

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History of Chan Sui Ki (La Salle) College



In April 1967 the Chan family approached the Jesuits to ask if they would be interested in taking over the running of a secondary school to the building of which they intended contributing in memory of their father MR. CHAN SUI KI, a successful merchant and one time President of the Tung Wah Group of Hospitals — a well known charitable organization in Hong Kong. Not wishing to accept the offer themselves, Fr. Cronin, the Provincial, proposed the offer to the La Salle Brothers. Eventually, it was decided that La Salle College accept the offer and transfer the existing evening school operating in La Salle College to the new building. The evening school under the supervision of Brother Herman Fenton operated from 3:00 until about 8:00 p.m. The government would provide the site and an 80% subsidy. The Chan family would donate \$500,000 H.K.

In December, 1968 work began on the site. In April 1969 the foundation stone was laid by the then Director of Education, Mr. Gregg, and on September 3 the school moved into the classroom block — 951 students and 34 teachers all told. All the while work on the school hall and the laboratories, library, geography, art-room, etc. and the Brothers' quarters (which unhappily provide an accommodation for only four) continued until December 12 when the building authority inspected the completed building in preparation for giving the final occupation permit. The official blessing and opening ceremony was performed on February 12, 1970 by Rev. Father Colombo P. P. and the Hon. J. Canning, Director of Education, respectively.









The community was inaugurated on July I, 1969 when Brother Herman Fenton, Director and Brother Eugene Sharkey were appointed to the new school. Later they were joined by Brothers Cronan and Paul Hackett. Until the Brothers quarters were ready the community continued to reside in La Salle College.

The school is named after Mr. Chan Sui Ki: this was the condition on which the Chan family donated \$500,000 towards its building. During his life-time Mr. Chan Sui Ki contributed generously to various worthy causes and projects. During the years 1914-15 he built numerous houses and hospitals for the poor and he built roads in his home town and at the same time put up more than twenty free schools in Hong Kong and Macau, Canton, Fat Shan and elsewhere in memory of his father. For his charitable work his birth-place was sometimes known as "the Port of Chan Sui Ki".

In 1936 he received the "Golden Dragon" medal from the Vietnamese Government in recognition of the help he had given in their troublesome times. On several occasions he sent handsome donations to Northern China, Canton and Hong Kong and for years he distributed free rice to the needy of Macau. It was to commemorate the memory of this man's record of philanthropic works that his family decided to build a school bearing his name and to turn the running of it over into the hands of a reputable body in the hope that it would be a worthy monument.

The new academic structure for senior secondary education will start from 2009/10 school year. The reform has several special features such as the introduction of a new core subject, Liberal Studies and the incorporation of school-based assessment component. This has a long-term impact on school policy-making. Actions have been taken in response to the education reform. Junior secondary curriculum has been firstly changed. Integrated Science will replace Form Three Physics, Chemistry and Biology one year before the first cohort of students enjoy the new academic structure for senior secondary education. Integrated Humanities Department has been formed to prepare for the new syllabus and teaching materials. The teaching and learning time of the subject Computer Literacy will be increased starting from the next academic year so as to enrich the computer skills of our students. These are for the good of our future generations and we are committed to providing quality education for our students.

School facilities also play an important role in providing quality education. The school improvement project has finally come to completion. The nine-storeyed building is ready for use

in which computer-assisted learning center and language room would certainly help to improve teaching and learning. On the seventh floor, two rooms are reserved to support split-class teaching. The cancellation of floating classes is to provide a better environment for learning.

Speaking of student activities, our athletics teams did very well in the Inter-school Athletics Meet. Our A, B and C grade teams came fourth, second and third respectively. The overall position was the second and therefore we would be promoted to Division One next year.

Congratulations to the athletes and the teachers-in-charge

on their excellent sports performance.

Lastly, the compilation of the school magazine relies on the hard work of our student editors and the supervision of the teacher advisors. Thanks should be given to them. Without their contributions, the publication would not be successful. Credits should also go to parents, old boys and benefactors for their continuous support.

And so I ask Your guidance, God



to the Form Two prize-winners. The session ended at 8:50 am and after that, all students proceeded to their classrooms for their lessons.



The Asia-Pacific Lasallian Youth Congress 7 (APLYC 7) is an international congress for all Lasallian students in the world. The APLYC 7 was held in Hong Kong from 11th to 18th December 2004 and all of the Lasallian schools in Hong Kong worked together closely for the Congress. Four students from our Form Six classes were chosen to join the Congress as delegates. They include Liu Chun-lam, Chan Karson, Tse Kiu-cheung and Wong Yue-shing.

Before the start of the APLYC 7, we delegates had a lot of preparation work to do. During the Congress, we had to give a presentation to all of the delegates from the other countries which include Japan, Australia, Papua New Guinea, New Zealand, the Philippines, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand, Sri Lanka and Singapore. We also provided service for the new immigrants from mainland China. On the first day of our service, we went to a primary school in Wong Tai Sin and played with the pupils there. On the second day, all of the delegates took some children to have a look at some famous landmarks in Hong Kong such as the ferry pier in Tsim Sha Tsui, the IFC and the headquarters of the HSBC.

To prepare for the above-mentioned service programme and the whole congress, we needed to spend all our weekends from September to December working together. Although the work was hard, it was worth our time and effort. While staying in the camp, we needed to communicate with others in English. We attended a lot of meetings, seminars and sharing sessions. There was also a lucky draw. We enjoyed all the programmes and we have also developed close friendship with the other delegates.


Visit from APLYC-delegates

All enjoyed the visit very much.






School Homepage Revamping



The Principal's Speech

you spend with us. Now I would like to deliver the school report. Staff Appraisal is one of the core elements for School-based Management. We started to run our system two years ago and have already completed the first two-year cycle. After a full review, a refinement has been made before we start the second cycle this year.

The four key tasks, Moral and Civic Education, Reading to Learn, Project Learning and Information Technology for Interactive Learning are considered as the essential elements of the new curriculum. Therefore, we put the first three as our major concerns in the School Development Plan of the first three-year cycle, which started last year. The work of enhancing Moral & Civic Education is divided into four different groups, namely, Civic Education, Moral Education, Environmental Protection and the Health Education. Their themes revolve around different cultures, the sense of responsibility, the idea of a green school and the prevention of Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (**SARS**) and Dengue Fever. A working team is set to promote an interest in reading among all students and to help Form 1 students equip themselves with necessary reading skills and library skills. Teachers of the designated Humanities subjects, namely, Geography, History and EPA cooperate to provide a cross-stream project learning scheme for Form two students. The targets set in the School Development Plan were basically achieved as the intended outcomes were observed.

In order to ensure that Form One students have a good foundation to learn in English, they were offered bridging programs of English, Mathematics and Integrated Science during the summer holiday. Some students were required to attend bridging programs of E.P.A, Geography and History in September. The result showed that it was very effective to develop their ability of learning in English, not only the subject of English, but also the subjects taught in English. Small class English Language teaching has been introduced to F.1 students since 1999. Ten English teachers are assigned to teach five classes. Each of them teaches 20 to 21 students. English is an international language for communication, so our Careers Guidance Committee and English Department have co-organized a summer study tour to Brighton, England. 33 students, accompanied by two teachers, joined the tour for two weeks in late July. The teachers and students were satisfied with this experience.

In the last school year, the academic performance of our Form 7 students in the Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination was satisfactory. The passing rates of Use of English and Chinese Language & Culture are 98% and 93% respectively.

And that of Physics, Chemistry and Pure Mathematics are 98%, 94% and 93% respectively. The passing rates of Chinese History, Economics and Principles of Accounts are 100%. The rate of university admission is 77%.

The performance of our F.5 graduates in Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination was average. The passing rates of Chinese Language, English Language and Mathematics are 88%, 91% and 99% respectively. The passing rates of Additional Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics and Computer Studies are greater than 89% and that in History is 100%. 87% of our F.5 graduates passed at least five subjects and 70 of them got 14 points or more in their best 6 subjects.



ECA, Extra-curricular activities are an integral part of the school curriculum. **ECA**, Extra-curricular activities play an important role in the all-rounddevelopment of students as they can develop their potential and interests; cultivate a spirit of mutual help and cooperation and enable them to participate actively in every aspect of school-life.

We have great concern over students' participation in **ECA**, extra-curricular activities. A wide range of **ECA**, extra-curricular activities is provided for our students. They can freely join clubs or societies. They are invited to participate in inter-class competitions, encouraged to organize and participate in community service projects as well as joint-school activities such as Caritas Bazaar, the Inter-school Chinese and English Debating Competitions, the Joint School Science Exhibition and the Joint School Singing Contest.

A 6A student, 何樂文 was the best debater in the Inter-school Chinese Debating Competition.

Another 6A student, 王浩昌 was awarded the champion in a Chinese Chess Competition open to all teenagers in secondary schools.

In the Hong Kong Physics Olympiad 2004, Mau Yat Sen (a Form 4 boy) got the third hounor.

Our students won a first class prize and a third class prize in the Hong Kong Mathematics High Achievers Selection Contest.

In the 55th Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival and 56th Music Festival, our students were awarded one champion, three second prizes, three third prizes and 93 certificates of merit or certificates of proficiency.

For sports, our Football teams were the overall champion in the Inter-school Football Competition (Division II).

The Basketball teams came second in the overall position in the Inter-school Basketball Competition (Division II).

Our B & C grades Athletics Teams got the second & third positions respectively in the Inter-school Athletics Championship.

Our B-grade swimming team won the championship in the Inter-school Swimming Competition (Division II).

Overall our school was in the 10th position in the BOCHK Bauhinia Bowl Award.

A new school annex is being built.

It is a nine-storeyed building with a Computer Assisted Learning Room, a Language Room, a Guidance Activity Room, a Student Activity Centre, a Staff Room, a Staff Common Room, a Conference Room, two Interview rooms and some Multi-purpose rooms. Though no new classroom is officially offered, if necessary, by changing the function of some existing rooms, there will be four new classrooms for future use.

Lastly, I would like to extend my appreciation to all teachers and staff for their devotion to our school and wish our graduates every success in the future. I also wish to express my gratitude to our Brothers, parents, old boys and friends for their continuous support to improve our school.

李炳強校長專訪——

「做好本份」



陳瑞祺開校至今已經三十六個年頭,培育出的學生不計其數,老師當然是功不可沒。 而在一九六九年便入職的老師中,仍在本校工作的已不多,李炳強校長是其中一位,但 他亦將會在今個學年後退休。

他是本校的首位華人校長,他肩負了領導本校員工面對教育改革的責任,看似沉默的校長,其實並不嚴肅。兩個小時的訪問中,他跟我們分享他在任以來的喜與悲。

校長的權與責

校長笑言:「學生多數只知校長的權力很大,可以隨時趕你出校。」

原來我校在羅倫修士當校長之前,都是實行「一人校長制」,即由校長安排所有老師的教學工作,但面對教育改革,「一人校長制」已不合時宜,李校長上任後,參考其他學校重新改建我校的行政架構。在新的架構下,校長主要負責學校的行政工作。而近兩年則忙於處理新校舍的建築工程。

校長的管理哲學

當問及校長三十多年教學生涯中最難應付的事時,他表示:「要成為一位完善的領導者,統領員工面對重重挑,跨越困難,確是一項很艱鉅的任務。如何使各員工各司其職、各安其份以至發揮所長,亦是我擔任校長以來,最富挑戰性的一環。回想在1992年剛出任副校長時,我也碰過不少釘子,例如在調配和重整考試編排方



面也試過處理不周,但經一事,長一智。」回顧這個經驗,校長感慨良多:「千萬不要以為自己很聰明和擁有很大的權力,尊重和溝通是很重要的,因為這樣才能發揮團隊精神。」校長亦明白溝通的重要性。它是管理哲學中重要的階梯,無論做任何事,都必需先了解一下對方的想法。單方面作出決定,只會激化雙方的矛盾,令事情變得更糟。

英語教學,逆流而行

母語教學、三三四學制,一連串的教育改革,是本校,甚至是全港中學所面對的難題。

校長承認: 「英語教學是我校的優良傳統,即使用母語教學可能令學生更易於學習,我校仍要維持 用英語,這就要逆流而行。」

雖然已有明確目標,但校長坦言要維持英語教學,壓力實在不輕。首先,必須要招收到大量學習能力 高的學生。但自從當局取消了小學學能測驗,令入讀的中一生質素變得參差,而有能力的學生,都被區內的 學校分薄了。有見及此,老師都盡力去幫助學生,以維持用英語教學的學習環境。

要固本,才可以培元,校長承認:「我們沒有辦法確保入讀中一生的質素,除非是提升學校的校譽。」但良好的校譽並非一朝一夕就能建立,陳瑞祺學生的表現和操行、區內的街坊看得見。而在公開考試中的成績,公眾就知得到。每一樣都是日積月累所得來的,校方故然要制定有效的措施,但同學的努力,才是成敗的關鍵。



李炳強校長專訪



校長,就是校長

「校長,無論怎樣也好,他負的責任都是最大的,絕對不可以將責任推卸給老師。」校長表示壓力在何時都會有,工作時一定要面對壓力,如果壓力太大又或者難於處理時,就會找副校長或老師幫忙,但絕不是將事情推卸給老師處理。至於談到如何舒緩壓力方面,他謂:「食得鹹魚抵得渴」,接受了工作,便要把它做好,所以並沒有太大壓力需要舒緩。如果真是有,他會與其他老師傾談一下,放鬆自己的心情。

不斷成長的陳瑞祺

除了一些定期的翻新工程,三十多年來的校舍,在校長眼中並沒有很大的改變。在前年開始興建的新校舍,算得是三十多年來校舍的最大轉變。至於老師方面,都是數年便會有所更替,而且有一些於九十年代初移 民潮時移居外國。

校長憶述上一輩的學生比較成熟及懂得自立,偶然會疏於學習,但不會做出頑皮的事。主要是因為當年中四以上的高年級生,年紀比現在的大,很多都已超過二十歲。但自從在1978年,政府推行九年免費教育,學生平均年齡下降,學生的數目又增加,每班平均四十至五十人。因此,同學間的成績差異比以往大,加上每個家庭,都只有一兩名子女,令他們變得倚賴,欠缺自主獨立和不成熟。

校長與太太有一個兒子和兩個女兒, 兒子1998年在陳瑞祺畢業,任職會計師, 於上海工作;而兩位女兒則身處澳洲,長 女在幼稚園工作,幼女亦是從事會計。

Speech by Professor YS Wong

Vice-President (Administration), City University of Hong Kong & Chairman, Curriculum Development Council of EMB 2003-2004 Speech Day of Chan Sui Ki (La Salle) College 26 November 2004



Brother Patrick, Principal Lee, Distinguished Guests, Parents, Teachers and Fellow Graduates,

Thank you for inviting me to join you this evening in celebration of your graduation day. I also wish to extend my warmest congratulations to all of you on the 35th anniversary of Chan Sui Ki (La Salle) College.

While you are celebrating what you have achieved, I urge you, graduates of 2003-2004, to thank your teachers, principal and Old Boys for their hard work and dedication in the past 35 years in building up a school with impressive achievements that you can take pride in. In the years ahead, while you are beginning a new chapter in your life, don't forget to lend your support to your alma mater which will also be facing new challenges along the path of educational development as it journeys forward.

Last month, the Government started seeking consultation on the introduction of 3+3+4 academic structure which proposes to introduce a new three-year senior secondary schooling with a revised curriculum. This will certainly bring sweeping changes to the secondary school education of Hong Kong.



For many years, the secondary school curriculum has been criticized as too examination oriented with two public exams at Form 5 and Form 7; too narrow with inadequate out of discipline experiences, for example, in sports, arts and culture; too focused on imparting knowledge; and too early in streaming students into art and science disciplines. Now, the proposed 3+3+4 curriculum reform is expected to address these shortcomings.

In line with secondary school reform, universities curriculum will also change from three- to four-year. While this ties in with the mainstream education systems around the world, the ultimate beneficiaries of the reform will be the students. The proposed system will provide a multidisciplinary, more diversified and flexible curriculum for students, and create an environment conducive to the realization of the whole person development.

Dear Graduates, many of you will continue your tertiary education after leaving school. What do you expect the extra university year to bring to you? Some people may think that this is just adding a foundation year to the three-year curriculum. To me, this does not accord to the modern educational philosophy. Instead, universities should make use of the extra year to revamp its curriculum, student activities; and reengineer the mechanisms for course selection and student admissions. Do you want to have greater exposure to other professional disciplines? Do you want to have greater choices of courses? With the four-year curriculum, universities will have the flexibility to offer interdisciplinary combination of courses and "double degrees", introduce a major and minor system, as well as genuinely realize the credit unit system by expanding the choice of courses and establishing mechanisms for credit transfer.

As we all know, university should not be merely a place for transmission of knowledge, it is a fertile ground for nurturing moral development and personal growth. With the new curriculum, universities will have more flexibility to promote liberal education, better organize student exchange programmes, internship and placement schemes which will broaden students' horizon and experiences.

The new senior school education aims to provide a balanced, multidisciplinary and diversified curriculum for students; develop their critical thinking and analytical abilities. The current university admissions system, which relies heavily on public results, must be revised to tie in with the senior school curriculum. In future, in addition to public exams results, school assessments and non-academic performance will also be considered.



School Vision & Mission

Vision

We believe that our students are capable of learning and developing their potentials under our Lasallian spirit which touches hearts of people.

Mission

The mission of our school is to form a community where teachers and students can live their faith and become the persons that God wants them to be. We provide students with quality education that enables them to learn how to learn and to learn how to live that will empower them to become persons of integrity and persons eager to serve others.

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Our School

Brief Introduction of the School

Chan Sui Ki (La Salle) College is a subsidized Catholic boys' school founded in 1969 and is one of the five secondary schools run by the La Salle Brothers in Hong Kong.

There are 28 classrooms and 13 special rooms, namely, the Library, the Geography Room, the Language Centre, the Art Room, the Physics Laboratory, the Biology Laboratory, the Chemistry Laboratory, the Integrated Science Laboratory, the Music Room, the Chapel, the Multi-media Learning Centre, and two Computer Rooms.

There is an open playground, a coveredplayground and a school hall. There is also a canteen where students can have hot meals.

All the rooms and the School Hall are airconditioned.

A new school annex is being built. The construction work started at the end of 2002 and is most likely to be completed in December this year. It is a nine-storey building with a Computer-assisted Learning Room, a Language Room, a Guidance Room, two interview rooms and some multi-purpose rooms. Although no new classroom is officially offered, the functions of four other special rooms could be served for the classroom purposes when necessary.

School Management

The school-based management system was implemented since September 1999.

Further education and career guidance

Careers Guidance Committee organizes an array of activities to help students gain access to higher education and select a major field of study with implications for later vocational endeavours. JUPAS and IVE applications are good examples. Guest speakers are also invited to give talks at school and relevant information is disseminated to suit the needs and interests of students.

A study tour is organized in summer annually in the hope of broadening the horizons of students and building up their confidence in speaking English. Speaking of overseas education, The committee also renders assistance to students who intend to further their studies abroad. Each year, over one hundred applications for testimonials, transcripts and recommendation letters are handled.


The committee also keeps a close contact with external organizations offering scholarships to outstanding students and public bodies granting subsidies to students who are in financial difficulties.

Our Learning and Teaching

Our school is an EMI school and English is the medium of instruction for all subjects except Chinese Language, Chinese Language and Culture, Chinese Literature, Chinese History, Putonghua, Religious Studies, P.E., Music and Art.

Reading to Learn and Project Learning started at the beginning of the academic year, with the target learners being Form One and Form Two students respectively. Form One students were required to do extensive reading during lunchtime while Form Two students were provided with training and visits before starting their projects.

Upon receiving valuable advice from parents in the previous school-year, meetings were conducted and it was resolved that Form Four students in the Science stream will not be offered the choice of Chinese History as an elective subject starting from this year onwards, the reason being that students might find it difficult to fit into the systems offered by other schools if they fail to meet our requirements for Form Six admission. In Form Four, CIT has been introduced to replace Information Technology and Computer Studies.

Due to a small number of enrolments every year, it was decided that Chinese History will not be offered to Form Six students starting from the academic year 04-05. Careful consideration has been given to such a decision. A new subject called 'Mathematics and Statistics' will be introduced in place of the aforesaid subject. To ensure the smooth operation of the introduction of Integrated Humanities to Form One students in the year 05-06, a committee has been formed and



preparation is well under way.

Helping our students to learn effectively through using English is always our major concern. To achieve this aim, all new Form One students were required to attend regular English lessons during the summer holiday. To further improve the effectiveness of learning, bridging courses on Mathematics, Integrated Science, History, Geography and EPA were provided for those Form One students who were still not yet accustomed to an EMI-setting at the beginning of the school-year. To promote the use of Putonghua as a tool for communication, students from junior forms were selected to attend courses conducted by tutors from professional organizations. Extra lessons were conducted by individual teachers whenever necessary.

Our teaching staff always regard teaching as an ever-learning process. There was active participation in seminars, workshops and courses relevant to their fields of study as well as other important aspects such as discipline, counseling and careers guidance. To help teachers who are teaching other subjects to sharpen their command of English as a tool for instruction, informal meetings have been arranged on a regular basis so that these teachers can converse freely in English with our native English-speaking teacher.

Assessment is an indispensable part of the learning process. In order to help our students to make improvement, detailed analysis of results were provided after each test or examination so that remedial measures could be taken to reinforce the effectiveness of both learning and teaching.

Major Concerns (Achievements and Reflection)

Priority 1: Enhancing Moral and Civic education.

Achievements

The task of promoting moral and civic education in our school was observed to be in progress because most of the intended outcomes are being achieved.

Two Health Dual Weeks were held to arouse students' awareness of pursuing a healthy lifestyle. Students now pay more attention to their personal hygiene and the importance of fighting infectious community diseases. Students also know more about the work of international health organizations after visiting the Health Education and Resources Centre.

The inter-class display board design competition did arouse students' awareness of the significance of environmental protection and good responses from students were observed. Some students joined the Student Environmental Protection Ambassador Scheme (SEPAS) and 10 out of 23 participants were awarded the basic badge and certificate. Some other students joined the "Live a Green Lifestyle Program", which strengthened the link between our school and many outside green bodies.

Most activities held for promoting moral and civic values were found to be effective. Various forms of activities did arouse students'-

awareness of current affairs and the big events that had happened in the community. It had been observed that students now have a positive attitude towards citizenship and are more aware of both local and world news.

Regular short talks at morning assemblies on topics such as "Most courteous stars", "Appreciation" and "How to control your emotion" received very favourable response from our students. The whole school atmosphere has become more peaceful and happier than before.

Reflection

On the whole, the work of last year would have been improved if we had paid more attention to the following areas.

Firstly, students' participation rates in the moral & civic education activities could have been further improved if there had been better coordination to avoid clashing with tests, exams and other extra-curricular activities. Moreover, because of limited time for the activities, the values conveyed were sometimes too vague. To overcome these problems, thorough consideration should be made regarding the time, interest and abilities of the students. Teacher advisors and student helpers can also attend more training courses so that activities can be better organized.

Secondly, in order to maximize the use of manpower and other resources, the Committee should organize more joint programmes and seek the help from the Health and Conservancy Club of the students.

Lastly, the School Improvement Project is still in progress and the physical environment is not so ideal for some of our activities. However, we hope that this will not be a problem after the completion of the Project in the 2nd term of the coming school year.

Priority 2: Promoting independent learning in students through project learning

Achievements

The targets set in the School Development Plan were met after implementation of the plan in the year of 2003/04.

Teachers of the designated Humanities subjects, namely, Geography, History and EPA did cooperate in providing a cross-stream project learning scheme to the F.2 students. During the past school year, teachers of the above subjects acquired the knowledge and skills required for teaching the subject through participation in training sessions, seminars, meetings, visits, self-study and especially in acting as teacher advisors to the students.

Teachers of Integrated Science and Chinese History were invited frequently by the Project Learning Committee to participate in some related programs in the past school year. Staff of the Integrated Science Department have agreed to join the new cross-stream project learning scheme in the coming year. Those from the other subjects were also aware of the significance of project learning as one of the major concerns in the School Development Plan. This could be proved because most of the



other subject departments have included project learning in their implementation plans.

Form 2 students received a formal training in project learning in the past school year. By observing their response during the course of work, and especially in the sessions of presentation, students showed satisfactory performance and also general betterment of their generic skills. On the whole, teacher advisors were satisfied with the performance of their students.

Students of other forms also sensed the significance of self-learning through project learning because they also received some project assignments from teachers of different subjects. However, they might benefit more if they could have the same exposure to project learning as the Form 2 students.

Reflection

The work of the year did pave the way towards a long-term sound development of the project learning curriculum in the school.

Teachers of F.2 Geography, History and EPA are now highly motivated to promote project learning. They have gained confidence from their experience in the past year. Moreover, after a year's work, they are now equipped with a lot of teaching resources, for example, a student's handbook and a teacher's handbook. Moreover, the work of students such as evaluation forms and the written reports will be good examples to F.2 students of the coming academic year.

All of the intended tasks have been completed except the project exhibition to be held at the

end of the school year. The exhibition has been postponed until September 2004. Teachers agreed that the change is needed because it allows project holders to have more time for reflection. Secondly, the exhibition can act as a demonstration to many other students and teachers at the beginning of the new school year.

Project learning might still be new to some teachers of the school. It would be better if the school could motivate more teachers to participate in related training courses or seminars.

Priority 3: Promoting students' reading habits.

Achievements

The strategies adopted in 2003/04 have achieved the intended outcomes of promoting an interest in reading among all students; helping Form 1 students equip themselves with necessary reading skills and library skills; and enhancing students' writing and expression skills.

An English reader was introduced to Form One students. They showed interest in detective stories and they could read their readers independently at home. They also joined the reading scheme organized by the HKPTU and they all achieved the status of *Green Badges*. The school also organized a bookmark design competition for them. Students had to design bookmarks on popular books of the school library. The response was very positive and students enjoyed the drawing activities very much.

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A CSK Reading to Learn Newsletter was published in July, 2004. The newsletter exhibited good Chinese and English written works of Form One students and it also revealed summarized statistical data of reading habits of all Form One students of the school.

In order to promote an interest in reading among all Form One students, a Lunch-break Reading Session was introduced to them. From a survey conducted in June 2004, it was discovered that more than 30% of them could finish reading more than one book within 6 months and 25% of them could finish one book in the same period. Nearly 40% of Form One students expressed that they had borrowed at least one book in a single week and that nearly 50% of them described themselves as booklovers. It was also found that they spent on average about 10.95 hours per week reading reference books and 9.66 hours reading magazines, newspaper and electronic texts. The results were quite encouraging.

To enhance students' Chinese writing skills, all Chinese book reports were assessed by Chinese Language teachers and the reports were satisfactory.

Finally, students were taught how to select suitable reading materials. There was a talk on reading given by two journalists and lessons on library skills were also given to Form One students.

Reflection

Schemes Related to English Reading

Students can generally produce satisfactory examination results and reading reports. However, students, especially those in remedial classes, show variation in abilities,. It is suggested that more basic reading skills should be introduced to slow-movers and that teachers should provide more guidance.

Schemes related to HKPTU

The reading programs and activities provided by the HKPTU are very various and comprehensive. The Reading to Learn Committee has to take into account timing and human resources for implementing those programs. It is suggested that programs less favoured by students should be cancelled. For example, the 'Best Books Countdown' can be cancelled so that more time and resources can be redirected to other reading programs.

Schemes Related to Newsletter Publication A self-evaluation has been made by the Reading to Learn Committee. It has been decided that the newsletter can also include good written works of Form 2 students and that a section on suggested readers can be included. The newsletter can also be published earlier in the year, for example, in December.

Schemes Specially Related to Reading to Learn Committee

The lunch-break reading session has taken up students' lunch period which might otherwise be spent on extra-curricular activities. In order to solve this problem and extend the reading session to Form 2 students, it is suggested that the reading sessions should be arranged in normal language lessons.

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Performance of Students

Academic Performance

In 2004, the performance of our students in the two major public examination, namely, the Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination and the Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination, can be considered as satisfactory when compared with that of all candidates in the territory as well as that of day-school candidates. The percentage of students scoring Grade E or above in the majority of

subjects attempted was higher than that of the territory average and also that of day-school candidates. A high percentage of AL graduates acquiring the minimum entrance requirement for tertiary education was also witnessed. However, there is still much room for improvement and we do admit that the number of students obtaining credits or distinction is not satisfactory. More work will be done to stretch the potential of our students so that greater improvement can be made in the coming public examinations.

Students' Physical Development

Brief Account on the Enhancement of Students' Physical Fitness

Physical Education is a compulsory subject in our school, and two periods per cycle are allocated to P.E. from Form 1 to 7. In addition to skills acquisition and training, physical fitness of students is enhanced through stretching and conditioning exercises (e.g., press-up, sit-up, and running) conducted in each P.E. lesson. Besides, students of general physical fitness and abilities are always encouraged to participate in sports-related extra-curricular activities organized by the different sports clubs. Students with better physical fitness and talents in sports are invited to join the different school teams for training and competitions.

Brief Account on Students' Performance in Sports

Our students have a very good tradition of active sports participation. Besides taking part in inter-class sports competitions and sports-related extra-curricular activities, there are more than 200 students registered each year to represent our school in inter-school sports competitions and open meets. 1. Summer Study Tour



Moral and Civic Education Committee



The theme of Moral and Civic Education Committee this year is 'Responsibility and Commitment'. For our aim to be achieved, a series of activities have been organized by four groups: Moral Education Group, Civic Education Group; Health Education Group and Environmental Protection Group.

In Moral Education Group, moral short talks have been proceeded regularly in morning assemblies. This year not only were the speeches given in Chinese but also in English as well as in Putonghua. Moreover, 4 award-winning activities were organized: The Best Sportsmanship Award, Role Model Student Award, The Best Prefect Award and The Most Commendable Child Award. The topic of Chinese Speech Contest this year is 'Responsibility'. Students can think and know more about people's role and different responsibilities through the competition.

This year, two moral talks were organized; one was the tour escort of Wing On Travel Service Ltd, Mr. Lee Siu Pong(李兆邦先生). He shared his precious experience in the tsunami on 26/12/04. The other was Professor Sung Jao Yiu Joseph (沈祖堯教授). We are honoured to invite him to be the guest for the moral talk. With the innovative introduction of real-time broadcasting system, CSK fellows have the opportunity to participate in the above-mentioned activities at the same moment. Without the collaborative support of CSK staff members, our ideas could not come into practice so smoothly. We would like to express our heartfelt thanks to them right here.

Apart from the abovementioned activities, a quiz competition and Moral & Civic Education Exhibition 2005—'Life and responsibility' were also co-organized with the other 3 groups. The "Moral & Civic Education Quiz" was held in February. The integration of multimedia in the quiz had greatly improved the perception of the audience and the atmosphere in the Finals was exciting and joyful.

Moral and Civic Education Committee

In Civic Education Group, civic talks have been proceeded regularly in morning assemblies to let CSK fellow know more about their surroundings. There were celebration for the National Day and the promising Olympics result. Besides, on EPA project design competition for junior students was also held. Topic related to civic education was selected. Under the guidance of EPA teachers, it was proceeded smoothly. What's more, a big new election and a 'Comment on Current Affairs' activities were also held to keep CSK boys concern with their surroundings. Celebrity of responsible calibre was also invited to CSK to express her views of responsibility to our F.6 students. She is Ms Choy So Yuk (蔡素玉議員).

An activity aimed at promoting anti-corruption was co-organised by our group and ICAC for form six students in March. Our students also participated the programme about national affairs 「國情國民教育計劃」. The programme included talks, project, presentation and quiz competition. Furthermore, our F.5D Tseung Wai Kit won the merit certificate in public Chinese comprehension competition 「我的驕傲」.

In Health Education Group, activities of different kinds concerning health education and health promotion were held in different periods of time. There was a Health Week in the first semester. Programmes in the Health Week included fruit selling, Happy Exercises – skipping, shuttlecock and hula-hoop, Health talks, Colouring & Slogan design competition—"Healthy Home Cooking", Healthy Menu design competition—"My Ideal Healthy Menu", Daily Healthy Routine design competition—"My Daily Healthy Routine", Chinese and English writing competitions. There were also the Board Decoration, Exhibition and control measures against mosquitoes.

In Environmental Protection Group, our students have taken part in quite a number of interschool environmental protection competitions and the results are encouraging. Three teams of our students joined the interschool display board design competition, one of the "無煙 TEEN 空" programs, co-organized by the Radio MetroShowbiz 997 and the Youth Smoking Prevention Committee to deliver the 'anti-smoking' message to the youth of the participating schools as well as the public. The creative design of our 5C team captured two grand prizes – the "Best Design Award" and the "Most popular Design Award" of the Kowloon West Division. Besides, our students have also joined the "TV Episode Design Competition for World Environment Day 2005" and the "Fifth Hong Kong Green School Award Creative Old Song New Lyrics Competition" organized by the Environmental Campaign Committee. Besides we have also held two field trips during the year with good responses.

In order to train our students to be leaders for implementing environmental programs in the school, we have joined the Student Environmental Protection Ambassador Scheme (SEPAS) since 2004. 10 students had successfully obtained the basic badge and the certificate. Another 14 students are now under training. We hope that more students will be trained under this scheme to become leaders of environmental activities in the future.



School Self-evaluation Committee

Most schools are now required to conduct school self evaluation (SSE) as required by the Education and Manpower Bureau (EMB). In order to provide the school's internal data and the "Key Performance Measures" (KPM) on school performance, the School Self-evaluation (SSE) Committee (previously called the Staff Appraisal Administrative Committee) was formed in September, 2004.

The main areas of work of the School Self-evaluation Committee are:
(1) to implement and review of the policy of staff appraisal and,

(2) to support the school in use of appropriate school self-evaluation tools.

Based on the review and evaluation of the two-year cycle staff appraisal system (2002-2004) and suggestions from the staff, a three-year cycle staff appraisal system (2004-2007) on teaching and non-teaching areas was implemented. The appraisal system is basically a formative type and the appraising process aims to help teachers to learn from each other for school development.

As discussed during the School Administrative Committee meeting on 11 September 2004, the APASO stakeholders survey (serving as follow-up work of last year's findings) would be conducted in Forms 3 and 4 on 10 May 2005 and 11 May 2005 respectively.

The committee also helped to conduct a questionnaire survey as an evaluation during the reception day for primary school visitors organized by the Union of the Kowloon City District Parent-Teacher Association on 26 February 2005 and special reception sessions for P.6 teachers and students of Chan Sui Ki Primary School on 28 February 2005 and 1 March 2005. Over 82% of visitors felt that our school was good and an average of over 67% of visitors felt that the exhibition was clear and appropriate. It was concluded that the reception day was a great success.

Because a whole-school approach self-evaluation helps bring about coherence and strength collaboration, communication and ownerships among members of the school, the committee hopes that the involvement of different stakeholders (including students, teachers and parents) can enhance school development through the internal quality assurance - school self-evaluation.


Sports Activities

The work of the Religious Education committee is the work of God. We are working with God for fulfilling the will of God.



He shared with us his experience in other schools and explained to us the rationale behind using 'Project Learning' in teaching. After his sharing, our staff members have a better understanding of 'Project Learning'. As 'Project Learning' has been implemented in our school since last year, a group of teachers in the Project Learning Committee has already gained experience in this area. Therefore, in the second part, the Project Learning Committee played a number of interesting games related to classification, concept-maps, etc. with all the staff members. The games are inspiring. They also serve as a chance for all the staff to get familiar with the actual work of leading a group of students in doing their projects. At the end, teachers in the Committee also shared their invaluable experience and feeling with us. It is expected that 'Project Learning' will be extended to more subjects so that students can learn how to organize facts, analyze data, do survey, etc.



The second Staff Development Day was held on 9th March 2005 (Wed). That day, all staff members went to the Hong Kong Exhibition and Convention Centre to attend workshops and seminars organized by the Professional Teachers' Union. Each staff member could choose which seminars they wanted to attend. However, all the workshops and seminars evolve around the theme related to the Education Reform. There are topics related to Liberal Studies, Project Learning, Parental Guidance, Crisis Management, etc. All the staff members were glad that they had the chance to take a break and join activities outside the school. Many of them also met their old friends there. They chatted and shared their experience in their work.

The third Staff Development Day is going to be held on 27th April 2005 (Wed). We will join the Catholic School Teachers' Day 2005, which is a very special day for all the Catholic schools in Hong Kong. It can be expected that staff members will enjoy.

Until May of this academic year, the discipline situation in CSK was satisfactory. To continue the task of the last school term, the board concentrated on monitoring the grooming of students and also classroom discipline. The performance of students in these two aspects was about right and there are still rooms for improvement in the future.

The records of students' minor misconducts showed similar situation compared with the previous year, and the most common misconducts were :

- (1) Failure to submit assignments
- (2) Forgetting to bring necessary materials for class
- (3) Talking in class
- (4) Lateness for school

The school, students and parents will have to put more effort into reversing the above situation.

Morning assemblies play a vital role in carrying out religious functions, enhancing moral education, making announcement and accomplishing discipline purposes. However, the assembly place for students had to be reallocated very often to cope with the progress of the school improvement project construction work. Students cooperated and adjusted well in the assemblies.

Credits had to be given to our school prefects for their contributions in various school activities, especially under the strong leadership and the whole-hearted devotion of the head prefect Liu Chun Lam (F.6B) and the vice-head prefect Wu Kai Cheong (F.6A).

In conclusion, the improvement of this academic year should be attributed to the contributions of every CSK members, the self-discipline of students and the support of parents.



In the second year of running of the Reading to Learn Committee, there were programs which aimed to arouse and promote students' interest in reading; to help them develop into self-motivated and independent learners; and to lead them to develop an affection and appreciation towards different kinds of writers and reading materials.

The results of various programs were overwhelmingly encouraging. All Form 1 and 2 students achieved the status of *Green Badges* and fulfilled the preliminary requirements as stipulated in the point-system specification of the Chinese Reading Scheme of the HKPTU. The committee also organized a bookmark design competition for all Form 1 to 2 students. Students had to design bookmarks on popular books recommended by the HKPTU. The responses were very positive and students enjoy the drawing activities very much. There were also visits to university libraries and bookshops and morning reading sessions were also arranged to all Form 1 to 2 students. Through these activities, not only could students enjoy reading, but also they could learn how reading materials were produced, delivered, classified and kept in various locations readily accessed by them.

On 21st April, 2005, Mr. Tso Chip, a renowned writer, a columnist and a radio news commentator, came to our school and gave a talk titled **The Joy of Reading in the Eyes of Tsao Chip**. A lot of students engaged into the talk and memorable words and maxims were embraced by our CSK boys. In addition to the talk, a book display was also held on that day. Many students bought their favourite books and they also asked for an autograph from their renowned guest speaker. In short, the events were full of joys and students expressed heartfelt thanks to the committee.

Abstract of the Quality Assurance Inspection Report

1. Introduction

1.1. Background

A Quality Assurance Inspection was conducted in the school during 11 to 20 December

The key issues for action being identified and stipulated in the inspection report were as follows:

I. In the area of strengthening school management and organization

II. In the area of enhancing the effectiveness of teaching and learning

1.2. Inspection Methodology

The follow-up inspection was conducted from 28 May 2004 to 1 June 2004 to review the school's follow-up measures and progress on the key issues for action.

2. School's Improvement Work

- 2.1 The SMC had taken a more proactive role in supporting, guiding, guiding, monitoring and evaluating the development of the school. It had expanded the membership of the SMC= to include representatives of teachers, old boys and parents.
- 2.2 The school had re-organized its management structure and establish a clearly defined framework of duties and responsibilities, and a clear line of reporting for the different level levels and functions of its teaching staff. With the new se-up of the management structure, the performance of subject departments, committees and teachers could possibly be monitored and evaluated.
- 2.3 To make the school more effective, it was necessary to have in place a structured mechanism for the annual cycle of planning, monitoring of implementation measures, self-evaluating and reporting. Such an effective school self-evaluation (SSE) mechanism was yet to be developed to ensure the continuous improvement of the different programmes of the school.
- 2.4 The school had set up a transparent staff appraisal system to enable due recognition being given to well-performing staff, and under-performing staff being held accountable. The staff appraisal system could also be used for the purpose of staff development and serve as one of the criteria for promotion.
- 2.5 Panel chairpersons had played a more prominent leadership and monitoring role in the planning and development of their respective subjects.

Abstract of the Quality Assurance Inspection Report

- 2.6 A mechanism to monitor and evaluate class teaching and the implementation of the curriculum, assignments and assessment policies was established at subject levels.
- 2.7 Teachers frequently asked questions to promote teacher-student interaction and to motivate students to learn, but a repertoire of teaching strategies was not commonly used to develop students' capabilities, particularly generic learning skills, such as communication, problem solving, self-learning, etc.
- 2.8 Teachers had started to pay attention to the marking of assignments and provision of feedback to help students learn more effectively.
- 2.9 The school had laid more emphases upon teachers' professional development and encouraged teachers to keep themselves abreast of the recent development in education and pedagogy.

3. Concluding Remarks

A Quality Assurance Inspection was conducted in the school in December, 2000. The key issues for action being identified and stipulated in the inspection report were, on the whole, properly addressed by the school. Most issues were appropriately attended to in the post-quality assurance inspection action plan formulated by the school. Preparatory committees were set up to devise feasible improvement plans to strengthen the management and organization of the school on one hand, and to enhance the effectiveness of teaching and learning on the other. With the involvement of related staff members in the implementation of follow-up measures, some notable improvements had been made accordingly. These included the development of a proper management structure with clearly defined duties and responsibilities; the expansion the membership of the SMC to include representatives of teachers, old boys and parents; the setting up of a transparent staff appraisal system with emphases on staff development and the promotion of the quality of learning and teaching.







舊生王星——學習辯論思維

學習辯論思維 提升頭腦智慧 享受訓練過程 建立師生關係 -- 與康寶泉副校長相處點滴

王星 1998 年預科畢業生



筆者於去年年底得悉母校副校長康寶泉老師將於04/05學年結束後 榮休。對我來說,這消息可算是悲喜參半。悲者,是我校將缺失一位經 驗豐富、熱心教學的好老師;喜者,是康副校終可釋下重負,好好享受 退休後的生活。筆者受康副校的影響甚深,他發掘了我的長處,令我擇 業時決定走上律師之路。於逢母校之邀,願執筆寫下我與康副校相處的 點滴,好讓讀者對這位才高八斗,學問淵博的良師有更深的瞭解。

總覺得康副校與我很有緣份。記得1993年8月,我由一所中文中學申請轉到陳瑞祺唸中三,當時給我面試的正是他。我還依稀記得他當時面部沒帶一點笑容,只是嚴肅謹慎地查問我學習的情況,尤其關心我由中中轉讀英中的適應問題。大家談了好一陣子後他決定取錄了我。後來得知康副校之所以取錄我乃因我帶了點兒小伙子的傲氣。也可能亦因這點兒傲氣,令我被康副校賞識一成為1996年度代表學校的辯論隊隊長。

記得1996年我校舉行班際水運會之際,<u>康</u>副校在泳池邊跟我細訴本校辯論隊的往績。他說多年來一直致力培訓我校中文辯論隊,令我校在校際辯論比賽中屢獲殊榮。而傳統上歷屆辯論員舊生亦會義不容辭地在百忙中抽空協助新一屆的辯論員,充分發揮了陳瑞祺學生互助互愛的精神。但同時他卻帶了點兒失望的表情微笑道:「我校辯論隊似乎有一個『宿命』,就是無論隊員表現如何出色也只能屈居亞軍,從未嘗拿過冠軍的!」

之後,他便邀請我加入新一屆的辯論隊。對於康副校的邀請真令我有點兒受寵若驚。因為當時的我只是一名很普通的學生,對辯論一無所知。能獲邀代表學校參加辯論比賽,實在愧不敢當。然而內心卻是喜孜孜的,因我很想嘗試為我校打破歷屆只能屈居亞軍這「宿命」。於是我便毅然答應了,還找來幾位平日喜歡「包頸」的同學一同參加,就這樣組成了1996年度的辯論隊。

辯論是一門學問。它綜合了演講、論說、游說、邏輯及表演的技巧。當時的我對於上述各項可謂一竅不通。康副校便耐心地逐一教導我。每當我們一收到各場比賽的辯題後,便會跟康副校討論正反雙方的論點及論據。他常常強調他的「必勝方程式」一立論清晰,以數據、名人語錄、權威評論等作支持,以比喻、反問協助論說。他要求我們在每場比賽中均須具備以上各項表現。



每逢比賽前,我們都會先預備講稿,在康副校及其他老師面前演講。我還清楚記得康副校他那典型的「皺眉」及「搖頭」樣子。他說:「評判皺眉便代表他感到困惑或不明白辯論員在說什麼,而評判搖頭則表示他不同意你的看法,這樣便會失去不少分數。所以說話的每一詞,每一語都必須經過仔細思考,多一點不好,少一點也嫌不夠。」要令康副校既不皺眉,也不搖頭,我們方可算初步過關。

除了內容充實及用詞精闢外,他還要求我們發音準確、音調和諧。這項訓練對我來說不可謂不困難,因我天生聲線不好,加上有極重的懶音,實在難以在短時間內糾正過來。但康副校逐字逐句耐心地教我發音,他好像教嬰孩說話一樣,要我跟他面對面看著他的口形發音。我還記得有一次我們竟用了整整一個午飯時間來練習「香港」這兩個字的正確發音呢!他又說我說話時語氣太硬太快,不夠自然,建議我在適當的時候,例如句尾加上助語詞,令聽眾聽起來感到舒服自然。

對於辯與論的分配, <u>康</u>副校也有他獨特的見解。他說辯論員要先準備好自己的論點, 令內容充實,不應花太多時間在不必要的辯駁上。反而應在適當的時候,用自己的論點來反駁對方。他常控制著我們反駁對方的時間,尤其是在初賽階段—在我們尚未有經驗的時候,他只容許我們反駁一至兩點,而多用些時間強自己的論點。我有時會覺得他這做法有點兒保守,但事實卻證明了他的見解沒錯。

最明顯的例子是在第四場比賽,在這場比賽中我方三位辯論員的臨場表演均大失水準,而其中一位更因太怯場以致足足有三十秒呆站在台上不發一言。比賽結束時,我們都失望地打定輸數,主持卻出乎意外地宣佈我校勝出!評判給我們的評語是內容結實、論點清晰、論據充足一這不正正是康副校的「必勝方程式」!

1996年12月,我們嬴了準決賽,順利進級到總決賽。我們知道要為學校取得歷史性的冠軍便非全力以赴不可。我感到康副校對此事亦非常重視和緊張,我們亦不想令他失望。然而,這次辯論隊與康副校對辯題的理解及應採用的立場竟有嚴重的分岐。當時康副校及數位舊生均建議我們採用甲立場,但我們卻認為應採用乙立場。

當大家都那麼重視這場比賽時,我們所承受的壓力可真不少。一方面我們很想接納前輩的意見,可是我們卻無法說服自己他們的說法是對的。經過一番商議後,我們便於比賽前一天的清晨,寫了一封信給康副校。這封信的內容大意是這樣的:我們知道康副校及眾師兄的智慧比我們高,經驗亦比我們豐富,因此所提出的立場理應比我們好;可是,我們真的不太懂事,無法接納該立場,若果我們連自己都無法說服,又怎能說服他人呢?

過了不久,<u>康</u>副校前來課室找我們,我們懷著戰戰兢兢的心情面對他,他溫柔地告訴我們他不會給我們任何壓力,著我們只管放心地採用自己認為有信心的辯法好了!他尊重我們,並接納我們的意見,這使我們放下了心頭大石,全心全意地準備比賽。

還有特別值得一提的是:我們勝出比賽的其中一個主要原因是我們得到很多師生的支持。初賽的時候每場平均約有五十名師生到場為我們打氣,準決賽則約有一百名,而總決賽那天,更有三百名師生呢!是他們的支持化為辯論員的動力。我們知道所以如此,康副校著實出了不少力積極宣傳是次辯論比賽,努力游說老師同學們捧場。

最緊張的時刻一總決賽終於來臨了,我們在師生熱烈的掌聲下踏上辯論台。經過雙方六位辯論 員激烈的辯論後,由五位學者及專業人士組成的評判團最終宣佈我校獲得第十二屆全港校際中文辯論 比賽冠軍。我們終於打破了「宿命」,取得最後勝利。當我們上台領獎時,全場師生一起喊叫著 「CSK CSK」,令我深深感受到團結的力量。表面看來,出賽的只有我們三位。然而實際上全體師 生均在參予這場比賽。

比賽訓練的過程中,我一星期會見<u>康</u>副校數次。見面多了便很自然地跟他建立了一份深厚的感情。這種感情很難形容一像父子間的親情?卻又沒有那樣嚴肅;像朋友間的友情?卻又不是那樣隨便。我很尊敬他,他有老師的威嚴,但卻絕不專制獨裁、恃老賣老。我衷心感謝他,不但因他對我諄諄善誘的教導,更因為他給我機會,讓我認識了自己的長處和短處,從而影響了我在大學的選系及日後的職業前途。

2004年,我正式被舉薦為香港高等法院執業律師。典禮在金鐘高等法院舉行。我邀請了康副校和師母一同前來參加。因為我覺得這份成就是康副校賜給我的,我很想和他一同分享這份喜悅。典禮後我們到茶樓吃飯,跟他相聚的一刻真有說不完的話題一學校、工作、生活、戀愛真是無所不談。我很享受這種亦師亦友的關係,亦相信這種關係會一直維持下去。

嘗聞一句話,願以此作結: 「當山花爛漫的時候,請勿忘春風春雨; 在田野豐收的季節,請勿忘播種的人們; 師恩難忘,銘記於心!」

舊生樊仲然——致師弟的信

親愛的師弟們:

我踏上大學的學習旅程,已經兩年了。在大學裏,學習是非常自由的:沒有人阻礙你,也沒有人強迫你,除了你自己。這跟中小學時很不同。基於不計食宿,我每年都用了四萬多的學費,而家境又不富有,做兼職又賺得不多,所以在衡量過利害後,我選擇以學習來賺回應得的。不過我越是學習,我越是覺得後悔,原因在於我發覺在大學學到的很多事情,其實是可以在中小學那時學到的。換句話說,因為我以前的無知與懶惰,導致我在大學裏要花很多時間去追回,代價除了兼職的金錢和經驗,還有娛樂的時間、休息的時間、拍拖的時間,還有其他很多很多……這真的很昂貴!因此,我的朋友們,以下我想將我覺得在中學時有用的科目告訴你們,並希望你們可以在入大學前先把這些做好。那我想你們在入學後,可以有更多的時間去做其他有意義的事情。

數學:推理與批判的本源,理性的開端。

這科可能是眾多科目中,我曾認為是最不切實際的一科。我在中學時鑽研它,純粹是為了顯示自己的小聰明,最後,從中只得到了驕傲與自滿,回想起來也使我汗顏。可是,現在我覺得它重要性超然,使我不得不首先論述。

今年是我教補習的第五個年頭了。經過長期的觀察,我發現學不好數學的人,往往會有著兩種共通的特質:第一,他們做練習傾向求答案正確而不求推理正確,導至推理能力較弱。第二,他們不求甚解的態度導致批判性較弱。推理與批判離不開真理,準確來說應是類真理,因為我們不能絕對地証實真理。它們之間關係大概是如此的:類真理描述真理,類真理推理出更多類真理,而批判挑戰類真理,使類真理更接近真理。簡單來說,推理能力是一種重要的學習能力,而批判能力則為過濾低質素類真理的重要能力。如果這兩種能力偏低,則會較難明白與創造新的知識,也可能會浪費很多時間在低質素知識上。學好數學是智力與效率的關鍵,它的目的並不單單是計算答案與求分數那麼膚淺!精於數學思維的人,對各術科會有舉一反三的能力,學習速度高而難度卻低。相反,輕視數學的人,起初應該不會發現有任何問題,但後來或許會漸漸發現自己學習很多科目的天份都不好,甚至會懷疑自己是否讀書的材料。起初一點態度上的不同,推而廣之的影響卻是無比的。現在我們正在人生起點後不久,如果之前做得不好,請盡快改過吧!

中文: 溝通的藝術, 智慧的傳承。

首先我要表明,其實我並沒有資格談論中文,因為我從小學至高考的中文成績都很差的。我相信這是我懶惰和自負的性格,促使我從小便形成拒絕背誦自己不認同與不明白的字句的學習態度。久而久之,我也形成了把學習中文相等於背誦與不求甚解的偏見,大大阻礙了我在中文上的修養。回想起來,真使我十分遺憾!因此,以下我想以自己作反面教材,希望大家可以從中得到啟發,不要重蹈覆轍。

我的中文程度從小就很差,或者應該說我的中文語文能力與我的中國文化程度一直也不好。他們很大程度地先後帶給了我認知上與智慧上的兩種劣勢。中文語文能力差,對於一個土生土長的中國人或許是一個矛盾的概念。你或會問:我們不正是每天說著流利的中文嗎?我們的中文應該是絕好的了!從有記憶時開始,我已經一直有這種想法了。直至上了大學,得到了教訓,我才真的體驗到中文的力量。畢業後,我成為了中大中醫的學生,學習由中國文化孕育而成的中醫理論。在欠缺一個好的中文能力條件下,使我在閱讀、理解及欣賞中醫哲理時,感到很大的困難,並使我跟其他同學的學習能力相差甚遠。前後我足足花了一年多的時間才使我對中醫有所啟發。這又是一個因準備不足,導致浪費學費與時間的一個經驗了。

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不過,中醫畢竟是一門專業,或許與你關係不大,並不能說服你學習中文。然而,我提出的中醫,其實只是「中文功用」的冰山一角。中文是一種經過幾千年進化而成的語言,當中蘊含著無數古人的經驗與智慧的痕跡。細讀中文,可以學到處世之道、養生之道與管理之道,甚至上至天文,下至地理。牛頓曾說:「要是我看得比別人遠,我便是站在巨人的膊頭上。」古人已經鋪好了通往更高智慧的康莊大道,我們若輕視它而選擇自己創出新智慧,將會困難重重!因此,學習中文,其實就是繼承中國古代智慧的一種方法。順帶一提,西方社會已不斷在研究中國的智慧,在哲學、醫學與管理等領域已經從中有所體會,有些更把知識實行商業化,賣到全球,包括我們的祖國。我不知道你會否跟我有同感:我總是不習慣別人拿了我辛苦得來的東西,再用錢賣給我。一方面我會覺得不太甘心,另一方面我也會對自己不先好好運用那東西而感到慚愧。

總括而言,溝通只是中文最基本的功能,如果我們因為能說流利的中文,寫通順的中文文章, 就斷言自己中文能力好,實在是以管窺天,是對中國文化遺產的一種浪費!中文內含大智慧,學習中 文使你可以獲得快樂、健康、事業等等的啟發,而且加以利用後,還可以賣得錢。現在不學好,難道 我們以後要購買英文書來學?

英文:全球化的鎖匙

跟中文一樣,我也是不夠資格說什麼的,語文能力的確是我的死穴,從小就是很差。我接著談論的,將會只是我在學習英語的體會,以及發覺缺乏英語能力的問題後,所獲得的一點感想。

我學習英文,其實始於在母校期間,四年級的下學期。當時為了貫徹自己自負的性格,也為了證實自己的小聰明,我試著挑戰老師提出寫作議論文很難有好成績的言論,堅決地選擇寫作議論文。密集自修的過程是痛苦的。半年後,成績雖有進步,但其速度卻是強差人意。我不明白為何同班的某些同學根本不用學習,分數也可以比我高出五成。這一再體現起點的一點不同的巨大影響。最後,我的英語還算可以馬虎過關。

跟中文或其他語言一樣,英語其實是思想具體化的一種。西方社會暫時在世界上佔著領先的經濟與技術地位。缺乏足夠的英語能力,學習西方智慧時就像隔了一重白紗一樣,看不清,也看不準。這方面,我在閱讀醫學及其他學科的英文書籍的時候,深深明白其困難所在。另外,在多方面全球化,或者說是西方化的趨勢下,英文有很大可能成為世界通用語言。對於英文的地立,我預期未來在各科中將會不停提高;而在社會上,擁有良好英語能力將會由一個優點變成一個必要條件。

雖然我對英語並沒有對中文那種對民族的感情,但我獲得的知識與啟發,很大部分是來源於西方的偉人們的。也就是說,以前在中學期間苦練英語,正間接地改寫著我的人生。另外,學習西方人的智慧後,再反思中國文化,或會有更深的體會;也可能在知識相互的對照與融合後,能夠產生出新的智慧。中國人學習西方知識,西方人學習中國知識,這個巨輪已經運轉多年了。近二十多年,中國經濟與技術的崛起,學貫中西的知識分子實在功不可沒。在我們眼前,中文有一種智慧,英文也有一種智慧。既然學習中文是如此重要,英文又怎能被忽視呢?

順帶一提,我覺得學習英語有如學習游泳:單看理論難以學懂,單做練習難以學好。

幸福的人:「出得黎行,預左要還。」

我的朋友們,我們真是幸福的人啊!我們是香港人:以富有程度來看,香港在世界前百分之五的位置。近年香港的確發生了很多變化,或許使你對香港人的身份不再自豪。然而,當你試想著世界上有哪一個地方,可以像香港那樣,擁有學術與言論自由,對中國與西方的資訊與知識隨手可得,賦稅低的優勢?我們也是學生,而且是全職學生。面對著學業問題、前途問題及其他各方面的壓力,或許使你感到作為學生並不好過。然而,你又試想,社會上有哪些人,可以像全職學生那樣,擁有更多



的自由時間,更多的假期,更多學習機會,更多娛樂,更多種種的好處呢?最後,我們還是陳瑞 祺的學生。我想你們或許已經明白身為陳瑞祺學生的各種好處,但我還想提出一個優點,平時或 許大家會比較少聽聞的:陳瑞祺的學生,是全港數一數二最少功課壓力的學生,也就即是空餘時 間最充足的一群。陳瑞祺這種學習環境深深體現出老子「無為而治」、「無用乃有大用」等深層 哲學思想,是不可多得的大優勢!若不身在其中,實在難以明白的!

不過,你們其實知道幸福不是必然,也不是永久,而我想你們也能預期我會這樣說,但我希 望你能耐心看畢這部份。因為我覺得讀畢後,或者可使你增加學習的動力與效率……我們現在可 以享盡天時、地利、人和的時機,擁有世界極少有的優勢,其實背後同時也背負著不同形式的壓 力,不知你們有否同感。我不知我的想法是否正確。若有機會的話,我真希望老師們可以幫助我 再闡述這個重要的課題。首先,我們身為中國人,正如上文所說,其實正背負著繼承中國智慧的 重要責任。你可知道,建立智慧是需要千秋萬代無數古人艱辛努力與碰著運氣得來的,失傳智慧 則只需要一代就夠了。第二,我們是香港人,是世界最富有的人們之一,是世界最少苦難的一 群,並享受著歷史上罕見的太平。不知道你們能否想像戰亂、飢餓、疾病與災害的滋味是怎樣 的,單是想像,的確已使我毛骨悚然!我們正是世界上最有能力改善人類整體幸福的一群,如果 我們稍為克服懶惰與自私,則可能已經可救活地球另一方一家五口的性命;相反,如果我們接受 自己的無知與任性,則會喪失了請救同類的機會。這是間接害人的行為!這是機會成本的簡單概 念。我是十分認同的,我也相信你也會認同。第三,我們是學生,而且還是陳瑞祺的學生,是社 會上最空閒的人們。教育開支是社會支出最大的一環,重要性不亞於性命猶關的醫療開支。若然 不珍惜現在的時機,不履行自己應有的責任,我們便不是一個好的公民,而我也希望你們能夠面 對每日在醫院逝世的死者們。第四,我們大家也是家中的兒子,未來也將會建立自己的家庭。從 古至今,回饋父母與成家立室,都是男子漢的重要任務。然而,我想不到如果現在不努力,未來 怎可以突然把他們做得好。如果你知道的話,請你告訴我。最後,如果你平時有照鏡的話,你在 鏡中看到的,正是人的模樣。不知你們是否跟我一樣:我是十分留意自己的,並總是想打扮著, 希望吸引女生們的視線。可是,不知你會否跟我有同樣的情況,即若我說謊或逃避責任後,我覺 得無論我怎樣努力打扮,在鏡中看到的自己,依然是一個沒有自信,眼神閃縮的樣子,我自己也 覺得很不吸引了。相反,當我盡了本份後,就算穿著簡單,不作聲響,我也可以堂堂正正地正視 任何人,而且沒有一點羞恥之心。去到一個界限,我想我們或可逃避一切外在的評價、壓力與負 擔,但無論我們怎樣努力,卻絕不能避自己的眼神……

我本來還想論述很多科目,包括生物、化學、物理、會計、經濟與統計等中學科目的重要性,也想談論關於大學某些重要學科如投資,醫學、政治、心理學、認知科學、哲學、網絡理論與教育等的內容,但因為我的語文能力差,寫出以上的文字實在已經使我感到非常吃力。另外,我也怕因為我的文筆不好而使你對學習感到煩嫌,所以我決定寫到這裏為止。若校報會批準的話,我希望明年可有機會再寫一封信給你們,再淺談我在大學的一點啟發,也希望我的信件,能夠記載在校刊內,供以後的師弟們閱讀。我分享知識的方法跟大學不同,你是不用給我學費的……因為我已經「預左要還」! 希望你可以明白我,並早點做好準備! 最後,我感謝我的啟蒙老師,鄧豪達老師!後會有期!

「閱讀的樂趣——陶傑的閱讀世界」



陶先生的話共可分五個重點。

二零零五年四月二十一日,香港著名文化人陶傑先生蒞臨本校 禮堂作演講。是次講題為「閱讀的樂趣 --- 陶傑的閱讀世界」。

陶傑,原名曹捷,出生於香港,畢業於英國華威大學的英國文學系。陶傑曾於英國廣播公司任職達八年。陶傑現職主要是在報紙上寫專欄及主持電台節目。陶傑有多部著名作品,如<<香港這杯雞尾酒>>、<<權力的地球>>等。他的<<泰晤士河畔>>一文更獲得第三屆香港中國文學雙年。

這次的演講分為演說和問答這兩個環節。在演說這個環節裡,

第一,閱讀文字的重要性。陶傑先生一開始就指出,現在很多青少年人都患上了「閱讀遲緩症」--閱讀只看圖畫,一看兩頁文字就會頭暈。陶先生說,圖畫和文字就如肉類和蔬果,又如陰陽,必須在兩者中取得平衡。要醫治「閱讀遲緩症」, 陶先生建議同學們先讀一些多插圖的圖書,然後才看一些插圖比例較少的圖書,循序漸進,才進入一個文字的世界。陶傑先生認為「嘴嚼」文字後而形成的圖畫比別人畫出來的更有趣更能令自己獲益。畢竟自己嘴嚼食物好過別人將食物咬碎後再餵自己吃。陶傑先生還勸大家不要當文字是敵人,要嘗試了解它,走進書本的世界。

第二,如何選擇圖書。陶先生認為選書的原則有三: 一、要有趣。作者能以好的文筆將大家不陌生的題材有趣生動地寫出來。二、要合眼緣。擇書有時候就如擇女友,見到有吸引的封面,或者是一段非常吸引的情節,一見鍾情的,不妨進入其中。 三、要淺白。好書文字不必深,現在英文出版商的趨勢是用一些淺白的文字,將深刻的道理表達出來。

第三,好書好句。陶傑先生是次還帶了兩本書介給同學們,都是用很淺明的英文寫成,一本是 << The Reason Of Things>>,另一本是 << The Meaning Of Things>>。 陶傑先生還將 << The Reason Of Things>>> 裡面其中的一句與大家分享---「It is useless for the sheep to pass resolutions in favour of vegetarianism while the wolf is of a different opinion.」(就算一群羊通過決議要當素食者,但當狼持相反意見,羊所做的也是沒有用的。)這句巧用動物世界裡羊與狼關係來比喻人類社會上的權力問題。陶傑先生舉了一個例子。「假如所有學生說我們要放學,我們一個也不會來陶傑的講座,但老師、校長說不行,你地還是要來聽的。在這裡,老師、校長就是狼。」陶傑先生說那句話令他增長了智慧,學多了知識,並對做人處世有更深的認識。

第四,閱讀三原則。陶傑先生認為讀一本書要帶給他三種好處:一、Knowledge(知識)。如閱讀<<The Reason Of Things>>就令陶傑先生知道了哪人寫哪書,以及那人說了些什麼說話。二、Education(教育)。剛才那句話---「It is useless for the sheep to pass resolutions in favour of vegetarianism while the wolf is of a different opinion.」令到陶傑先生上了一節很寶貴的課,對他有所啟發,令他聯想到伊拉克戰爭和政府釋法。三、Entertainment(娛樂)。那一書那一句寫得非常生動有趣,令人一看不禁笑了出來,很富娛樂性。

第五,閱讀的好處。閱讀除了可以增長知識,豐富內涵,令人變得更聰明外,還有「美容」功效。「腹有詩書氣自華」。陶傑先生說,一個人閱讀多了,那人身上自然會有一種氣派,處處表現出自信。一個人也會因讀書而在行為舉止上變得規矩,表現出風度。陶傑先生打趣說,很多時候異性也會被這種「書香」吸引住。

問答環節。

問 1: 外國閱讀風氣旺盛,但香港學生缺乏閱讀習慣。有什麼方法可以提高自己閱讀的興趣?

答: 閱讀風氣其實同社會風氣有著很密切的關係。當看見周圍的人都在閱讀時,為了感覺自己是社會的一份子,你也會拿起書閱讀。在香港,整體上缺乏閱讀風氣,各大媒體也在間接向大家灌輸一些錯誤的觀念---只要夠膽,樣子夠英俊、漂亮,便能賺到很多錢。但那只是適用於部份人。香港作為一個國際城市,要提升競爭力,不能靠那些灌輸錯誤觀念的媒體。當社會上充滿這些愚昧、無知的人,如果我是你們,我會覺得開心,因為只要我看過一本書,便能比別人優勝,對於將來找工作有優勢。香港是一個功利的社會,我就從功利的角度去講閱讀的功能。大家不能因社會沒閱讀風氣就放棄閱讀。

問 2: 陶傑先生你創作的泉源來自哪裡?

答: 創作寫作主要是看得書多,再加上敏銳的觀察力,創作靈感便到處也可找到。例如我今天踏進陳瑞祺(喇沙)書院,看見同學們深紅色的毛衣,便有寫作題材。大家有沒有問過校長毛衣為什麼是深紅色?深紅色有什麼意思?深紅色代表什麼精神?深紅色與鮮紅色有什麼分別?將毛衣由深紅色改為鮮紅色是否適當?大家又會否穿著?如果不穿著的話,那為什麼?這裡面包含著很多知識。這裡面也涉及了顏色心理學。這是一門非常有趣的學科。這科一點也不深。什麼是顏色心理學?例如麥當奴快餐店的招牌是紅色底加黃色「M」字。紅色和黃色最能刺激天真的小孩的食慾。人最能在街上見到麥當奴快餐店的招牌,因為紅色的波長最長,最能刺激人的瞳孔。小孩子便拖著父母入內進膳,父母只有乖乖地付鈔。麥當奴快餐店就是這樣發達的。這就是寫作的題材。創作的題材哪裡都有,就如街上有很多鈔票,問題是你見到與否,拾到與否。

是次講座很成功,師生們對這次講座都有很高的評價。

陶傑專訪

01. 問:對於被稱為「才子」,你喜歡嗎?你有什麼看法?

答: 才子之名不是我說的,是人家說的,我不相信,並沒有這個資格有「才子」這個稱號。我不是太喜歡被人稱為才子,不過也沒辦法。這些是人家加下來的Label(標籤)。可能香港沒有才學的人太多,而有才學的人則太少,以致有些人會說得誇張一點。古時中國的才子在琴、棋、書、畫四方面樣樣皆通,樣樣精。這四大才藝之中,其中之「書」就略知一二,不過我只是懂得寫作而

03. 問:你的處世之道是什麼?

答:處世之道是一個很大的題目。最重要的是鍥而不捨,一邊做人,一邊學東西,要虛懷若谷,要有原則,要盡量吸收知識,又要有自己的主見,對一切東西要努力爭取,但是爭取到就最好,爭取不到就不要放在心上。

04. 問:你對生死的看法是怎樣的?

答:哈(冷笑)!生死是命運安排的。生與死這些大的關口,都是命中注定。並不像你今天放學後去哪一間茶餐廳去喝一杯奶茶般簡單。大的抉擇在上帝手裡,而小的抉擇、中的抉擇就留給了你。但有些時候,中型的抉擇,你以為選擇權在你手中,不過二十年之後,你回顧的時候就會發現,有「人」已替你作出了抉擇。所以生死這回事,尤其是在年輕的時候不要想得太多。最重要的是要充實你自己生命的那一部分。

05. 問:你有沒有最討厭看哪一種類型的書?

答:最討厭嗎?最討厭是看到文章中的中文寫得不好,例如:強詞奪理、邏輯混亂、陳腔濫調那一類的書籍就是。

06. 問:如果青少年喜歡看一些「八卦」雜誌或者漫畫,你有什麼看法?

答:這些書最好不要看,它們就好比薯片這般的零食,不可以當主餐。你看「八卦」雜誌了解社會,但是 太年輕的時候沒有分辦能力,應該把時間花在有建設性的閱讀方面。

07. 問:你如何在創作及市場需求尋找平衡點?

答:好的創作就一定受歡迎,受人歡迎的就是市場,能夠打動很多人的,有共鳴的就是市場,所以不需要隨波逐流。

08. 問:最後,請問陶先生近期有什麼計劃?

答:寫文章、電影劇本等。



駐校社工羅明暉先生專訪



羅明暉先生,是香港明愛的社工。曾經接見、幫助不同需要的人士,如囚犯、青少年、及有家庭問題的人。後於二零零零年到我校當社工,代替因事離開的阮姑娘。同學跟羅先生時常閒談,大家又知道他的一些鮮為人知的過去、想法嗎?現在就讓大家進入羅先生的思想領域吧!

在訪問當天,記者們最感興趣便是羅先生當社工的原因,因為當社工可謂對自己的一大挑戰。原來在當時的環境及制度下,他選讀了好幾門擅長的科目,科科皆精,找工作並不難。後來 獲派社工系,完成課程後便朝著這方向前進。

他加入陳瑞祺這個家庭後,從同學身上看到時下年青人的影子,認為時下年青人在「對與錯」 之間的價值觀分歧甚大。因為他們永遠認為別人是錯的,自己永遠是對的,「時常抵賴」已成他 們的習慣。從前的年青人卻認為自己永遠是錯,跟現在的年青人,完全不同。因此,羅先生認為, 最重要是年青人應從事物中平衡「公平」及「公道」兩者。

他更認為,時下年青人,思想上存在灰色地帶,這是教育制度的問題,填鴨式的教育方法沒有訓練年青人的獨立思考能力。結果,年青人喜歡附和別人,即「跟風」,他們在思想上迷失,出現矛盾的現狀。「跟風」這情況同時出現於年青人的兩性觀念下,現在的年青人只會吹嘘自己的性經驗。

駐校社工羅明暉先生專訪



當記者問及羅先生對中學生談戀愛的看法時,他則表現出一副輕鬆的樣子,表示在不影響學業及身心的情況下,是沒有問題的。但他奉勸同學一句,應該擴闊社交圈子,多結識異性,以免長大後不懂跟異性相處。原來,羅先生也有感性的一面,眼看著一個血氣方剛的男孩子,看見同學們失戀的經歷,少不免會勾起他傷心的回憶,但他似乎有所保留,沒有跟記者分享。

那麼,羅先生每天面對著如此大的挑戰及壓力,又會如釋放壓力呢?原來也不外乎聽古典音樂,或與朋友傾訴,抒發情緒。原來閱讀也能替他驅走壓力,如著名心理學家,佛洛依德所著的書。

最後,羅先生以一言來告誠同學,「火燒功德林」,即建立一切是十分艱難的,但要破壞,卻 十分容易。他希望同學做人必須踏實,不要過於浮誇,人生的道路自然會變得簡單。

- 6. A parent had kindly made long-sleeved T-shirts in his factory so that we had a common "signature": 笑行江西 (Literally means we walk in Jiangxi with laughter).

Indeed, the trip was memorable and we all walked in Jiangxi with laughter for those five days.

Inter-class Science Quiz

Science has a close relationship with us. It can improve our standard of living. In order to make students become more interested in science and have a deeper understanding about science, the Interclass Science Quiz was held by the Science Society.

The Inter-class Science Quiz provides an opportunity for students to acquire more knowledge of science. The Junior Final and the Senior Final were held on 11th November, 2004 and 12th November, respectively.

Each class has to send at least 3 representatives to the quiz. Before the final, participants competed in the heat. The 3 classes which got the highest marks in the heat entered the final.

When the Science Quiz Final was about to begin, some of the competitors on the stage seem very nervous while the audience were getting very excited and some even shouted to support their own class representatives.

The Senior Final was divided into 3 parts. In the first part, students were required to select and answer a set of questions out of 3. The second part was the case-study section. Each class was given 3 minutes to prepare and 3 minutes to answer the question. Since each class had to prepare an answer and present it to the judges and audience, it was the most difficult part in the quiz. Lastly, it came to the most stressful yet exciting section ${}^{\circ}V$ the quick response section. They needed to give accurate answers quickly. Each question carried 30 marks and 10 marks were deducted from the total score if any team gave a wrong answer, so this part was really important and could determine which class the winner was.

All 3 classes did well. The champion of the Junior Section was 3B and that of the Senior Section was 5E.

Science is very important to us. It can help us to solve problems of different aspects. The Science Quiz is a good activity for us to test how much we have learnt about science.

Sports Report

The Inter-class Swimming Gala 2004-2005 was held on 21st September, 2004 (Tuesday) at Tai Wan Shan Swimming Pool this year. We had comparatively more C Grade entries, and most of the winners could achieve the HKSSF standards. It seemed that our team members had greater improvements in the Freestyle events. Wong Lit Ken (6B) broke the A Grade 50 m, 100 m, and 200 m Freestyle records, while Chan Chun Yeung (4D) and Wong Fei Young (2C) broke the records for the B and C Grade 50 m Freestyle, respectively. Seven schools came for the 4 x 50 m Invitation Freestyle Relay. Eventually, St. Joseph's College took the first place and also broke the record set by La Salle College in 1999.

Although most of our swimmers achieved standards in the Inter-school Swimming Championships, not many of them could enter the Finals. Some of the finalists had also dropped back from their heat rankings. Individual medals were only obtained by Wong Lit Ken (6B), Chan Chun Yeung (4D), and Cheung Tsz Kit (τ E). We had three relay teams in the Finals, and our C Grade and B Grade teams took the τ st and τ places in the 4 x 50 m Medley Relay, respectively. For the team results, our B Grade team was τ and our Overall position was τ



The number of entries for the Inter-class Cross Country was a new record again this year. The race was held on 28th September, 2004 (Friday) with a total of 306 finishers, which include ten teachers and office staff (Mr. T. S. Wong, Mr. W. K. Wong, Mr. C. T. Leung, Mr. Y. C. Chu, Mr. K. C. Cheng, Ms. K. M. Chiu, Mr. S. L. Ting, Ms. K. Y. Leung, Ms. M. Y. Chan, and Ms. Y. Y. Lam). The results were also encouraging, particularly for the A Grade.

The Inter-school Cross Country Championships was held in Hong Kong Golf Club again this year. Although the C and B Grade team results were not very good, Lai Kit Ting (1B) and Yip Wai Hong (3D) were 4^{th} and 8^{th} in the C and B Grade races, respectively. Our A Grade team did much better on the average and took the 4^{th} place. On the whole, we were 6^{th} in the Overall among 12 schools.

The Inter-class Athletics Meet was held on 12th and 19th October, 2004 at Wan Chai Sports Ground. Lee Yin Fung (4C) broke the B Grade 100 m record with a new performance time of 12.04". He also received a Bronze medal in the same event in the Inter-school Athletics Championships, which was held in March, 2005. Following the participation in the Inter-class Cross Country, seven teachers took part in the A Grade 5000 m (Mr. T. S. Wong, Mr. W. K. Wong, Mr. C. T. Leung, Mr. Y. C. Chu, Mr. W. F. Lau, Mr. K. C. Cheng, and Ms. K. M. Chiu) and another three took part in the B Grade 3000 m (Mr. C. K. Wong, Mr. S. C. Poon, and Mr. K. T. Yu). Besides, we had a new event this year: Staff 4 x 100 m Walk. Eventually, the team made up of Ms. Y. Y. Lam, Mr. C. K. Ma, Ms. Y. Y. Kwan, and Mr. Y. C. Chu came 1st, and the CSK PTA team took the 2nd place. Our Guest of Honour this year was Mr. Timothy Ho Kwok Fai. Besides contributing his efforts to different sports teams when he was a student in CSK in the 1980s, Mr. Ho was also a sponsor of our Football Team this year.





Our team members did very well in the Inter-school Athletics Championships, which was held in March, 2005. Most of them achieved the HKSSF standards, and many of them were qualified for the Semi-finals and Finals. Four of our relay teams were also qualified for the Finals. Altogether, we had got 4 Silver and 4 Bronze medals for individual events, and 2 Silver and 1 Bronze medals for the relays. For the team results, our A, B, and C Grade team positions were 4th, 2nd, and 3rd, respectively. Our Overall position was 2nd and we should be promoted to Division One in the coming season. Many thanks must be given to the efforts of our athletes and teachers-in-charge. Besides, old boys, teachers, and students who went to support us in Wan Chai Sports Ground must also be appreciated. Our successful promotion is actually

the combined efforts of the whole school.

Our Basketball Team and Football Team were promoted to Division One this year. Even though most of our team members had done very well in the games, we actually need more determination in our mind to play and stay in Division One. Sometimes, luck also seemed to be a little bit away from us in some of the matches. That was particularly true with our Football Team. Eventually, our Football Team had to be relegated to Division Two for the coming season.

For racquet games, our Badminton Team did quite well and was 5th in the Overall. Lau Chi Yin (5C) was selected by the HKBA to represent Hong Kong to play in the World Cup Junior (Under 18) Badminton Championships. He should have set a good example for other team members that there is no substitution for regular practice in order to be successful in high level sports competitions.

Our Table-tennis Team had great improvement this year under the coaching of Mr. Ng Man Fai and Mr. Kan Ka Wai. With more structured training sessions, both of our B and C Grade teams came $3^{\rm rd}$ in the Final Round, and the combined results placed us $2^{\rm nd}$ in the Overall position. We hope that such a progression can be kept and we can have even better performance in the coming seasons.

New to our sports events this year was the CSK King of the Road Championships. The Championships actually consisted of four races, which varied in length and difficulty (from easiest-shortest to hardest-longest). The races were scheduled so that they scattered evenly throughout the remaining school year after the Inter-class Cross Country. The objective of the Championships is to increase the motivation of team members to keep up with their training throughout the year. We are very grateful to Mr. Hase Wong Yan Kit, our old boy as well as an outstanding long distance runner of CSK, who agreed to sponsor the Championships. Mr. Wong had also sponsored our P.E. website for its web hosting and domain name registration. After four tough races, Yip Wai Kin (4D) eventually beat Wong Yue Shing (6A) slightly and won the Champion title in the A Grade. His brother Yip Wai Hong (3D) also took the Champion title in the B Grade, while the C Grade Champion title went to Lai Kit Ting (1B).

Sports Report

For teaching and learning, Mr. K. M. Yuen had just retired and Mr. C. T. Leung became a new member to our P.E. Department. Mr. Yuen had been one of the teachers-in-charge for the Swimming Team, Football Team, and Athletics Team for many years, and he was undoubtedly responsible for many of our previous victories in these events. We hope that Mr. Yuen may enjoy his leisure time after his retirement, and come back to visit us more often in the future. Mr. Leung is still a current basketball player in open competitions. He has a lot of experience in high-level competitions and should be very helpful to our teams in the future.

Again, our P.E. lessons this year were very much affected by the School Improvement Project. We had only one basketball court to use for most of the time and the situation became even worse after the Easter holidays. We had no playground to use at all. All of our P.E. classes had to be conducted in Perth Street Sports Ground, which was already crowded with P.E. classes from other neighboring schools. Fortunately, such a situation did not last very long and our playground became available again at the end of May 2005. However, some of the inter-class competitions were still waiting to commence when this report was being written. One of the good news concerning the School Improvement Project is that the G12 classroom will be reserved as a Weight Training Room for the P.E. Department. This should undoubtedly improve the general physical fitness levels of team members in order to play well in more intensive inter-school competitions. We hope that with the additional facilities and more determination to win, our team members can achieve much better inter-school competition results in the coming years.

Latest Information

We received the official letter from the HKSSF on 10 June, 2005, which stated that our school was elected the **Most Progressive School** (Boys Schools) for the BOCHK Bauhinia Bowl Award this year. This is undoubtedly a great encouragement for our athletes to continue striking for even better performances in the future.



十月四日,本旅之名字經世界上第一艘私人製造之太空船:宇宙飛船一號Spaceship One帶到太空低軌道飛行,該太空船更因此成功獲得美國支持私人設計及製造太空船飛行之X獎勵基金---XPRIZE。十月下旬,本旅將一份童軍文物連同學校之校章交與中國極地探測船--- 雪龍號之中國南極科學考察隊帶往南極,藉以表示對國家和考察隊的支持。

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
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
