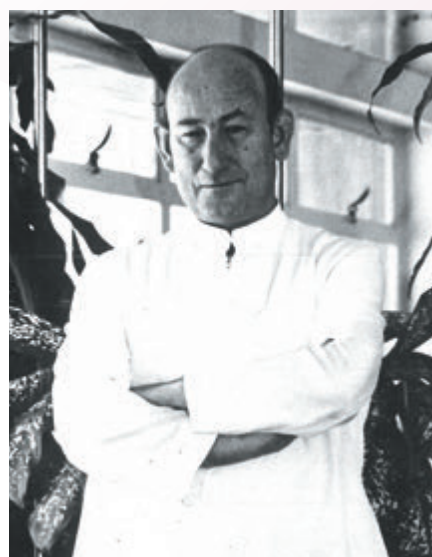

Message of His Holiness Pope Francis for the XXXVIII World Youth Day

“Rejoicing in Hope” (Rom 12:12)

Dear Young People,

This past August I met hundreds of thousands of your contemporaries from all over the world who converged on Lisbon for World Youth Day. During the pandemic and all its uncertainties, we had hoped that this great moment of encounter with Christ and with other young people could take place. Our hopes were realized, and for many of us who were present – myself included – that event surpassed all our expectations. Our meeting in Lisbon was magnificent, a genuine experience of renewal, an explosion of light and joy!

At the end of the final Mass in the “Field of Grace”, I spoke of the next stage of our intercontinental pilgrimage: Seoul, Korea, in 2027. First, though, I invited you to Rome in 2025 for the Jubilee of Young People, where you too will be “Pilgrims of Hope”.

As young people, you are indeed the joyful hope of the Church and of a humanity always on the move. I would like to take you by the hand and walk with you on the path of hope. I would like to speak with you about our joys and hopes, but also of our sorrows and concerns, and those of all our brothers and sisters in the human family (cf. *Gaudium et Spes*, 1). In these two years of preparation for the Jubilee, we will meditate first on Saint Paul’s words, “Rejoicing in hope” (Rom. 12:12), and then those of the prophet Isaiah, “Those who hope in the Lord will run and not be weary” (Is. 40:31).

What is the origin of this joy?

“Rejoice in hope” was Saint Paul’s encouragement to the community of Rome at a time when it was undergoing harsh persecution. The “joy in hope” proclaimed by the Apostle is the fruit of Christ’s paschal mystery and the power of his resurrection. It is not a product of our human efforts, plans or skills, but of the energy born of an encounter with Christ. Christian joy comes from God himself, from our knowledge of his love for us.

Pope Benedict XVI, reflecting on his experience of the 2011 World Youth Day in Madrid, asked: “Where does joy come from? How is it to be explained? Certainly, there are many factors at work here. But the crucial one is this certainty based on faith: I am wanted. I have a task in history. I am accepted, I am loved”. He went on to say: “Ultimately we need a sense of being accepted unconditionally. Only if God accepts me and I become





convinced of this, do I know definitively: it is good that I exist... It is good to be a human being, even in hard times. Faith makes one happy from deep within" (Address to the Roman Curia, 22 December, 2011).

Where is my hope?

Youth is a time full of hopes and dreams, stirred by the many beautiful things that enrich our lives: the splendour of God's creation, our relationships with friends and loved ones, our encounter with art and culture, science and technology, our efforts to work for peace, justice and fraternity, and so many other things. We are living at a time, though, when for many people, including the young, hope seems absent. Sadly, many of your contemporaries who experience wars, violent conflict, bullying and other kinds of hardship, are gripped



by despair, fear and depression. They feel as if they are in a dark prison, where the light of the sun cannot enter. A dramatic sign of this is the high rate of suicide among young people in different countries. In such situations, how can we experience the joy and hope of which Saint Paul speaks? There is a risk that instead we will fall prey to despair, thinking that it is useless to do good, since it would not be appreciated or acknowledged by anyone. We may say to ourselves, with Job: "Where then is my hope? Who will see my hope?" (Job. 17:15).

When we think of human tragedies, especially the suffering of the innocent, we too can echo some of the Psalms and ask the Lord, "Why?" At the same time, however, we can also be part of God's answer to the problem. Created by him in his image and likeness, we can be signs of his love, which gives rise to joy and hope even in situations that appear hopeless. I think of the film "Life is Beautiful", where a young father, with great sensitivity and creativity, manages to transform harsh realities into a kind of adventure and game. He enables his young son to see things with "eyes of hope", protecting him from the horrors of the concentration camp, preserving his innocence and preventing human malice from robbing him of a future. Stories like these are not just fiction! We see them played out in the lives

of so many saints who were witnesses of hope even amid the most horrid examples of human evil. We can think of Saint Maximilian Mary Kolbe, Saint Josephine Bakhita, and Blessed Józef and Wiktoria Ulma and their seven children.

This capacity for instilling hope in human hearts was masterfully described by Saint Paul VI: “a Christian or a group of Christians who in the midst of their community... can radiate in a simple and unaffected way their faith in enduring values and their hope in something unseen and even unimaginable” (Evangelii Nuntiandi, 21).

Hope, the “little” virtue

The French writer Charles Péguy, at the beginning of his poem on hope, spoke of the three theological virtues – faith, hope and charity – as three sisters who walk together:

*“Hope, the little one, walks beside her two older sisters,
practically unseen.*

...

Yet she, the little one, drags everything along.

Because Faith only sees what exists.

And Charity only loves what exists.

But Hope loves what will be.

...

She is the one who makes the others keep walking;

She is the one who leads them on,

and makes them all walk together”

(The Portico of the Mystery of the Second Virtue).

I, too, am convinced that hope is humble, little, yet essential. Think for a moment. How can we live without hope? What would our days be like? Hope is the salt of our daily lives.

Hope, a light shining in the night

In the Christian tradition of the Paschal Triduum, Holy Saturday is the day of hope. Situated between Good Friday and Easter Sunday, it is a kind of no man's land between the despair of the disciples and their joy on Easter morn. It is the place where hope is born. On



Holy Saturday, the Church commemorates in silence Christ's descent into hell. We see this portrayed in the many icons that show us the Lord, radiant with light, who descends to the darkest depths and crosses over them. God does not simply look with compassion on our experiences of death, or call to us from afar; he enters into our moments of hell like a light that shines in the darkness and overcomes it (cf. Jn 1:5). This is nicely expressed by a poem in the South African language Xhosa: “Even if hope is at an end, by this poetry I revive hope. My hope is revived because my hope is in the Lord. I hope that we will all be one! Remain steadfast in hope, for the good outcome is near”.

If we think about it, that was the hope of the Virgin Mary, who remained steadfast beneath the cross of Jesus, certain that the “good outcome” was near. Mary is the woman of hope, the Mother of hope. On Calvary, “hoping against hope” (cf. Rom. 4:18), she never wavered in her certainty of the resurrection that her Son had proclaimed. Our Lady filled the silence of Holy Saturday with loving and hope-filled expectation, and inspired in the disciples the certainty that Jesus would conquer death and that evil would not be the last word.

Christian hope is no facile optimism, no placebo for the credulous: it is the certainty, rooted in love and faith, that God never abandons us and remains faithful to his promise: “Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil, for you are with me” (Ps. 23:4). Christian hope is not a denial of sorrow and death; it is the celebration of the love of the risen Christ, who is always at our side, even when he seems far from us. “Christ himself is our great light of hope and our guide in the



night, because he is 'the bright morning star' (Christus Vivit, 33).

Nurturing hope

After the flame of hope is kindled in us, there can be times when it risks being extinguished by the worries, fears and pressures of daily life. A flame needs oxygen to keep burning, in order to grow into a great bonfire of hope. The gentle breeze of the Holy Spirit nurtures our hope, and there are several ways that we cooperate in this.

Hope is nurtured by prayer. Prayer preserves and renews hope. It helps fan the spark of hope into flame. "Prayer is the first strength of hope. You pray, and hope grows and moves forward" (Catechesis, 20 May, 2020). Praying is like climbing to a mountaintop: from the ground, the sun can be hidden by clouds, but once we climb beyond them, its light and warmth envelop us. We see once more that the sun is always there, even when everything around us seems dark and dreary.

Dear young friends, when you feel surrounded by the clouds of fear, doubt and anxiety and you no longer see the sun, take the path of prayer. For "when no one listens to me any more, God still listens to me" (BENEDICT XVI, Spe Salvi, 32). Let us take some time each day to rest in God, especially when we feel overwhelmed by our problems: "For God alone my soul waits in silence, for my hope is from him" (Ps. 62:5).

Hope is nurtured by our daily decisions. Saint Paul's invitation to rejoice in hope (cf. Rom. 12:12) calls for

concrete choices in our everyday lives. I urge all of you to choose a style of life grounded in hope. Let me give just one example. On social media, it always seems easier to share negative things than things that inspire hope. So my concrete suggestion is this: each day, try to share a word of hope with others. Try to sow seeds of hope in the lives of your friends and everyone around you. For "hope is humble, it is a virtue that is built up day by day... We need to remember each day that we possess the first fruits of the Spirit, who works in us through the little things" (Morning Meditation, 29 October, 2019).

Lighting the torch of hope

Sometimes, when you go out at night with your friends, you bring your smart phone and use it as a light. At huge concerts, thousands of you move these modern candles to the rhythm of the music; it is an impressive sight. At night, light makes us see things in a new way, and in the darkness a certain beauty shines forth. So it is with the light of hope which is Christ. From Jesus, from his resurrection, our lives take on light. With him, we see everything in a new light.

We are told that when people would come to Saint John Paul II to speak with him about a problem, the first question he asked was: "How do you see this in the light of faith?" When we see things in the light of hope, they appear different. I encourage you, then, to start seeing things this way. Thanks to God's gift of hope, Christians are filled with a new joy that comes from within. The challenges and difficulties will always be there, but if we possess a hope "full of faith", we can confront them in the knowledge that they do not have the final word. And





we ourselves can become a small beacon of hope for others.

Each of you can be such a beacon, to the extent that your faith becomes concrete, rooted in reality and sensitive to the needs of our brothers and sisters. Let us think of those disciples of Jesus who one day, on a high mountain, saw him transfigured in glorious light. Had they stayed there, it would have remained a beautiful experience for them, but the others would not have shared it. They had to come down from the mountain. So it is with us. We must not flee from the world, but love the times in which God has placed us, and not without reason. We can only find happiness by sharing the grace we have received with the brothers and sisters that the Lord gives us each day.

Dear young people, do not be afraid to share with others the hope and joy of the risen Christ! Nurture the spark that has been kindled in you, but at the same time share it. You will come to realize that it grows by being given away! We cannot keep our Christian hope to ourselves, like a warm feeling, because it is meant for everyone. Stay close in particular to your friends who may be smiling on the outside but are weeping within, for lack of hope. Do not let yourselves be infected by indifference

and individualism. Remain open, like canals in which the hope of Jesus can flow and spread in all the areas where you live.

"Christ is alive! He is our hope, and in a wonderful way he brings youth to our world!" (Christus Vivit, 1). I addressed those words to you almost five years ago, after the Synod on Young People. I encourage all of you, especially all those engaged in youth ministry, to reread the Final Document of 2018 and the Apostolic Exhortation *Christus Vivit*. The time is ripe to take stock of the situation and to work together with hope for the full implementation of that unforgettable Synod.

Let us entrust our lives entirely to Mary, Mother of Hope. She teaches us how to carry Jesus, our joy and hope, within our hearts and to share him with others. Dear friends, may you enjoy every step of the journey you are making! I bless you and I accompany you with my prayers. And I ask you, please, to pray for me.

Supervisor's Message



This most auspicious academic year is the very one in which we, as a community, witnessed all school routines and activities revert to the familiar “old normal” of the pre-pandemic age. Incremental improvements to the school curriculum have been intelligently implemented and integrated in order to keep pace with the rapid changes occurring in society.

Our school successfully rolled out a pilot class of “Bring Your Own Device” (BYOD) to facilitate e-learning in class teaching and interaction. Following the more-than-satisfactory outcome of this pilot class, the training wheels are off, and we will unfurl our wings even further, to incorporate both Secondary 1 and Secondary 2 classes in the coming academic year. Moreover, brand new state-of-the-art interactive touch displays are in the process of being installed, right now, in all the classrooms and most of the function rooms, replacing the traditional anachronistic blackboard. The installation will be carried out during the summer time in 2024 and the equipment is expected to be fully functional in September. The purpose of the project is for our professional teachers and promising students to pursue knowledge, both individually and collectively, in a modern and effective manner. Rest assured, this

improvement project is supplementary to our pre-existing common practice of the traditional approach. We refine, not replace. Thus, teachers and students will find these ergonomic tools extremely handy to make use of whenever it is deemed a prerequisite to do so.

Renovation work to be carried out concurrently with the interactive touch displays is the remodeling of the gymnasium. More than five hundred thousand dollars was raised among old boys and parents to realize the restoration. The dimensions of the gymnasium will be expanded to accommodate more fitness equipment, and as such, provide more possibilities for our students to be more powerful both physically and psychologically. The renewed gymnasium will be named Mr. O'Brien gym room to commemorate the late Mr. O'Brien who was the sports master of CSK for a long time and brought CSK into the top contender in the sports arena.

The outstanding 2023 DSE examination results of CSK reflects both the high calibre of our senior form students and the exquisite care expended by our teachers. We have achieved improvements across many subjects. Furthermore, several subjects even achieved the top rank in terms of value-addedness, which measures the

improvements made by students after they joined CSK for six years. Therefore, striving even further still, we aim to maintain the momentum which will eventually provide a better foundation for our students as they sail in uncharted waters of their future careers.

In addition to brilliant academic results, our sports teams achieved equally outstanding results in areas including athletics, bowling, and fencing, not to mention equally stellar success for both the STEM and drama groups. Staying physically fit and mentally creative is a demonstrably vital development for our boys, and the school likes to see our students actively participating in those extra-curricular events.

I would like to welcome Mr. WS Tong, former principal of La Salle College, and Mr. SM Mark, an old boy of CSK and former vice principal of Cheung Chuk Shan College, as they join the Incorporated Management Committee of the school. I have high confidence that they will bring invaluable experience to CSK. Another new member joining the IMC this year is Mr. MH Siu, our elected teacher manager.

2024-2025 is the year in which CSK celebrates the milestone of its 1969 founding. A series of celebratory activities are planned and will start in September 2024 to mark our 55th anniversary. Another celebration, which will run through 2025 is the 150th year of the establishment of Lasallian education in Hong Kong. The year 1875 marked the arrival of the first batch of De La Salle Brothers in Hong Kong from France. Since then, a total of eight schools have been founded by De La Salle Brothers in Hong Kong, providing Catholic education for students of all walks of life, especially those in need of it most.

Mr. TL Lee, our principal, is retiring after 2023-24 academic year. Mr. Lee joined CSK in September 2010. He is the longest serving lay principal of CSK. Mr. Lee showed his strong leadership heading the school and his passion towards our students. In these fourteen years, the Hong Kong education sector has experienced numerous challenges and tremendous changes. Mr. Lee

demonstrated his ability to keep CSK an environment in which our students find it an enjoyable place to learn.

This year, we also bid farewell to Mr. WT Lam, Mr. MH Fan, Mr. KT Yu and Ms. WL Leung who have all worked with us for a long time. I wish all of them an enjoyable and healthy life ahead. The school always welcomes any member of the CSK family to visit us any time. Lastly, I would like to thank the editorial team of the school magazine, which is led by the new team leader, Mr. SH Leung, for their hard work.

In terms of academics, the overall results of our students in the HKDSE surpassed the territory figures. On the sports front, our badminton and basketball teams have shown remarkable dedication in their Division One competitions. In bowling competitions, after winning the U20 Boys Individual Champion in a local competition, Jovi Ma from 4C represented Hong Kong in the 23rd Asian Junior Tenpin Bowling Championships, and finally won the Boy's Masters silver medal. Our students have also got promising results in STEM and other competitions. In the 18th Infrastructure Building Competition 2024, we were honoured with the Best Design Award, and our school choir got a bronze award at the Music Festival. Our Drama Team participated in the Hong Kong School Drama Festival, receiving awards for Outstanding Script, Outstanding Stage Effects, Outstanding Cooperation, and Outstanding Performer.

Recognizing that our school buildings are over fifty years old, we have been taking every opportunity to upgrade our school facilities. With the approval of the Quality Education Fund, we have successfully secured funding of over 1.5 million for our project iFuture Classroom which will enhance classrooms and special rooms with interactive touch displays. We are committed to further promoting e-learning by integrating mobile devices to



foster student engagement and interaction. Thanks to the generous donations from our old boys, the Fitness Room upgrade project will be completed this summer. The new fitness room will be dedicated to Mr. O'Brien, our late sports master, in recognition of his lasting contributions to the school.



The 2024-2025 school year marks the 55th anniversary of CSK. Our celebration theme, "Embrace and Empower – Celebrating 55 Years of Lasallian Education", will bring together a series of engaging events, including open days, an anniversary dinner, and a thanksgiving mass. These occasions will serve as wonderful opportunities for our school community to unite and celebrate this milestone.

As the school year ends, I would like to bid farewell and express my deep appreciation to Mr. MH Fan, Mr. KT Yu, and Ms. WL Leung for their years of dedicated service. I myself will retire from the position of principal. It has been a great honour to serve in this capacity, and I am grateful to the late Brother Lawrence Blake and the School/Incorporated Management Committee for entrusting me with the leadership of our school over the past fourteen years. 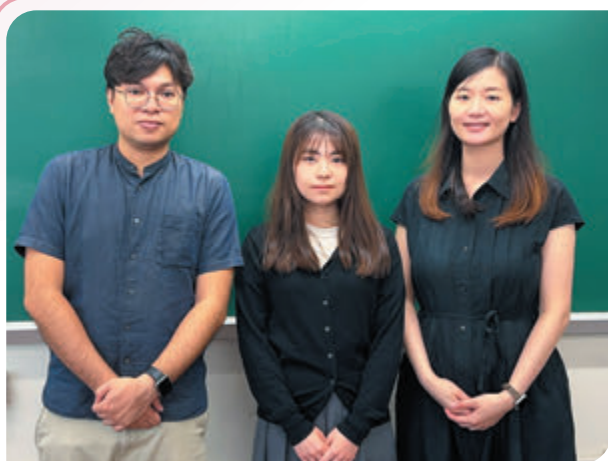

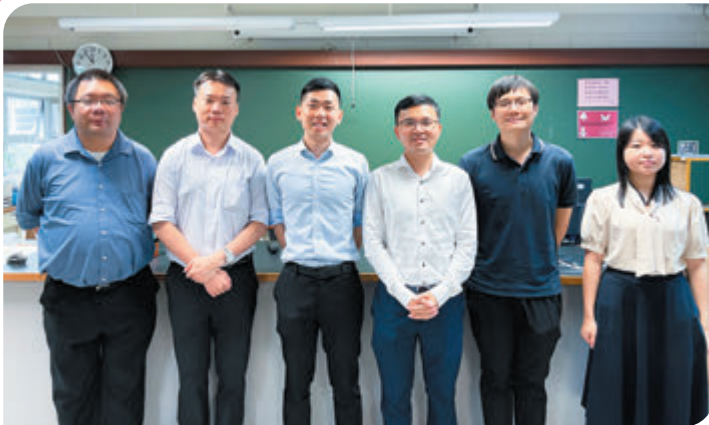

Speech Day

Speech by Professor Freddy Boey

President and University Distinguished Professor of City University of Hong Kong

This is really a great honor to address all of you, staff, proud parents and of course most of all the graduating cohort. Well done and congratulations.

I would like to start by telling you that you have a great future ahead of you. I suspect that some of you will soon go overseas, whether it be London or Australia, Toronto, United States, or other places. Many of you will remain in Hong Kong. To those of you who will go overseas, yes, there are world-class universities all over and I hope the best for you. To those who remain in Hong Kong, lucky you. You might be surprised if I were to tell you that in the whole world, London has four top universities in the world, top-hundred, annually, based on Times Higher Education. Boston has three, very good, but three. Singapore, only two. Very good, but only two.

There's only one city in the world that has five top one-hundred universities, global universities. Only one, that is, no other than Hong Kong itself. So those of you who remain in Hong Kong, congratulations, too. You've done very well. CityU happens to be one of them but I'm not going to advertise it right now. Whichever universities and whichever carrier you embark on, you will graduate, you will move on. Where do you think, in ten or twenty years, you can find in the world the most vibrant region, the most exciting, opportunities, a place where you can develop your own career and contribute to society as best you can? You'll be surprised.

Myself, I told all my four children, they have graduated, they have their family, they studied overseas, whether in England or New York or Philadelphia, and one of them is in Singapore. All of them came back to Singapore. Now I'm in Hong Kong. The truth is that ten to twenty years from now, you will be an adult, and you will



contribute wonderfully. The most exciting region in the whole world is right here in Southeast Asia, in Hong Kong, in the Far East. That is one of the reasons why I came to Hong Kong. I don't need to go anywhere else to find some exciting places. Having said that, wherever you are, whatever jobs and careers and work that you may do, remember this, that you came from a very wonderful school, La Salle. I too come from a Christian school. I noticed that, whether in Hong Kong or in Singapore and I'm sure in many other parts of the world, the Christian schools have provided and contributed quite a disproportionately high number of leaders in society. That's my own observation not because they are particularly cleverer than all the rest. My suspicion is that one reason that the graduates become leaders in society is because during school time, they have inculcated character building in the name of Christian schools.

La Salle, Christian based character building, kicks in deeply when you graduate and you start to work. What matters is not from which school you come from and what matters is not what degree you have and which university you graduate from, but the manner in which you carry yourself in your workplace – honesty



and integrity. So, I hope that as you graduate, you will remember the alma mater, this school, very well.

You will remember that not only you have got a qualification here, but that you have developed your character here. You have had an education. In time to come, when you become more successful, or when you move further along and you are contended, finally develop your career, you will soon discover that when you were young you chased after success, and that's

not wrong. Success is a strong motivating factor for people to do well, study hard, pass exams and that kind of thing. But once you reach it, it's almost like you climb a mountain only to find that there is another mountain that you want to climb.

And many of us in our career, whether we are professionals or in missions in other places, we discover that easily when you mature, and when you graduate, you move from success and success is for yourself.



You now start talking about impact. Impact is for other people. You've got a long way to go, graduates, but remember these words — as and when you achieve your success, it's time to think about making an impact. Success is for yourself; impact is for other people. That's how it comes around that you will remember your own



society, you will remember your school, and having been successful, you would like to come back and make a meaningful impact, whether contributing time, ability or financially.

I'll keep this short, and end by sharing with you the one thing that I learnt in my life when I was young, and that has brought me all the way up to today, a simple lesson I learnt from my Christian school. That's when you learn to honor God, you will find that God will honor you. Honor God, in everything that you do, and God will Honor you.

God bless you, and may you have a wonderful future. Thank you.

Red Cross

In recent years, there are wars around the globe from Eastern Europe to the Middle East and Africa. May we ask, can we care more, and be more altruistic to our surroundings? "I, as a member of the Hong Kong Red Cross, promise to serve the country in which I live and to join with others all over the world to help the sick and the suffering", the Hong Kong Red Cross enrollment oath of CSK boys has echoed again in the hope of promoting humanitarian values, but in a grander sense.

After one year, the enrollment of our schools' Red Cross Youth Unit 52, YU52, was held swimmingly in Yu Chun Keung Memorial College on the 6th of July, in the name of Kowloon South District KC-S Joint-Enrollments. For the resounding success of such a long-running commemorative event, let us extend our heartfelt gratitude to the joint efforts made by staffs and OCs of high calibre and acumen, from KC-S Department and 5 other Youth Units. This cherishing moment was witnessed by the officiating guest Mr. Lin Tin Yau, who is an old boy of our school who joined the Red Cross during the formative years of our unit in 1974 and is now retiring as the Chairman of the Hong Kong Red Cross Youth Committee. And also, our Principal Mr. Lee Ting Leung, plus the sponsor of the Unit. This enrollment was also officially the last Red Cross enrollment Mr. Lee came along to witness and celebrate, embarking the end of his long and illustrious work in CSK, too.

Established ever since 1972, the Hong Kong Red Cross Youth Unit 52 has long flourished time by time, passing the torch generation by generation to disseminate the values of "Protect, Care and Respect". CSK boys were provided the opportunity to indulge in activities and training to their all-round development in their youth years. The following dissects the highlights of the unit in several categories.



Training

Multifarious training courses were available for CSK boys, to name a few popular ones, they usually had First Aid Trainings, Nursing Trainings and Marching drills. Not only can they learn more in-depth knowledge and skills about health-related and medical-related problems, but also the spirit of teamwork, endurance and the essentials in communication skills with others. Competitions in different disciplines were also provided by the Hong Kong Red Cross to motivate students around the city to strive harder in their training. This year, after years of recessions from the COVID-19 pandemic, the Unit had been eagerly attending quite a number of courses, training and competitions. For instance, all F2-5 members had attended and completed Youth First Aid Proficiency and Youth Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation courses held by our former Unit Officer Mr. Li Wing Kwong and our Assistant Unit Officer cum unit sponsor, Mr. Tam Lut Ming. The Unit also presented great attendance in other courses and First Aid and Nursing Competitions this year. All these training aimed to cultivate CSK boys to be more responsible for caring for others and have a better capability of different skills, providing learning experiences rather than just textbooks. For CSK Boys, Red Cross, as an uniform group, also served as a place for them to learn the perseverance in following instructions of the leaders in squads, and those with leading roles had to learn how to be a good coordinator of a team.



Service



Volunteering service has always been one indispensable part of the Unit, complying with the volunteering vision of the Red Cross. "Health is the pursuit of all success", First Aid on-duty services were scattered around events that the school had, like the Athlete's Meets, Swimming Gala, Inter-class Sports Competitions held by the Student Association, and during lunch time as well. Members devoted themselves to care for the injured schoolmates and gained valuable experiences in treating emergencies too. The Unit also attended a joint-unit Service Project with Pooi To Middle School, to organize various interactive mini games for primary students from Sharon Lutheran School with the theme of educating them about mental health and psychological disorder. It is well hoped that the Unit would continue to probe and restore more alternative service and volunteering activities, for example Community Care Projects, Health education to CSK Boys and services on the World Blood Donor Day.

Friendship

Welcome Parties and Friendship Functions were always held yearly by the Unit to provide



members with euphoric school life experiences. With the former organizing interactive games around every corner of the school building for CSK boys within the Unit, and the latter cooperating with other units. This year, the Unit had the collaboration with units of neighboring schools, Wa Ying College and Y.W.C.A Hioe Tjo Yoeng College, holding interactive games and hotpot gathering at Y.W.C.A Hioe Tjo Yoeng College. Hopefully, members can also enrich themselves with better interpersonal skills with others from organizing joint-school events, and to rekindle their obliterated youth with these joyful memories!

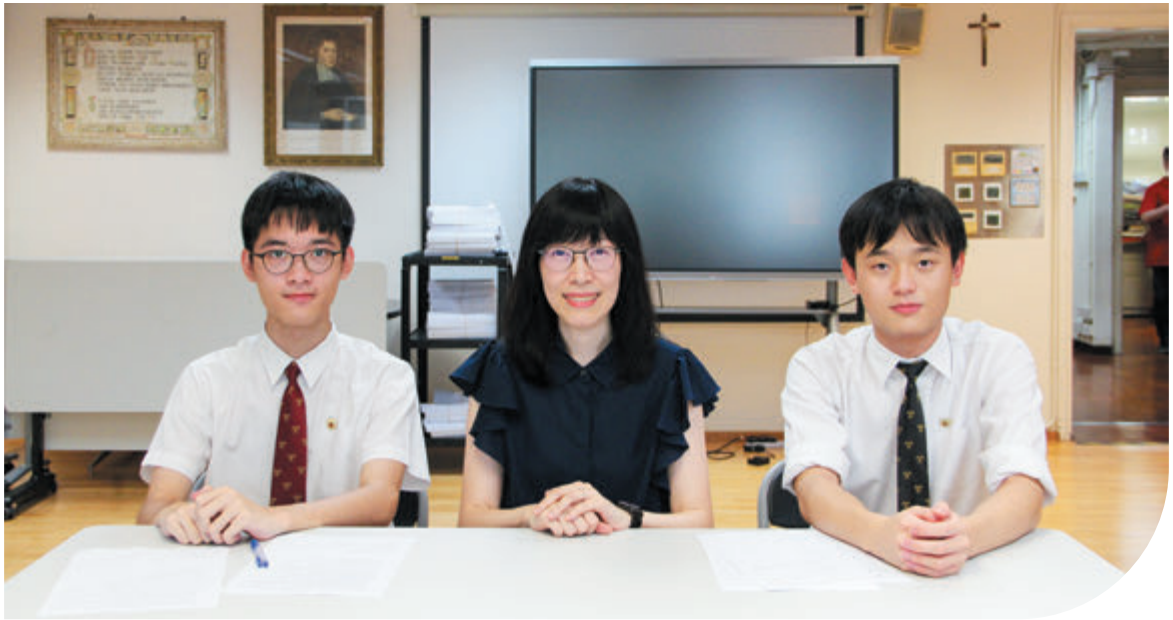

An Interview with the New Principal Ms. Lee Po Chu Fiona

We are delighted to be informed that Ms. Lee will be the Principal of our school in the next academic year of 2024-2025. Let's dive into her responses to know more about her!

The Past

Ms. Lee started her teaching career as an English teacher at CSK in 1996, became the school's Careers Mistress in 2004 and was promoted to Vice-Principal (Pastoral) in 2018. It is not uncommon for us to experience some setbacks and misfortune in our lives, so has Ms. Lee. Due to domestic reasons, she left the school for a while. Before re-entering CSK, Ms. Lee

challenged herself in a different capacity as to serve the education sector in a broader context. She offered support service to local schools about career and life development and organized student activities and seminars for teachers and parents. Worthwhile, these eye-opening experiences were all genuine pursuits to do better in the sector.

She commented that the last few years was a period of contemplation. Nevertheless, she is grateful for every experience that has shaped who she is. She believes that these life events would help her to fulfill her career aspirations. Now that Ms. Lee has gained much more experience, she is poised to commit herself to the school again. She is very honored to be provided with such an opportunity and she is very thankful to the school's Incorporated Management Committee for this appointment!

Impression about CSK

When we mentioned memories of CSK, Ms. Lee had eyes with great semblance of sparkling stars. "Every success of CSK students is unforgettable, but the memory also deeply hinges on our attention to school traditions,"



she said. Then, she elaborated that the cheering and chanting of students at Wan Chai Sports Ground, the singing of S.6 students at the end of the Christmas concerts were all very touching and impressive to her and that she was deeply moved by the true feelings of students and their sense of brotherhood. Ms. Lee plans to strengthen this sense of unity and cohesion. Notably she treasures reunion gatherings with old boys, especially invitation to weddings. To her, it is rewarding to see her students growing into very promising young men.

CSK students, Boys in Red, were described as very energetic, outspoken and creative. She remarked “if they can put all these qualities together into good use, outstanding achievements are there to come.” It was advised that students should broaden their horizon and take effort into understanding what they would like to achieve and whom they would aspire to be.

All in all, she is deeply indebted to CSK where her teaching career began. As she has been given lots of opportunities and support from the school, she would like to embrace the school culture and fuel it into a new height.

View on teaching and learning



Ms. Lee was also willing to venture some opinions and suggestions about teaching and learning. Topping the list of inspirations, for herself, she learnt quite a lot of practical wisdom from the De La Salle Brothers. For instance, Brother Lawrence, who was the late Principal (1991-1995) and Supervisor (1991-2010) of

CSK, stressed that when we run the role of a teacher, we need to be firm but kind to students. Brother Thomas who once taught at CSK’s forerunner, La Salle Evening Secondary School,



taught us that teachers should give comments for personal growth of students but never be judgmental. Last but not least, Brother Patrick, a former School Manager of CSK for many years, reminded us that every one of us ought to own a peace of mind. Ms. Lee explained, “The rationale is that if you lose your balance, you will lose yourself. Having the above quality, we enable ourselves to climb up the ladder of improvements and achievements whatever challenges we face.”

Taking a glimpse of the current education system, she sees a drop in student population in Hong Kong. This, in turn, heightens the competition among schools in Hong Kong. Inevitably, that gives us the message that students’ academic performance still takes priority. Another prominent but overlooked phenomenon is that there are lots of new initiatives and policies running right now. All of us are busy and occupied by the new schemes and activities. This stifles the communication time between students and teachers. Therefore, for the best, she sincerely hopes that the teacher-student ratio can be increased so that more individual attention will be delivered to students.

Speaking of what her goals are as the principal next year, she would like to manifest herself in alignment with the school’s vision “Teach minds, touch hearts and transform lives”. She endeavours to provide whole-person education for students, striving to bring out the best in everyone, and creating a positive school climate that also prepares students for this rapidly changing world. She aspires to aggrandize students in several aspects, namely broadening students’ exposure, enhancing their self-efficacy and nurturing their

learning ability.

Ms. Lee was not given a lot of opportunities to talk to new CSK students before this interview was conducted, but she is quite aware of the facility upgrades like the library, gym and rooms for extra-curricular activities like RoboMaster Competition. All of these upgrades will be of great benefit to students.

Advice on learning English

Ms. Lee would like to share some of her genuine advice on learning English and convey her utmost desire for enhancing the English proficiency of CSK students. First of all, Ms. Lee believes that English is all-pervasive in Hong Kong and we can learn English everywhere. Ms. Lee mentioned one of her exceptional ways of learning English in the past. When she was young, she liked to pay attention to any English materials available in her surrounding, for example, famous quotes, lyrics posters and even regulations for passengers on public transport. On top of that, Ms. Lee added that we are sometimes quite reserved when learning English as we tend to be afraid of making mistakes. However, Ms. Lee insisted that one of the keys to learning English is to use it every day. She mentioned that having a slip of the tongue is actually fairly common, as it is for native English speakers. Ms. Lee boosted our confidence by encouraging us to be assertive and fearless in learning English. Through extensive reading and spaced repetition, we could make progress step by step.

Pastime

Apart from work, Ms. Lee also possesses some penchants in order to strike a balance between personal and working lives. To stay healthy, she goes dancing every week. She is also a movie-goer who loves watching films in the cinema. She believes that these activities could relieve pressure, lift

her spirits up and provide her with happiness.

Aside from watching movies and dancing, Ms. Lee also has a sweet tooth as she thinks desserts can provide her with a great sense of euphoria. She is also a traveling enthusiast, providing her with a great opportunity to appreciate the beautiful nature and natural wonder while experiencing multifarious cultures around the world. All these activities imbue her with a hopeful and promising feeling for her days.

Motto for life

Ms. Lee shared her motto with us, and that is "vision with action". Vision with action could fulfill our dream, make a difference and even change the world. She stressed that if we have a lot of goals to achieve but we do not take any concrete actions, this will just end up being reduced into empty talk and a daydream. Ms. Lee conveyed her utmost confidence that our future will be promising if we put our dreams, goals or vision into action. By taking minor steps forward, we will be closer and closer to our goal, leading us into a rosy future.

An Interview with Mr. Wu Ho Ming Victor

1. What made sports special to you?

4. What have you gained while being a sports teacher?

5. What qualities do you think a good teacher requires?

They would have to be caring and empathetic to students. Since everyone in the school has different backgrounds, interests, and personal values, it is important to understand one another's perspectives and show care when they are down or upset and hence to help with their hardships.

6. What attracted you to teach in CSK?

I studied at CSK for two years so I am sort of an old boy. I had good impressions of this place back then when I was still a student.

CSK students were good at both sports and studies, "Working hard and playing hard" is how they were described at that time. They took prizes in various sport categories such as long-running, track and fields, and swimming. I recalled that day in Wan Chai Sports Ground, all of us cheered for the athletes down in the sports field under the leadership of the Student Association. We cheered

so coherently that the cheering sounds were still echoing after we stopped. This spirit feels just so passionate and has strongly impressed me, so it became my wish to be back to CSK to share this passion with the students as a teacher.



7. Are there any job experiences before entering CSK that you can share?

When I was still studying in university, I have also worked as a part-time swimming coach. Working in these part-time jobs could make you realize your interests and things you love doing. For instance, you may enjoy seeing people accomplish what you taught



them. This filled me with satisfaction, and I guess that it is this feeling that pushed me into my teaching career.

I worked as a primary school teacher in my first year of teaching. Back then, I did not know whether I preferred teaching primary or secondary kids more. Though working in primary school was easier, I wanted to leave my comfort zone, and went teaching at secondary schools.

Thus, to explore your interests that you may be ignorant of, I highly encourage you all to join more Extra Curricular Activities(ECA) and find part-time jobs while in university.

8. Do you have any future plans?

For the short-term, I want to get a driver's license within the next year, so that I can drive the members of school badminton and swimming teams to training and competition venues without having to tiringly walk there every single time.

For the mid-term, I hope that my PE elective students can keep their perseverance and determination to score their best and win in the upcoming DSE.

For the long-term, I wish the CSK school team can achieve great results in their inter-school competitions.

9. What were your impressions of CSK as a half-old boy?

When I was still studying in CSK, that coherence, unity and sense of belonging was strong as steel. As aforementioned, the echoes of cheering sounds in competitions were indeed uplifting and heartening. I vividly recall that scene of the swimming team chanting our battle cry before starting the swim. So, my impression of CSK is definitely this steel-strong bonding of students.

10. How do the present CSK differ from the past CSK?

An Interview with Ms. Wong Cho Yu (Counsellor)

1. *What did you study/ work before you became a counselor of CSK? And why would you choose to join CSK and become a student counselor?*

I studied counseling psychology at the Hong Kong Shue Yan University (HKSUYU). I had part-time jobs such as being a tutor before entering CSK, which is my first full-time job. I became a counselor because this is a meaningful job and secondary schools' resources on counseling wasn't enough.

When I was a secondary school student, I needed to take DSE exams. When I was a F.6 student, I had experienced the pressure caused by academics, families and relationships students don't know how or where to seek help if they feel stress or have problems with emotions. As a counselor, giving them support and help to deal with stress and emotions are important.

2. *How do you feel after you have become a counselor?*

As this is my first full-time job, it brings me a lot of unforgettable experience. The the students whom I help are students with Special Educational Need (SEN), which means I need to be more patient to help them with their problems. For those students who have problems with their emotions, they are more unstable and require more adaptability. I have learned more

about how to become a good counselor. This job also helps me develop close relationships with students and I am glad about this.

3. *Are CSK students difficult to deal with?*

When I was interviewing for this job, I thought that would be a challenge for me because CSK is a boy's school. I studied in a co-educational school and my friends were mostly female. For boys, it's a bit difficult for me to deal with their mental problems as I don't have much experience of helping people with a different gender, which makes this job more challenging. At first, I was not used to my job as there were students with excessive emotions everyday whom I needed to help. On the other hand, boys have many emotions but they don't want to face it or talk about it. This job has made me learn more about another side of a boy.



4. Can you share an unforgettable incident when you dealt with a student's problem? How did you feel?

Well, I have many unforgettable experiences this year. I could handle students with emotional problems. But I couldn't forget the worst case. I was worried about him as he has difficulties controlling his emotions. I was worried about his whereabouts, his emotions and even his personal safety. The School office, Mrs. Lau and I worked together, and I learned more about teamwork (how to cooperate with coworkers to solve a case).

5. Could you share some of your personal interests?

I normally tend to read books about or related to psychology as I myself am learning psychology. Additionally, I also enjoy browsing bookstores and reading comics, novels. In my free time, I will also hang out with friends and do sports like running, swimming, hiking and playing badminton.

6. Could you share about your plans in the future?

I will leave CSK in July. I plan to have a long rest. In August, I will be traveling. For September, I have no plans for now, but I will take a rest and decide whether I would choose to have further education or have a job about counseling.

7. Is there anything you want to tell CSK students?

Many students that I met thought that they were weak (always thinking "I can't do it" or "I failed multiple times,



I can't be promoted next year....") this was because they lacked confidence.

I have chatted with different students, and I discovered that CSK student's abilities could be very high, but their lack of confidence causes them not to realise that they could do many things by themselves, so I hope CSK students know that studying is hard, and it is also hard to deal with pressure from family and friends, this kind of pressure might cause you to feel tough but I think you are strong enough to face them, and please remember that if you are feeling too much stress, find someone to help you deal with stress. Do not keep it in your heart but tell others about your situation. I think students should also do more sports as exercising can help relieve stress, maintain a stable mental health and make you feel more joyous and positive. In my opinion, the most important thing students should focus on is doing the thing you want to do most and not solely focus on grades as grades do not define who you are. There are many, many other paths in life.

8. What identity would you have if you weren't Ms.wong?

I think I would be the character Momo in chiiikawa if I weren't Ms.wong because of my playful and attention-seeking personality.

人生路漫漫，總是不會一帆風順，而是註定坎坷不平。逆境經歷過的痛苦便是你繼續人生旅途中珍貴的燃料，推進你成長。然而面對生活中的困難與挫折，人往往容易陷入迷茫。誰敢說自己成長路上沒有坎坷艱辛？我會因為逆境而迷茫，而跌倒，但我永遠會再次爬起。因為我的母親總是默默在我的背後支持我，關懷我。

記得進入中一的第一年，因為未能適應中學的節奏，我的學業成績一落千丈。那個陰雨天的傍晚，我拿著一張學校考試的成績單回到家中。這可能是我人生中最落寞的一天，把成績單扔到床的一角上，不忍直視的成績深深地刺痛了我的心，只得抱著枕頭痛哭一番。由於外婆的病重，母親每天都要去醫院照顧外婆，有時候我一天也不能見到她一面，沒有了母親的監管，沒有了母親學業上的輔導，平日總是一個人孤獨的生活，我的脾氣變得喜怒無常，頹廢的生活，種種因素令我難以跟上生活的節奏，學業上的壓力就像是一隻無形的大手，把我死死地按在水面下，讓人透不過氣。想起生活中的這些挫折，我既迷茫又憤怒，對未來自己的前途感到迷茫，又憎恨這樣頹廢無能的自己。

我猛地把身邊看到的東西用力摔向牆上，向逆境中頹廢卻無助的自己無能狂怒。過了好一陣子，手邊的東西都被我砸的稀碎，只剩一地的狼藉。母親悄悄地走了進來，靜靜地望著我。我自

知犯下了大錯，我不敢抬頭看她，低下頭暗暗地抽泣。外面突然狂風大作，一聲驚雷落下，打破了這可怕的寂靜。床頭成績單上刺眼的不合格三個大字，地上的一片狼藉。我的心中既是害怕又是迷茫。可是，預期平日裏狂風暴雨般的責罵聲卻并未傳來，母親悄悄地坐在了我的隔壁。

手掌傳來一陣午後陽光般的溫暖，陰雨天的關係，空氣變得潮冷，母親的手卻依舊是如此溫暖。我抬起頭，看見她憔悴的臉，眼角微微的紅，疲憊的雙眼正凝視我，「對不起，阿羽，是媽媽的疏忽，讓你一個人孤獨地生活，是媽媽不好，沒有照顧好你。」我的眼淚又不爭氣地掉。它又安慰了我道：「這次一定是你的失誤而已，我相信阿羽的能力，媽媽對不起你，媽媽太忙了，不能再輔導你的功課了，但是媽媽一直會在你背後支持你，無論你考的怎麼樣。知道嗎？」母親又開始悄悄地收拾地上的碎渣。我下定決心改過自新，發奮圖強，決心要走出這人生的逆境。

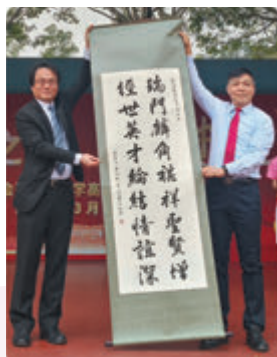
姊妹學校計劃



我校與江門市新會陳經綸中學（下稱經中）於去年正式締結為姊妹校，經中創辦人陳經綸先生為香港著名企業家、慈善家，同時亦為我校創辦人陳瑞祺先生之子，令是次締結為姊妹校更具實質意義。

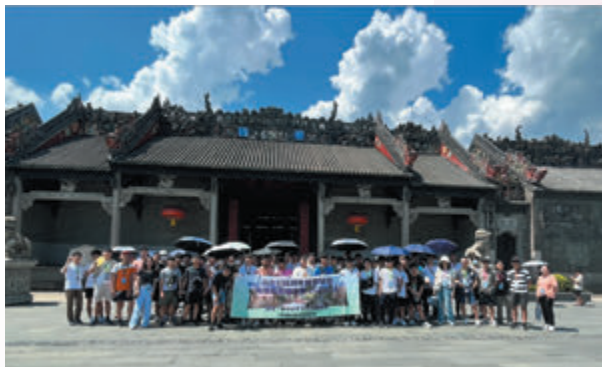

余啓東老師、梁韻玲老師專訪：育才二十五載，風雨同舟

余啓東老師和梁韻玲老師，這對在瑞祺教壇深耕二十五年的伉儷，憑借春風化雨般的教導之心，培養了數不勝數的社會棟樑。二人默默耕耘，情系教育，無愧為瑞祺的兩大功臣。



次學界比賽結束後，二人恰巧同路前往地鐵站，途中的簡短交談，使二人的命運開始交織，仿若天作之合，緣分在不經意間深種。

祺「志」：教學創新，百折不撓

在教育事業上，余老師是不畏艱難的。二十多年來，他肩負化學科主任的職責，孜孜不倦。鮮有人知的是，其實余老師早於十年前就開始拍攝視頻講解課本內容，這可謂是別出心裁。某次偶然接觸「翻轉課堂」的理念，余老師被其獨特的教學模式深深吸引，遂立志推行此法。正所謂「不積跬步，無以至千里」，儘管最初成效不顯著，余老師依然堅持不懈，最終迎來校方、教育局的認可與推廣。

光陰荏苒，二十八年如白駒過隙。余老師由學生到教師，再到步入婚姻殿堂，彷彿都與瑞琪，有著剪不斷的緣分。當年，正值大學的他，偶然得知母校在招聘化學代課老師，心血來潮便前去應聘，未曾想便由此踏上教育育人的道路。從此，他一邊白天教書，一邊晚上撰寫大學論文，肩負雙重責任，熬過了黎明前的黑暗，最終在教育的廣袤天地中站穩腳跟。這可謂是命運的巧合，也是一場機緣巧合。

祺「麗」：家校相融，言傳身教

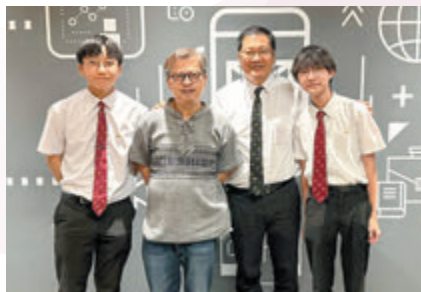

不要「白了少年頭，空悲切！」——梁偉峰校友專訪

引言：

梁偉峰先生現年已經接近從心之年，但仍然充滿活力，現擔任衍盛教育科技創辦人兼首席執行官，而他所創立的雅典娜巴學園希望能提供學生優質的學習環境，培養下一代人才。



自身經歷：

梁師兄在中學畢業之後曾擔任過不同工作崗位，例如洋行、食品公司、釀酒公司等管理工作，而後他亦去到加拿大留學，而留學完成後，他亦為不同公司擔任管理層工作，並在加拿大及香港兩地奔波。

梁師兄坦言當時的他十分幸運，能夠得到寶貴的工作機遇，也感到很感恩。其後在2012年，他離開了原本工作的公司，創辦了現在的衍盛教育科技，幫助小學生學習中文。梁師兄認為現今社會大多年輕人對中文的認知不足，他舉出例子表示有一些年輕人進入公司時，因缺乏寫字的經驗，連基本的守則也無法寫出來，因此被淘汰，所以梁師兄希望幫助下一代的人學好中文，平衡中英能力。

學生時期：

梁師兄認為母校作為天主教的學校比較特別，陳瑞祺會有很多修士，甚至當年的校長也是一位修士，換句話說，陳瑞祺的文化十分豐富。每一個老師的風格亦有不同，有曾經教授過梁先生中文科的老師，他的教學手法可謂十分厲害，滔滔不絕，侃侃而談。還有曾教授過師兄歷史科的老師能夠把歷史故事講得栩栩如生，令同學們聽得津津有味。最後還有黎老師也是師兄的好朋友。

敢於說愛：

在訪問期間，師兄曾提及到《背影》這篇文章，《背影》這篇文章詳述了作者朱自清童年時期與父親離別時的場景，作者通過對父親背影的描寫，抒發出作者內心深處的情感以及對父親的敬愛之情，父親的背影象徵著他默默地付出以及無私的奉獻。但當我們仔細回想，文章沒有提及到「愛」一字，又如何表達出「愛」呢？作者只是通過描述父親的背影間接地表現出對兒子的愛，就像現今的社會一樣，我們對身邊的人很少說「愛」。人生匆匆，在人生的道路上會出現很多過客，匆匆到訪亦匆匆離去，只有小部分人會留下。在人生的道路上，我們要好好珍惜身邊的所有人，好好珍惜那些陪伴着我們成長的人。

結語：

最後，李校長向學生分享了他的學習理念：「學習是終身的。」校長強調，學習並不會在完中中學或獲得幾個學位後就此結束。面對不斷變化的時代，學生在投身社會後，不論身處何種行業，都應該持續裝備自己。校長還勉勵學生不斷擴闊視野，對陌生的事物不必感到恐懼，而應該透過學習去擁抱、理解並應用新知識，透過增加認識來減少對未知的焦慮，因為每一件新事物都可能成為幫助自己的一股力量。

除此之外，校長期望大家能夠把握機會，探索並發揮自己的天賦與才華，施展所長，服務社會。同時，校長也希望大家能夠繼續承傳陳瑞祺的文化與精神，維繫陳瑞祺大家庭的歸屬感與內在聯繫。

教育的挑戰與前景：

另外，校長提到資訊科技的迅速發展已成為全球教育界所面臨的一大挑戰。他指出，自二零二零七年智能手機開始普及以來，到二零二三年人工智能風靡全球，資訊科技在短短十幾年間經歷了爆炸式的發展，學習模式也隨之多次變遷，形形色色的
