一局。相反,如投球手擲出四個「壞球」,攻方的擊球手便可自行走上一壘。

取分方面,只要擊球手把球打出去後, 在一局內跑回本壘,便可取得一分。倘若守 方球員把擊出的球接着,先行傳到擊球手要 到的壘上,擊球手也是被「震」出局。如果 擊球手安全抵達一、二或三壘時,便稱為「 走壘者」(runner),他可停在該壘上,等 待隊友進攻時才設法跑回本壘取分。

看完這篇文章後,希望大家能對這項運 動有較深的認識,減少對本校壘球隊的陌生 感。



所謂「世事如棋」,時間過得飛快。想 起我們一班執委初進入陳瑞祺就讀時,還未 有棋藝會。但到現在,棋會已經成立了五年 。

今年初我們又招收了很多新會員,為這 成長中的棋會增添新力。十一月初,我們推 出了棋會每年的盛事——第五屆中國象棋個 人錦標大賽。反應異常熱烈,經過一個多月 難解難分的緊張賽事後,梁偉文、陳學林(中五甲)、呂榮輝(中一戊)及陸金文(中一丙)分別脫穎而出,奪得錦標。在十二月中,我們又派隊參加聯校棋藝協會舉辦,在拔萃書院舉行的聯校中國象棋隊際賽,雖然成績不如往年,但總算令人安慰。在八一年三月尾,我們舉辦了國際象棋錦標賽,反應亦很熱烈。

## ─陳德昭老師──

#### 前言

在本校芸芸衆老師之中,陳德昭老師對「創校元老」這個雅號是當之無愧的,他在本校成立前已在喇沙書院任教,其間作育出很多英才。這樣優秀的老師是很值得我們表揚的。為此我們便安排了這個專訪使各同學對他的歷史有更深入的認識。

問:可否告訴大家你在教學上的心得及從事 教育的歷史呢?

答:當初,我對自己能否成爲一個好教師感到懷疑,曾經看過一本叫 How To Teach的小册子,册子裏的這一個問題是「你能否控制一班學生」,而答案則說:「若是不能便應另找一份工作」。因爲我在中學時曾當過學長,覺得控制一班學生沒多大問題,於是答應了當時的喇沙書院的校長 Bro. Cassian ,在一九四七年到喇沙書院任教。我亦曾教過喇沙夜校,即陳瑞祺書院的前身。

問:在本校任教以來,有甚麼感受?例如學 生的學業、品德等,和從前有甚麼不同 ?

答:基本上,學生沒有甚麼不同。學業方面 ,由於中六的程度日益提高,要學的東 西多了,加上功課相當繁密,因此現在 讀書是相當辛苦的。我讀中學時,課程 不算深,那時讀書就悠閒得多。至於品 德方面,祇要學生上課時不搗蛋,我便 很少理會。因為我認為對付那些搗蛋的 學生,感化可能比刑罰收效更大。

問:身為一個英文教師,你認為香港學生學 英文的最大缺點在那裏?

答:學生最大的缺點是不能準確發音,對於 英文的成語、俚語之類懂得不多。我曾 經看見過一位學生這樣寫:「Men look upwards, water flows downwards」( 人望高處,水望低流)。這是一句由中 譯英的句子,文法完全無誤,但外國人 看了往往會覺得莫名其妙,無法瞭解句 子的含意。再者,學生發音時缺乏尾音 和咬音不清楚,往往令意思不能準確地 表達出來。

問:對社會人仕提倡「母語教學」,對英文 科來說,是否有矛盾的地方存在?

答:我不這麼想,我認為「母語教學」在英

文科亦用得着。例如英文的一句"It made my mouth water"(垂涎欲滴),加上中文註釋可能使學生更能準確掌握意思,更加明白。

問:很多人指責香港學生缺乏德育,你有甚 廢意見?

答:學生缺乏德育,責任不應全推在老師身上,家長亦應負部份的責任。學校教育和家庭教育是同樣重要的,若想培養學生有好的德育,家長應與老師們緊密合作,多些來參加學校舉辦的「家長教師聯會」,互相瞭解學生的問題,兼加以適當的指導。但最遺憾的是高年級的學生的家長很少來參加。

間:中學畢業後,對於繼續升學或找尋工作 應要有什麼準備?

答:由於大學學位缺乏,加上升讀預科相當 困難,因此家庭經濟許可的話,最好準 備到外國讀書。找工作方面,一定要自 己去找,即使那份工作與你所讀的無關 ,亦應去嘗試。記得有一位學生,在外 國讀完書,考取了理科學士的銜頭後, 只找到一份地產經紀的工作。雖然這份 工作與他的所學全無關係,結果他仍做 得很好,成爲一個出色的地產經紀。一 個人工作只爲求生存,工作的性質不太 重要。若想找一份適合自己的工作,可 以到夜校攻讀某些課程來充實自己,然 後再慢慢尋找。

問:你對於陳瑞祺書院有什麼展望?

答:在體育方面,我相當看好,因為我校有 很多好教練。但學業方面就不敢看好了 ,理由是現今的學生讀書不能專一,太 多的東西吸引他們,以致時間和精神不 能集中於讀書方面。不過只要在空閒時 間回想一下教過的東西自己懂不懂,若 是懂的,自然不需時常捧着課本。讀書 最重要是記得與否,記得了便不需時常 捧着書本。

問:在任教的歲月中,甚麼事令你最難忘?

答:在喇沙書院任教兩年後,校舍被政府徵用為陸軍醫院。政府於是在巴富街起了一列列的木屋作為臨時校舍,那些木屋非常悶熱,很難抵受。此後十年(約四九至五九年)都在那裏渡過,其間認識了Bro. Eugene。後來遷回原址,我就一直教到喇沙夜校成為陳瑞祺書院。我在本校任教亦超過了十年,校長認為只要我每年得到醫生証明身體健康,我還可以多教五年。我現年六十歲,因為覺得退休之後沒有什麼事可做,於是決定教下去。與你們在一起,我覺得年輕得多。

## 與劉志堅老師談訓導

相信沒有同學不知道新訓導主任是誰,但 為了使大家更了解本校的訓導情况,我們特地 訪問了劉志堅老師。

答:陳瑞祺仍算是一所很新的學校,還有很 多事須要改善。例如:學業成績、運 動及紀律方面等,尤其在文藝活動方面 一直都是比較不足。

問:當了訓導主任,有什麼感想?精神負担 重不重?

答:當初有些緊張,但很興奮,因為有機會 去嘗試一些以前未曾做過的事。對於新 鮮的事物,我時常都有莫大的興趣。至 於精神負担方面,如果我不做一些自己 能力範圍以外的事,壓力不會很重。

問:今年訓導處的組織如何?它設立的目的 和責任又如何?

答:今年的訓導處是重新改組的。我是主席 ,其他的成員計有:梁華昌副校長、康 寶泉、劉聲、陳耀仁、李炳强、黎偉文 和林沾裘各老師。以上成員除梁副校長 外,其餘均由全體老師選出。訓導處設 立的主要目的當然是辦好學校的紀律, 而其成員的責任是提出意見,商討對策 和執行訓導工作。而訓導的範圍很廣, 但主要是指校內秩序和學生品格。

問:你認為現有的校規是否執行得太嚴格? 答:其實嚴格與否是沒有絕對標準,和以前 的打手板,大界尺敲頭、跪聖人等體罰根本沒法相比。就算和現有部份學校相比,有些夠鐘就鎖校門,遲到便要回家,不准上課,或當衆自我批判等,本校已經算是罰得很輕了。基本上我們是不想罰人,而罰本身是一種無可避免的罪惡(necessary evil),通常我們只是指出學生的錯處,大家商討一下補救的辦法。而懲罰只是希望給予犯錯誤的同學一個反省機會,加深記憶以及收殺雞警猴之效。如果犯了刑事案或對學校及學生的安全構成威脅,校方會採取較嚴重的懲罰,包括停學及勸喩離校。

問:在執行校規方面今年有何不同呢?

答:今年是比較徹實一些,例如有系統地處 理遲到問題,清楚地劃定校服的款色, 對一些問題學生有更詳盡的檔案資料。

問:除了嚴厲執行校規外,還有什麼方法可 以培養學生的德育和良好品格?

答:嚴厲執行校規只是其中一種方面,但不 是最好的,我主張提供多一些活動給學 生。以往我多偏重體育方面,很高興今 年有一個學藝節這樣的活動,使學生有 機會參與健康而有趣的團體的活動,發 展自己興趣和性格。這對同學的品德培 養有很大的幫助。

問:學藝節能否達到這個目的?

答:這次學藝節是一個好的開始,從很多方面來看,它都是新的嘗試。而達到目的 與否,便要視乎個別學生參與的程度而 定。

問:對於今次學藝節有什麼看法?

答:對於學藝節這類活動我是絕對讚成的, 並且非常欣賞辦事和參與的人,而該節 的其中一個目的是通過比賽來培養師生 之間的感情和增加互相的了解,這是很 好的。如果明年繼續舉辦的話,我希望 能夠加多一些節目。例如:奕棋、橋牌 、朗誦、廢物利用設計比賽,集體遊戲 和競技比賽等,使內容更多姿多采。對 於展覽性質的項目,可持續二星期,但 比賽性質的項目可用二至三天的時間, 停止上課,全日進行,總比延至二星期 而令部份學生上課心不在焉好得多。

問:家長應如何和老師合作來改善學生的品 格?

答:最佳辦法就是多些和學校方面聯絡,如 學生家長會,就是使家長和學校兩方面 盡量溝通。至於家庭方面,我們能做到 的就是鼓勵家長多和學生談話藉以加深 了解,從而改善老師、家長和學生三方 面的關係。

問:本校學生上課時學習情緒怎樣?

答:我覺得班與班的差異很大,但大致都算 很好,可能是各班同學良莠不齊所致。 很多時部份學生把責任歸咎於教師講書 不大動聽;或不大注意堂上紀律。可是 每個老師都想把書教好,然而最重要的 還是在於學生留心聽講與否。



問:在執行校規上有甚麼困難和趣事呢?

答:最困難的方面,不是在於學生頑皮與否,而是他所採取什麼的態度,如果他漠不關心的話,無論怎樣勸他罰他也是徒然的,『哀莫大於心死』。趣事方面, 記得的就不多了。例如有一個經常遲到的學生,他有一次在返校途中肚痛,需要回家吃藥,於是我便叫他寫封信解釋和想想補救方法。誰知在信中他寫道『以後每天早餐吃了藥才乘車上學』。我不知道他寫這封信時有沒有用腦或是故作幽默。

問:學生除了讀書外,還有什麼責任和義務 呢?

答:首先他當然要遵守校規。除非他們不是 組織裏的成員,否則便要遵守組織裏的 規條。但我不是要每個學生都變成校規 的盲從擁護者,我希笔他們能有獨立思 想和自我反省能力,對於不合理和不滿 意的事,不要採取敵對的態度而應提出 有建設性的意見,這才是教育的目的。

問:爲什麼會有代溝的存在?它對於家長和 學生的溝通有什麼阻礙?

答:六十年代之後,社會變化得很快,很多 年紀大的人對於新事物的接受能力比較 慢了一點 而年青的一輩卻剛剛相反, 喜歡嘗試一些比較新的事物,因此大家 的價值觀念便有所不同,此乃形成代講 的一個主因。而代講的存在,阻礙到家 長與學生的了解,例如老一輩的認為類 矩是應該遵守的,如果要改的話,亦 矩是應該遵守的,如果要改的話,亦 相比較溫和的手法。但年青人則比較激 進一點,他們認為現存的制度可以一筆 勾消,用一些比較激烈和革命性的手法 來改變。有些根本對整個社會制度失望 ,採取一種不合作的態度,我行我素。

問:家庭方面對學生有何影響?

答:通常家庭背景,對於學生是有很大影响 的。我認為多數問題學生通常都是在家 庭方面得不到適當的照顧,或是得不到 正確的指導。 問:任教期內,體察到一般學生在校內、校 外的品行怎樣?

答:通常來說『大壞的』是屬於很少數的害 羣之馬,但『小壞的』卻隨處皆是。例 如沒有禮貌、不排隊、不讓坐、粗言穢 語、賭馬、買六合彩、塗汚牆壁等,而 他們做這些事情大多是由於好奇或想表 現一下自己成熟。雖然這不是太壞的事 ,但是在他們這個年紀這都是不應該做 的。

問:到目前為止你對自己所做的事是否感到 滿意?

答:不太滿意,因為我們正在打一場永無止境又沒有可能全勝的戰爭。只要情況逐漸改善,我們都會稍覺安慰。例如遲到 方面就有顯著的減少;而不穿校服的人也愈來愈少。

問:對於陳瑞祺學生在德育表現方面有何期 望?

答:我希望他們能做一個守紀律但不是盲從 的學生,但最重要的是日後做一個守法 的好市民,並且也是一個積極的社會改 革者。

阿宋反對那些整日埋首課本中的書獃子 ,同樣地他也不喜歡那些整日吃喝玩樂、不 理學業的「玩精」、「波牛」。他認為在學 業上應保持一定的水準,然後在課餘找些有 益身心的活動,這樣才不會浪費大好青春。

他用堅定的口吻告訴我,即使離開了學 校,他亦決計不會放棄運動的。 

## 中三結業生-

## 就業前途

驟然聽來,中三甄别試似乎是剝奪了部份攻讀該級同學升學的權利。其實這種看法並不是完全對的,因為就算考不上,只不過是政府再不耗用納稅人的金錢給予中三同學大量升讀中四中五的補助,畀能逗留在官校或津貼學校繼續攻讀罷了。在競爭的社會裏,一切事情和機會都是競爭劇烈的,要競爭才能獲得較優先的權利。我們應明白了這一觀念;假如自己條件不足而被淘汰,自己是應該負上責任的。

一個學生在思想上尚未臻成熟,對自己本身前途尚未認識清楚,若再加上成年人錯誤的評論,他們的心理自然會產生多種不正常的現象,尤其是因缺乏安全感而產生自卑感,進而使中三同學認爲過不了這個甄別試的一關,升不上中四,就是窮途末路,就是羞恥、無用,喪失了年青人應有的向上心和鬥志。長此下去,便產生內心的衝突,由自卑而對抗,由對抗而反叛,構成各種不正常的心理狀態。身爲老師的就該在這方面先給予他們各種輔導和幫助,使他們能夠擺脫因學業而產生的困擾。

在輔導工作方面,除在校老師負擔部份

責任之外,本年度最主要由社會福利署及教育司署派駐本校的楊先生來肩負絕大部份的職務。由於楊先生並非隸屬學校的教職員,而且每周只在星期二那天蒞臨本校二樓護理室辦公,所以他的工作未盡爲同學所認識,故順帶在這裏一提。倘若同學發現自己在情緒上有問題,或內心有鬱結的難題未能解決的,不妨抽空向楊先生請教請教,他必然盡力爲大家服務的。

至於升學及職業輔導方面,這項繁重的 工作是由本校林沾裘老師負責的。以往林老師每年都為中五及中七的同學提供不少參考 資料,但今年既然增加了中三甄别試,所以 他的工作更相應增加了。有關中三同學未來 的升學就業問題,林老師介紹了下面一系列 的資料,相信對中三同學而言甚有裨益的。

根據一九七八年底發表的高中及專上教育發展白皮書指出,在一九八六年間,會有百分之九十七的中三結業生,可續修中四,或在工業學院修讀全日或部份時間課程,或進修部份時間中四程度的普通教育課程。

工業學院所提供中三結業生修讀的課程範圍,有營造工程、電機工程、輪機工程、

機械工程、製衣、紡織、印務、酒店經營及 旅遊業、航空工程、設計、鐘錶製造及光學 等等課程。

在工業學院內,有以下各種的學制: (甲)全日制 學生每星期須上課約三十小時。 (乙)廠校交替制 學生須在學校修讀一段時期 ,再在工廠實習,然後又回學校修讀。

- (两整段時間給假制 僱員修讀學院內「整段時間」的全日制課程;整段時間的持續期不等,短者爲期約六星期,長者可達十八星期左右。學員每年得修讀多個的整段時間制課程。
- (T)日間部份時間給假制 僱員通常每星期前 往學院修讀一整日課程,僱主須要付予全 薪;亦有每星期修讀兩晚者,則屬於僱員 本身的時間。

多年以來,摩利臣山工業學院一直有開辦補修課程,使中學時期已經輟學的學生有機會補修學業。例如按照「工學預科」一年級課程,學生可修讀英文、數學及工藝繪圖,每星期上課四晚,內容略爲偏重於工業方面,程度相當於中四。「工學預科」二年後則按科計算,每科的程度相等於中五同一科的程度。通過這項課程,中三結業生可以單憑夜間補修有限數量的科目,即能追上中五程度。然後可再進入各種工業學院攻讀技術員課程。

政府在一九七六年頒佈的學徒條例規定

任何廠商所僱用的學徒,凡屬指定行業內而 年齡在十九歲以下者,廠商必須保送該學徒 進入一間學院,修讀「日間部份時間給假制 」課程。多數的技工學徒訓練,爲期四年。 但學生倘若已經在職業先修學校內修讀某一 科工藝課程至相當程度,則通常可以即時攻 讀日間部份時間給假制的第二年課程,並即 接受第二年學徒訓練。

歸根結底,究竟目前有什麼機會可供中 三結業生選擇呢?中三結業生可以:

(甲)接受操作員(半熟練工人)或非熟練工人的職位。這個職位可能配合夜間課程。例如,該生可以進修:

(一)工業學院的工藝課程;

二工業學院的工學預科課程;

闫教育司署成人教育中心的中學課程;

四外界團體開辦的工業或普通教育課程。

(Z)成為技工學徒,兼修讀工業學院的日間部 份時間制課程。

**俩進修工業學院的全日制課程。** 

(T)進入一間工業訓練中心(例如建造或製衣業)接受全日制訓練。

似考入另一間中學繼續全日攻讀中四課程。

由此可見,中三結業生的出路並非是一 般人所想的那麼狹隘。同時,路是人行出來 的,但切勿忘記在開步之前,自己要有正確 的選擇,才能避免走枉路或悞入歧途啊!

#### 從今天起




無論這次的成績如何,我們也要向各顧問老師和支持我們的各位同學致以衷心的感謝。
