

Class structure:

Intake

Practically the total intake to Form 1 is allocated by the Education Department. The 10% discretionary places are nearly all filled by repeaters. There is therefore little scope for taking in Catholics. All except very few are band one students (for what that is worth).

Academic Education

This is a Grammer type school with the emphasis upon academic subjects: languages; Chinese, English; Maths., Science and Social subjects. The medium of instruction is officially supposed to be English but in practice is Cantonese neither teachers nor students being sufficiently proficient in English, the exception being expatriot members of the staff who are not proficient in Cantonese.

There are four public examinations for which students prepare:

- 1. Junior Secondary Education Assessment (Form 3)
- 2. Certificate of Education (English) (Form 5)
- 3. The Higher Level Examination (Chinese University of Hong Kong)
- 4. The Advanced Level Examination (University of Hong Kong)

Education is free and compulsory up to Form 3 or 15 years of age. Those who wish to continue at vocational are filtered off and those considered fit for further academic education continue to the Certificate of Education when they are selected again for university oriented couses.

Aims:

The Christian Education of the children confided to our care. (Practically all students belonging to lower income group.)

The intellectual, moral, social and physical growth and development towards the truly human — the whole man made in the image and likeness of God.

to provide as thorough and useful an education as is possible within the curriculum and the facilities the school possesses and the Department decrees in order to fit them for the good life: moral, intellectual, material.

Means:

Instill a spirit of study: Disciplined entry to class having assembled in an orderly fashion. Calm prayer before class — the mind prepared for the task ahead. Regular check on class work and test to check improvement.

Remedial classes: English and Chinese: weak students streamed and taught by enthusiastic teachers in classes half the normal size with obvious beneficial effects.

Check upon Department Heads' report and each in turn upon tests and correction papers being returned to students by the teacher who corrected the work with suitable instruction on how answers ought to have been presented.

Religious

Aim:

To introduce students to the Entry of God into human history and provide the basis for moral living.

Means:

Programme: Forms 1 & 2 God enters human history: simplified version of the Old Testament. Ethics in Chinese portraying correct moral principles governing human behaviour based on the Ten Commandments with reference to the teachings of philosophy as taught by Eastern and Western scholars of renoun.

This leads to a study of the life and teaching of Christ in the Gospels and the Acts of the Apostles. Three periods of 40 min. each is given to this subject in Forms 1-5. One period of religious instruction is taught each week to each class in Forms 6 & 7 by the Principal.

The teaching of religious instruction throughout the school is in the hands of Brothers and Catholic lay teachers and as much as possible those who are seriously interested in living good Christian lives.

There is a Brother in charge of this Department in upper forms and a Catholic lay man in charge of lower classes where Chinese is used.

Apostolic Activities

Catechumen Class: Students interested in studying the Catholic religion are conducted once a week by Mr. P. Au. New recruits are instructed by Mr. Tam. These lessons are in the morning before class and during lunch time in the chapel.

The Art of Living: Talks are given twice a week by Miss Yung as a preparation aimed at stirring interest in Catholicity and recruiting catechumens while giving instruction in christian living. These talks are illustrated by slides and audio visual aids and are very practical in nature. There is a wide interest and good response from all ages.

Legion of Mary: Meetings are held once a week in the chapel after school. Mr. P. Au and Miss Yung are in charge and Fr. Arnoldi is spiritual director. Medium Chinese.

Young Christian Students: Mr. Tam is in charge and regular meetings are held. Students including non christians are encouraged to involve themselves in good works and study of the Gospels with a view to living by the word of Christ.

Rosary: The Rosary is said every morning throughout the months of October and May attended by Mr. Au, Mr. Tam, Miss Yung.

Mass: Mass is said every month in the chapel for Catholic students. Average about 20 attend. A homily is always given.

Protestants: Other Christians organise regular prayer meetings and these are usually held in the nearby church where they are guided by the local pastor. Inter group meetings are also held with groups from neighbouring schools.

Retreat: There is a retreat usually twice a year for Catholic boys. This is a whole day affair with meals, etc. together, the preacher included and very fervent in approach. This year it will be during Chinese New Year or Easter and the priest Fr. Henry Ng who is an old boy of this school and possibly also Fr. Sze S.J. A strong emhasis is placed upon vocations.

Vocations: Bro. Francis in charge of vocations. There is a definite interest among a small group of students in vocation to the Brothers life and to the priesthood.

Social

Social Studies are taught at an academic level from Form 1 to 5.

Students are taught to be community minded in their approach to each other and Society. A variety of associations and club activities are designed to brighten this awareness.

The Social Welfare Group engage in works to help the needy, the aged, the young in their studies, the community in social campaigns.

Volunteers to help the Blind Students. Boys from Forms 4 & 6 are requested personally each year to volunteer to help blind students in their studies, a service for which these blind boys and girls are very grateful and volunteers learn a lot making lasting friendships.

Community Youth Club members are active in anti-narcotics promotion, Clean Your City and a variety of community work.

The E.P.A. Society take part annually in presentation of exhibits in social contexts.

The Conservation Group present studies and take part in conservation projects designed by the Urban Council and the universities together with the Rural Services.

We are associated with a school in Tai-O, Lantau for helping remote areas.

Physical

Every student in the school, unless exempt for medical reasons, has two periods of 40 min. each physical exercise per cycle.

Organised Games & Sports

Competitions in all major games, athletics and swimming are organised on an inter class basis in three divisions according to age so as to include as many pupils as possible.

These include football, basketball, badminton, table-tennis, swimming, cross-country, athletics, life saving, sailing and canoeing are also catered for. The Long Distance Runners Club takes part in all public competitions in Hong Kong.


More intellectual games like Bridge and Chess are run on a club and inter-school basis.


Inter-school Sports Competitions






Mr. Chan, who is a successful businessman as well as an enthusiastic education supporter, had kindly denoted a large sum of money to our school for the establishment of our computer society.


Despite the difficulties, we can organise activities smoothly with the help of our teacher advisors. Finally, we want to show our gratitude to our teacher advisors.

In February and March, 30 schools from Kowloon and Hong Kong participated in the Joint School Mathematics Quiz. Our school was one of them.







My Best Friend — Computer

After I had become a major in Computer Science, I heard a lot of sayings about studying this subject. Some are perfectly true while others are only fallacies. I would like to give you a clear picture by telling you part of my experience.

Many people asked me why I chose this subject, including the doctors who interviewed me. My answer is simple — I like it. I choose it not because of money, social status, whatsoever. It's my interest that pushes me into this field.

I know some people taking this subject are not really interested in it. They are just looking for a better prospect. If you are one of them, I advise you to give it up at once. Studying Computer Science will cost you a lot. Programming, algorithm design, etc. will become your nightmare. Often I have to sit in front of the terminal, working all day without lunch, without rest and without saying a word to my neighbours. At night, I have to search for bugs in the programme so that I can continue my work on the next day. My life has become hard and dry.

If you want to study Computer Science, you must prepare to give up something. This year we have only 38 majors. Our department is the second smallest department in the Science Faculty. That means you have to work very hard and depend on luck if you want to enter our department. But when you are admitted, you have to work even harder. I am working in the Computer Laboratory while others go dating with their girl-friends. That feeling is unpleasant, really. So 'think before you leap' or you will fall into your own self-made ditch.

You might think that I am discouraging you. But if you are really interested in striking Computer Keyboards, then the Chinese University



Computer Department is a good place to go.

The Computing Laboratory is my favourite place in the Chinese University. We don't treat the computers as machines. Rather we treat them as our friends. We often hit the terminals, speak to them, urge them to work faster. We teach them to play mastermind. We give the codes and the computer guesses our codes. This idea seems to be quite new, isn't it?

When you have finished your Bachelor's Degree, you can either continue your studies in the Graduate School or start working as a programmer or as a systems analyst. One day you may become a Data Processing Manager whose salary will run as high as HK\$20,000.

To the students who are interested in this new technology, I hope you can find a sense of achievement in programming. You may open a new era in this field in the future. But remember one thing: "Don't ask what Computer can do for you. But ask what you, with the aid of Computer, can do for the betterment of mankind."

Advancement of society is accompanied by the development of computer. Everyone should thus know more about it in order to keep abreast of the time. We have the pleasure to attend an interview with Mr. C. Lam, one of the teacher advisors of our Computer Society.

(R and L stand for 'Reporter' and 'Mr. C. Lam' respectively)

- R: What is the purpose of setting up the Computer Society in our school?
- L: We want to introduce some computer knowledge to students through holding some activities about computer. For example, we want to introduce the value, limitations and the functions of the computer in society so as to promote knowledge about the computer. Therefore they can have some basic knowledge about computer when they continue their studies.
- R: As we all know the computers cost a large sum of money. Would you please tell me who paid for all these?
- L: It was Mr. Chan King Luen, the descendant of Mr. Chan Sui Ki, who voluntarily donated the computers to our school in order to develop our students' computer knowledge. The school has requested the Education Department for permission to cover the cost of maintenance from subscription fees.
- R: From the students' performances in the past few months, are they interested in computer studies.
- L: The Computer Society has only been set up for several months, but I notice that students are very interested in computers. They always ask me how to join the Society. In general, members of the Computer Society have no problem in operating the computers. Moreover, many students ask me to give advice about how to choose a suitable computer and what precautions they should take when buying a computer. From this we can know how interested they are.
- R: What is the effect of computer studies on students?
 L: With regard to the bad effect, students will indulge in it. Especially for some students, they think that computers only provide them with some interesting games. They will waste most of their time. Therefore they have no time to do their homework. In fact it has many good effects. Firstly, it can train you to think more logically. Secondly, it can improve your analysis ability. Thirdly, it can train you to the standard of the stand
 - in your patience because we always have some mistakes in writing a programme. Therefore we have to spend more time to correct the mistakes. Fourthly, it can make us know the importance of the computer.
- R: What is the standard of the students in operating computers?
 L: Our students are above standard in using computer. They use the computer language skilfully. Furthermore, some students have sophisticated knowledge. I think it is the result of the opening of the 'Summer Course'. Moreover, we select the members of the Society through a test. Therefore, their standard is relatively high.
- R: Have you tried to improve the students' standard?
- L: Yes, we have held a lot of activities about computers. For example, we have invited some experts to give talks about the development of

the computer. We have also visited some computer companies. addition, we held some 'Programme Design' competition and open some computer courses to students.

Many students regard the computer solely as a machine for playing R:

games. What is your opinion?

disagree with such thought. It is not our Society's object for L: students to use school computers for playing games. Nevertheless, it will be a good thing if we gain entertainment from it at home.

The Education Department is promoting computer courses in secondary R: Do you think this can help the development of computer

studies effectively?

This would help. If we want to introduce computer to the public, the best method is to begin with education because students can bring the knowledge home. I think the Hong Kong Government wants to increase the use of computers. Promoting computer courses is just the first step.

Does our school have the intention of starting the course? R:

Yes, we have. But now is not the right time. If we start the L: course, students have to spare more time to study the subject. Moreover, do we study computer only for examination? Is this course good for students and how to choose students to study? It is because not all students are given the chance to study. Furthermore, we have no spare classrooms for it. This is our main problem.

Have you any difficulty in fulfilling the aim of the Computer R:

Society?

There are some problems for the time being. For example, we have L: the problem in the time arrangement. I have tried to find out which is the best system - whether students should be allowed to use the computers freely or not.

Mr. Lam, what do you think about the status of computer in future? L: From the present status of the computer, I notice that in science

- research, government administration, all kinds of companies and schools like to use computers because they can provide many services for us. As the computer is a machine, I think it is a most reliable assistant. Furthermore, I believe that the computer in future will be as popular as television now - one in each family.


A sad cold morning

SPORTS REPORT

The season just finished was one in which we had some very mixed fortunes. For some of our teams it was a season they will want to quickly forget, while for others it will be remembered as one of our best.

Good results came our way in Track and Field events this year, starting with Cross Country. The results of the training organised by the Long Distance Runners Club were soon obvious after the start of the A Grade race as all our runners were well up within the first thirty runners. As the big hill on the course took its toll on other runners, the new colours of the A Graders could be made out with five boys in the first ten. With the climb behind them it was a long run down to the road and in to the finish where we filled 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 8th, 10th and 16th places to give us a total of 43 points 66 in front of DBS who were runners-up. Inspired by the convincing A Grade win the B Graders took off and soon established themselves well up among the front runners. At the finish we had 62 points to take the title, again from DBS, with our runners taking 2nd, 7th, 8th, 10th, 11th, and 24th places. Perhaps it was expecting too much of the C team to get them to make it a grand slam and as it turned out it was not to be. We didn't manage to get enough runners up front in the early stages of the race and had to be content with runners-up spot to DBS. Our best runner finished in third position. With two firsts and a second we were Div. 2 Champions and now look forward to competing in Div. 1 next season. Following the success in the Inter Schools we then entered three teams for the HK Island road relay race and finished third and fourth in the schools section. All in all a good year for long distance running. In Athletics, after a shaky start the teams pulled themselves together and, thanks to some fine relay results, we collected 133 points to finish overall fifth.

Badminton and Basketball were two sports in which we had no luck whatsoever and after disappointing results we ended the season in second last place with relegation to Div. 2 in both sports. Perhaps a season in the lower division will give us time to rebuild our teams and get up among the Champions again.

Our Footballers were promoted to Div. 1 last year and really had to work hard. The A Grade team played very well and finished joint third in the league. The B Graders were not quite up to it and failed to win a game, while our C Team had three wins, one draw and three defeats to finish fifth. Overall we finished sixth and remain in Div. 1.

In Ping Pong our teams were also competing in Div. 1 and the best result came from A Grade who entered the final round and brought home the third place banner. B and C finished fifth. Volleyball still struggles on in Div. 2 and neither of the teams made the finals.

Finally we come to the aquatic side of our sports. A very strong B Grade swimming team emerged Runners-up by seven points to St. Stephen's college, but unfortunately, the A and C teams were very weak and our overall result was only 9th. Divisions 1 and 2 were combined for Life Saving this year due to a drop in entries and, while they tried their best, our boys were just not up to it and we filled the second last place overall.

New ground was broken this year when we had a special guest of honour for our Inter Class Cross Country Races. We were very lucky to have Miss Winnie Ng, Hong Kong's Marathon Queen, who besides presenting the trophies also met the students for half an hour and answered many questions about running. Her presence certainly made the races far more interesting and enjoyably.

A Course on 'The Art of Living'

During this academic year, students have become familiar with the term 'The Art of Living'. Nevertheless, how many of us know what it means?

At the very beginning, our principal planned on having catechism class. Being aware that the catechism class is not very popular by the students, Miss Lina Yung, our new teacher this year, proposed a course, entitled 'The Art of Living' which introduces philosophy and other aspects of human behaviour into our daily lives. Without going into the depths of theology and ethics, this 'The Art of Living' is a session apart from that of the religion class.

Through this viewing of the different aspects of living such as scientific, social, moral, physiological and medical, 'The Art of Living' leads us to a better understanding of the correct view of life. The simple interesting and intensive discussion brought out the real meaning of life. With the kind help of Mr. W. H. Tam who helped in solving technical problems. It was plain — sailing all the way, and the meeting terminated by 12:55 p.m.

The atmosphere of the meetings was like that of a big family even warmer because of the absence of the generation gap. Miss Yung regarded the students who attended the meetings not only as students but as her brothers. On this basis, they could communicate with one another freely.

In the early months, meetings were divided into senior and junior groups as it was thought



that a gap might exist between junior and senior students. Junior students were innocent, direct, and could see problems which adults ignored. They were enthusiastic about the course, as a sincere supporter should be. Out of embarrassment, senior students were unwilling to ask or be selective in topics for discussion. After January, meetings were held for students from all forms in order to generalise their thinking.

Topics such as 'Out of enmity', 'What kind of a world is it?' and 'What am I' were interesting and instructive, and discussed during the meetings. Have you participated in any one of these?


I have recorded some opinions from the students during a meeting.

Students from senior form:-


- -'The principle is too basic and simple for me. I think that "The Art of Living" is not suitable for higher form students.'








跆拳道會

訪圖書館主任

序:中一及中二同學今年多了一堂又有 趣、又實用的圖書館學原理堂,待 我們訪問圖書館主任吳展明先生, 認識一下這新鮮的圖書館學原理堂。

問:請問本校圖書館今年是不是爲中一及中 二同學開設了一個關於圖書館學的課程 ?

答:(點一點頭)是。今年是第一年爲中一 、中二同學開辦這個圖書館學課程。

問:課程是根據甚麼來編定?

答:課程是由教育署屬下的圖書館組及視學 處共同編制的。前者是負責各校圖書館 內的設備,書本的登記、分類、目錄等 事項。後者是著重圖書館的活動及教學 等。

問:這課程的目的是甚麼?

答:這課程的目的是使學生明瞭怎樣正確地 找尋資料。並使學生能善用圖書館內的 各種設備作學術研討,認識圖書館的規 則及其作用。從而提高學生閱讀與趣及 學術水平。

問:上課時間和教授的內容大致是怎樣?

答:中一及中二同學的上課時間都是每週次 一節。內容十分廣泛,包括教授一些圖 書分類法。例如,爲英文書而設的杜威 圖書分類法及中文書的賴永祥圖書分類 法;認識分類號碼及著者碼。還有分類 目錄、著者目錄、書名目錄、主題目錄

、叢書目錄及科目索引等類項的查閱; 書籍目錄的使用,百科全書的檢閱及應 用法,報告的進行及資料安排法等等。 使同學能以最迅速的方法獲得所需的資 料。

問:同學的反應怎樣?

答:(微笑)反應非常熱烈。此點可由圖書 館的使用率及借閱書籍的數量上可看得 到。今年借閱書籍的數量比往年增加了 三倍以上呢!

問:到現階段,有甚麼收效呢?

答:中一、中二同學已對圖書館有一定的認識,他們已能開始利用圖書館的設備查

閱所須資料,而且,中一、中二同學到 圖書館的人數更比往年明顯地增加了。

問:你認為這課程應不應推廣至中三及以上 的班級?

答:(嚴肅地)應該。如果人手的問題能解 決的話,是應該推廣至中三以上各級。

問:你對這課程有何看法?

答:課程是必要的,因為以往同學不懂得如何選擇所需資料,和書籍的排列及分類法,現在已有改善。

長跑專訪

近一、兩年來,香港與起了長跑這門運動。這年來,我校也掀起了陣陣的長跑熱。 在三月期間我校更有十名師生,參加了一個 由體育用品公司舉辦的「中國海岸馬拉松」 。因此我們特地訪問了完成這次長跑的林家 耀老師和劉志堅老師:

- (一)首先,很多謝兩位老師能抽空來接受我們的訪問。據所知,兩位參加了今年的中國海岸馬拉松,究竟有甚麼地方吸引你們參加這次長跑呢?
- 林: 唔, ……我本人來說, 進行長跑這項運動的時日尚短。自從在十月初參加了師生長跑後, 就發覺自己有潛質能長跑。而且在馬拉松之前, 亦曾參加公開賽, 覺得還可跑長些, 所以為了對自己來一個挑戰和看看自己的能力能達到那境界, 所以便決定參加此次的馬拉松。
- 劉:參加這次馬拉松的動機是在於想証明一點東西給自己看,不是給人看,事實上長跑是一種相當個人的運動項目。看看自己能否跑完二十六哩。而且這個赛事舉辦的目的,是給與那些想嘗試跑完馬拉松的新丁參加的,所謂「FINISHERS'MARATHON」,對於我來說真是最適合不過哩!機會當前,豈容錯過。
- (二)在賽前有沒有進行一些特别練習呢?
- 林:特訓是沒有的,練習則有。大概在十二 月中,就開始計劃訓練細則,直至一月 初開始正式訓練。在訓練期間,每星期 通常跑四、五十哩;每日平均約七、八 哩,有時一日跑長些,第二日則較短回 些許。而一星期大概跑五日左右;在馬

拉松前二個星期,訓練則較為艱苦了, 每天都把距離拉長和跑得快些,更曾在 一天跑上二十哩。當然除了運動外,更 着重注意自己的飲食和健康。

- 劉:我也是一樣,沒有進行一些特別練習, 也沒有林Sir 那樣有系統,每天大概跑 八哩,而且在接近比賽前的一段日子是, ,也沒有拉長練習距離。我認為我在中 、長距離跑步方面有些少基礎,而每天 跑八哩跑完一個馬拉松照理是不成問題 ,最重要的反而是要注意自己的起居的 食及練習時要小心,避免扭傷,不然的 話,全年作好準備,到時因些小病不能 出賽,只有看的份兒,是非常痛苦的一 回事。
- (三)在賽前有否信心完成是項長跑?
- 林:信心就當然有,因為在跑完十一月中的 長跑後,感到二十哩和二十六哩只差六 哩,所以信心相當强,更希望能在四小 時內完成。
- 劉:我認為我自己沒有足夠的信心,因為以 前從未試過跑這樣遠的路程,最多跑過 十二哩,並且不是在比賽的情况下進行。
- (四)沿途有沒有遇到困難?
- 林:起初在北潭涌營地出發向西跑,到大網仔,一直至西澳這段路,都覺得比較輕鬆,因為出發在早上六時半,還沒有太陽,天氣很涼快,而且沿途感到空氣清新,但從萬宜水庫出東壩回程的那段路較為辛苦,因為時近中午,天氣較熱,與及跑了十多哩路程,身體開始感到些微缺水的現象。後半小時可謂是向體力與

意志挑戰的了。結果終於在四小時內完 成整個路程。

劉:沿途沒有遭遇到太大的困難,跑到東壩的時候,已經完成了大半路程,猶有餘力,認為今次一定可完成這個馬拉松。但走到主壩之前的斜路時,由於它是一條長命斜,為要保留體力跑畢全程,所以步行走上斜坡,不然的話,我可以造出更好的時間。最令自己開心的事,是由頭到尾終於保持着旺盛的門志,沒有一刻氣餒,有點老馬復勇的感覺。

(五) 赛後感想如何?

林:當然感到開心,因為自己可以完成二十 六哩,而且是在四小時內完成,可算達 到自己的目標,而另一種感覺就是知道 要完成這項賽事,不單是講求體力,還 要講求鬥志,更感到鬥志,是一件非常 重要的條件。所以跑馬拉松鬥志是非常 重要的因素。

劉:當然感到非常、非常的高興。年少時, 從電影看到阿比比跑馬拉松時,就織了 一個童年的夢,要跑完一個馬拉松,而 今終於實現,自然樂不可支。並且在今 次比賽中,令我更明白到自己的缺點和 優點所在。缺點在於跑步時身體擺動幅 度太大,而身軀又不夠直(是長跑會的 同學給我指出的),更加上超重十磅。 而優點卻在於有鬥志强、體力足,和 為一個適合自己的時間表來練習,我有 信心下次跑得更好。

(六)下次會否再參加公開性的長跑活動?

林:當然會,在完成這次比賽後,對二十六 哩已不感恐懼,所以希望下次的香港國 際馬拉松中得到更好成績,以三小時完 成全程。

劉:會,我下次的目標是參加香港的國際馬 拉松,那是要在四小時內跑完二十六哩 的,而且更需在頭三小時,跑完四分三 的路程,才有資格繼續,是一個要求較 高的審事。

(七)是否有些國際長跑好手參與是項比賽? 同:今次則沒有甚麼國際好手參加,但卻有

不少日本人和澳門人參與,結果第一名 的是日本人,但成績並不怎樣突出。

(八) 那麼兩位認為香港的長跑水準和國際相差多少?

同:男子方面,港人的水準與國際的水平相差太遠了。在香港跑得最快的馬拉松選手需時二小時二十六分左右來完成二十六哩,但國際水準要二小時十分內完成才有問鼎的機會。不要小看那十多分鐘,香港那第一名的選手連日本五十傑也及不上,可見相差多大。女子方面則好些,最低限度我們有伍麗珠和長谷村游子,可算國際級的跑手。但總括來說,香港的水準和國際的相差很遠。



最後,本人對校長先生的領導,及各位 老師作育英才的教學精神,與及各同學努力 不懈的學習態度,表示十分敬佩。




蜕變中的新界

金庸作品選評

武俠小說是我國獨特的文學體裁,有俠士、有愛情,劇情更峯迴路轉,引人入勝,故吸引不少讀者。而在武俠小說裏可以看見一個近乎現代的「古代」社會。在古代封建制度下,女性是沒有多大自由、權力、地位的,但在作家的筆下,女性是可以隨意流浪江湖,固然可以拔刀相助,以救弱小,更可以和男性談情說愛,這不是現在的自由戀愛嗎?在小說世界,固可以看到鳳求風,但風求鳳亦不罕見,這非是男女平等嗎?

在芸芸金庸作品中,我個人認為天龍八部最有氣勢。在書的序裏,已經解釋書的名字,原來八部者是一天、二龍、三夜叉、四乾達婆……,這樣給了讀者一個又新鮮兼新奇的印象。

在第一部裏,段譽出場,他一出現就令 全書增加不少娛樂性。因他是「先天」的喜 劇人物,常常給讀者不少大笑、微笑、傻笑 、苦笑。

他貴爲儲君之尊居然四出遊蕩,這固是十分危險,如果他不是在無量劍宮被鍾靈救走,他可能會中了「生死符」,那麼他以後求生不得,求死不能,以後的故事可能要改寫。他學武功,是勉爲其難而「練」的。雖我實貴的內力,也是別人强迫他接納的。所以他的武功可說是從「天上掉下來」的。雖然他苦戀王語媽,但在讀者心中,他的苦是十分趣怪的。最後,他登上帝位,使讀者不禁懷疑他是否適合做統治者呢?但金庸在最後一頁裏,安排段譽說的一句話:『各

人有各人的緣法,我見慕容兄和阿碧那麼可憐,但他們眼中,我何嘗不是可憐,我又何必多事呢!』這一句話,正顯示了段譽的成熟。更顯示金庸的筆法。

在段譽引帶下,我們結識了一個大英雄 、大豪傑,一個統率天下豪傑的喬峯。他的 出現,使人感到一股氣勢的襲擊。他使段譽 带來的嘻笑氣氛一掃而走,換來灰色、沉重 、悲傷的氣氛。因他是一個大悲劇人物。他 自幼在農家生長下,本來可以平平凡凡過一 生,但他父、母親偏是大遼居民,一個和大 宋對敵的國家。本來他做了丐幫幫主,可以 爲大宋出力,但身世被揭發後,所有武林人 士都不容忍他,加上義父、義母、師父及各 項殺人的罪名加在他身上,使他喘不過氣來 。一個人在世上沒有朋友已經是可悲了,何 况自己最爱的人也死在他掌下。到最後,只 有形單隻影生活。雖然後來他做了南院大王 ,但他不喜這地位,更反而使他和義兄發生 衝突,受苦又是喬峯。對喬峯來說,他活在 世上沒有意義,只是一個吃飯的活死人,在 各樣壓力、憤怒、悲哀衝激,他用利箭來結束了生命。他是含憤而去,對當時的一切作出大控訴。

在情節方面,武功出神入化,有可以用 内力激射而出的六脉神剑和火焰刀,有作出 大膽嘗試的北冥神功和化功大法,有令人不 寒而慄的生死符,和用來逃命的凌波微步。 以上一切,非一個想像和創造力豐富的人所 能做到的。但寫起來,合符邏輯,使人信服 。又加上人物情節錯綜複雜,但使人看起來 有一氣呵成之感。而在武打的描述方面,固 然有各高手爭鬥的聚賢莊大戰和少林寺大戰 等,但也有新奇的六脉神劍比火焰刀和天山 童姥及李秋水的追逐戰。總觀全書,全沒有 冷場,而且有各樣大大小小的高潮,令讀者 以爲在少林寺大戰後,便難有再大的高潮, 但金庸卻在書末安排了一場武林高手大戰遼 國的士兵,而喬峯的死,更掀起全書的高潮 ,使人氣也不能喘一口,非要在最後,也不 能放低下來休息。




也真是太自私了。」陳源沒有作聲,李先生 又說:「終於我找到了他們,現在想請你作 一個說客。|


回望身後,是一條用血汗、淚水造成的



母校啊!母校啊!我願化為清風、我願 化為夕陽。在妳的身旁依偎着妳。








