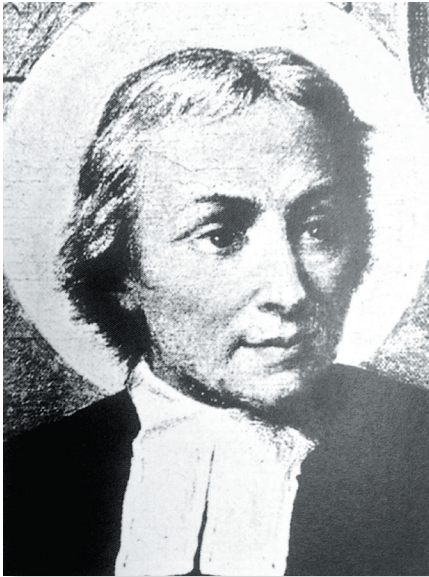

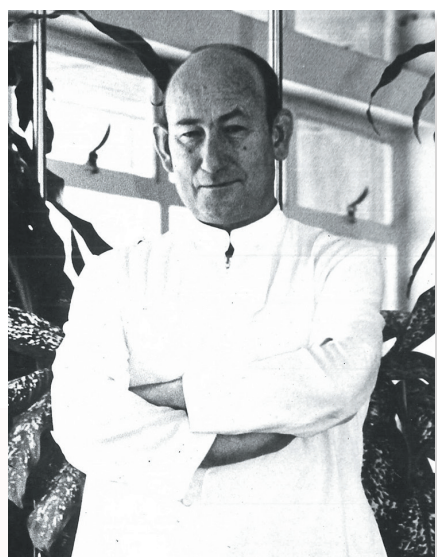

SUPERVISOR'S MESSAGE

As the 2024-2025 school year comes to a close, we reflect on a year filled with festive celebrations and activities at CSK and the Lasallian Family in Hong Kong.

CSK kicked off its 55th anniversary celebrations with Open Days on December 7th and 8th, 2024. The event brought together the Lasallian Brothers in Hong Kong, the benefactor, thousands of CSK students, as well as students from other schools, staff, old boys, parents, family members, and friends. Everyone gathered on the school campus over the two days to enjoy games, food, drinks, and music in the pleasant, sunny weather.

The O'Brien Gym officially opened on the same day as the Open Day, thanks to the generous donations from old boys. This facility pays tribute to Mr. O'Brien, who served as the head of the Physical Education Department for many years and guided our outstanding school sports teams to excel. The new gym is equipped with a variety of training equipment, offering students a space to improve their fitness, build strength and muscle, and maintain a healthy weight.

The highlight of the 55th anniversary celebration was the gala dinner held in the grand ballroom of BP International in February. Approximately 600 attendees, including some from overseas, gathered to enjoy a memorable evening. Throughout the night, people with familiar faces and forgotten names reconnected, rekindling a strong sense of community and the CSK spirit.

The highly anticipated Variety Show titled "Fraternity," organized by the Students Association "Renacido," will take place after the final examinations in celebration of the 55th anniversary. The show will feature locally renowned singers, groups, bands, and talented performers, including our teaching staff and student members. It aims to attract students from CSK and other

schools, as well as old boys and friends.

In retrospect, the first group of six Lasallian Brothers arrived in Hong Kong from France in 1875 and established St. Joseph's College. Since then, a total of five secondary schools and three primary schools have been opened across the territory, including Chan Sui Ki (La Salle) College in 1969. A series of community programs will celebrate 150 years of Lasallian education in Hong Kong. These programs include beach cleanup activities, raffle ticket sales, the "Camino de La Salle" (a mini walkathon connecting several Lasallian schools), and a performing arts show. All these activities are designed to support and care for the community.

All students are aware that CSK had an exceptional new principal at the start of the school year. Ms. Fiona Lee, who previously served as an illustrious vice principal of the school, has rejoined CSK as the new principal. The Incorporated Management Committee of Chan Sui Ki (La Salle) College has supreme confidence in Ms. Lee and her exemplary management team to lead CSK onwards and upwards by creating an environment in which meaningful learning can occur. After this summer holiday, Mrs. A. Lau and Ms. S.Y. Hung will retire after many wonderful years of service at CSK. I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to both of them for their dedication to the school over the years, and I wish them a very happy retirement.

CSK achieved outstanding results both in the academic and sports arenas, especially in mathematics, the 110M hurdle in track, fencing, and bowling. F5 student Jovi Ma has even achieved excellent results in international competitions, thereby being selected as one of the Top Ten Sportsmen for the Student of the Year Award organized by the South China Morning Post.

Lastly, I would like to thank Mr. S.H. Leung, his team members, and student editors for their tremendous effort in preparing this content-rich school magazine.

To pivot our work to meet ever-changing needs and challenges ahead, we continue to invest in developing

As the existing three-year school development plan is drawing to a close, a design thinking workshop has been organized in which managers of the Incorporated Management Committee (IMC) and the school's middle managers collaborated for school improvement. Credits go to IMC Managers especially Brother Dennis Magbanua F.S.C. and Mr. Clement Lam for their leadership and support. This synergy from within has generated among participants a momentum to change. The drive continues to grow in the expanded new teacher induction programmes offered by the School Sponsoring Body, guiding our new teachers to understand and live out the spirit of St. John Baptist De La Salle. We have also enhanced professional development of teachers in various aspects such as e-learning, empowering teachers to bring about pedagogical change.

Connected by the School Benefactor, the Chan family, a delegation from Jiangmen including Vice Secretary-General of the CPC Jiangmen Municipal Committee and Director General of Jiangmen Municipal Education Bureau visited CSK and observed our online cultural exchange activity with the sister school, Xinhui Chan King Luen College. RED CROSS

Established in 1972, we have continued to organize activities centered around training, service, and friendship. Below are the highlights of our unit's achievements across several aspects.



Events and Celebrations

During the CSK 55th Anniversary, we hosted multiple games, including trivia via Kahoot and Jenga, allowing visitors to learn about the history of the Red Cross and its Seven Fundamental Principles.



Training

The Hong Kong Red Cross provided CSK boys with a diverse range of training courses, such as Basic First Aid, First Aid Proficiency, Sign Language, Nursing Proficiency, and Drill Instructor training. These programs equipped students with essential health and medical skills while fostering teamwork, endurance, and effective communication. Notably, all F2-5 members completed the Sign Language course, led by our Assistant Unit Officer and unit sponsor, Mr. Tam Lut Ming. Special thanks to Mr. Li Wing Kwong, who, despite being retired, returned to lead the Basic First Aid course, sharing his invaluable expertise and dedication. As a uniformed group, the Red Cross helped CSK boys develop perseverance in following squad leaders' instructions and refine their team coordination skills. These courses cultivated responsibility, care for others, and practical abilities, which provided enriching learning experiences beyond textbooks.

Service

During the Swimming Gala, Athletics Meet, and the Sheung Wo Cup held by the Student Association after school, our members provided emergency First Aid services to all in need. They diligently cared for injured schoolmates, acquiring essential expertise in emergency medical response.

This year, our unit partnered with Youth Unit 50 (YU50) from Tak Nga Secondary School for a three-day joint-service project at the Martha Boss Lutheran Community Centre. We organized various mini-games to teach primary students the importance of first aid in emergencies. For instance, we introduced the Automated External Defibrillator (AED) through engaging cardboard games and conducted treasure hunts to familiarize students with first-aid equipment. Reflecting the ICRC's commitment to humanitarian education, these activities fostered teamwork and community spirit. We hope to continue such initiatives, including World Blood Donor Day and health education for CSK boys, to inspire future generations.

Friendship

Our annual Welcome Party and Friendship Function united Red Cross members, fostering community spirit. Collaborating with Y.W.C.A. Hioe Tjo Yoeng College, we enjoyed games like "Guess the Songs" and treasure hunts around the school, sparking laughter and new friendships. These activities, in line with the ICRC's values of unity, honed members' teamwork and interpersonal skills. The vibrant atmosphere at Hioe Tjo Yoeng College created lasting memories, reinforcing our commitment to the Red Cross's mission. Through fun and connection, we strengthened bonds and rekindled our passion for humanitarian service.

Competitions

Participating in the WKD First-Aid and Nursing Competitions tested our team's grit and skill. With over 100 scenarios—ranging from treating fractures to managing disaster triage—training began right after school, often stretching late into the night and across weekends. This hard work forged teamwork and resilience, mirroring the ICRC's humanitarian principles of preparedness and care. Mastering complex simulations, like rescuing victims in mock earthquakes, was exhausting yet rewarding. "Hard work pays off!" Our team proudly secured a "Top 8 in the Kowloon City - South District" ranking, a testament to our dedication. This experience honed life-saving skills, empowering us to serve our community in real emergencies. Judges praised our precision under pressure, fueling our drive for future competitions.

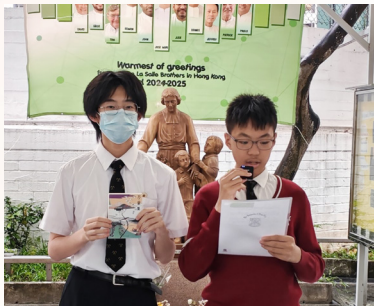

AN INTERVIEW WITH BROTHER EDMON VIROOMAL F.S.C.

We are delighted to have Brother Edmon Viroomal F.S.C., a serving brother at CSK, with us for an interview.



1. Can you briefly introduce yourself and your background?

Hello, everyone! I'm Brother Edmon Viroomal F.S.C., but students at CSK know me as Brother Edmon. Before joining the Lasallian Brothers, I taught at a Lasallian school in the Philippines. That experience sparked my curiosity about the Brothers' way of life, leading me to join their community.

2. Do you have any favourite memories from your time in the Philippines?

I have many cherished memories, but two stand out. First, I was assigned to a mission school located by the sea. Stepping out of the Brothers' house or the school, I could walk to the balcony and feel the ocean breeze on my face—it was incredibly serene. Unlike many schools in Hong Kong, which serve students from diverse backgrounds, this school primarily catered to underserved communities, making it a unique and rewarding experience.

Another highlight was working on an advocacy project to support indigenous people living in mountainous regions. Our goal was to adapt their educational system to better suit their environment and needs, ensuring they received a meaningful and relevant education.

3. What motivated you to become a Lasallian Brother?



My decision was largely driven by self-motivation, but the influence of the Brothers I worked with played a significant role. During my nine years of teaching, I interacted frequently with the Brothers at my school. Their lifestyle intrigued me, and as I explored my own faith and identity, they encouraged me to try their way of life. I thought, "Why not? There's nothing to lose." I was also seeking a meaningful change, and becoming a Lasallian Brother offered a unique opportunity to make a difference.

4. Besides being a Lasallian Brother, do you have any other roles or jobs during the weekdays or weekends?

As a Lasallian Brother, my primary focus is education, in line with the charism of our founder, St. John Baptist De La Salle, the patron saint of teachers. While I don't take on other jobs, I sometimes assist other congregations with their educational initiatives if needed. My work is centred on teaching and school-related activities.

6. What do you love about digital art, and have you ever considered becoming a professional digital artist?

I started exploring digital art during the pandemic as a creative alternative to gaming. I'm still a beginner, so I'm not ready to pursue it professionally. What I love most is the freedom to experiment—digital art allows me to make mistakes and refine my work until I achieve the perfect stroke. It's a rewarding and forgiving medium.

7. In your opinion, is art a good medium to promote Lasallian beliefs? Why or why not?

Absolutely, art is a powerful tool for promoting Lasallian values. I once initiated an advocacy project where I created digital artwork for Lasallian



and Chinese feast days celebrated in Hong Kong. These pieces helped raise awareness about the Lasallian Brothers' mission and showcased how our community connects with local traditions, fostering a sense of unity and shared purpose.

8. Apart from digital art, what are your other personal interests or hobbies?

Music will always be my interest, but I stopped playing the guitar, so I would call it an interest, not a hobby. Besides digital art, my hobby now is playing games because I love stories and am fascinated by how the game develops and which characters play key roles in the narrative. It's engaging because of the immersive storytelling and dynamic elements.

9. Do you have any examples of a game that is story-based, and you love it?

Yes, of course, Genshin Impact. It's impressive and one of the best. Although primarily a mobile game, it has dominated the gaming market. Another game is Honkai: Star Rail, from the same company as Genshin Impact. They share similar background settings and overlapping characters, and I love how the story progresses, becoming increasingly unpredictable.

10. What influenced your decision to choose Catholicism as your religion?

Catholicism is deeply ingrained in the Philippines, where you often have little choice in religion. If you're born into a Catholic family, you're raised Catholic. I was baptized months after birth, becoming Catholic before I could speak, with no chance to question it. However, as a university student, I decided to explore my beliefs. I considered other religions and nearly abandoned Catholicism, even becoming an atheist for a while, believing there was no God. Ultimately, a friend's influence led me back to Catholicism.

11. How do you think of our school's students? Are they different from those in other schools?

It's hard to tell because each Lasallian school shares the same values: faith and community. However, what I appreciate about our school's students is their remarkable competitiveness. I arrive early in the morning, and students are playing basketball; I leave at 4 or 5 p.m., and they're still playing! When I joined e-sports and board game activities, I was surprised by their skills, as I initially thought these were just games. Our students' competitiveness truly sets them apart from other schools.

12. What message would you like to share for CSK's 55th anniversary?

My advice for CSK's 55th anniversary is to discern which values to keep and which to let go of. If a practice hinders growth, it's not beneficial in the long run. For example, I was pleased last week to see students using tablets in class—a practice worth keeping, as it supports future learning. Similarly, I'm heartened when students show growing appreciation for the Mass; please continue this tradition. We should maintain practices like these and abandon those that no longer serve our growth.

Lastly, Brother Edmon also had a message for all of us: "Teachers are vital to this community. They're not just educators but also mentors and friends who guide you beyond the classroom. Please show them the appreciation they deserve."

AN INTERVIEW WITH MR. CHO SIU TONG

1. Advice on Studying Chemistry

In the interview, Mr. Cho shared valuable insights into studying chemistry. He views it as a prime example of scientific inquiry. While some memorization is necessary, understanding the underlying logic is more important. Once you grasp concepts, memorization becomes easier. As Mr. Cho remarked, "In kindergarten, we recite 26 alphabet letters; in chemistry, we recite the periodic table. Just like in English, when you know how to use them, you don't have to focus solely on reciting."

For effective study, Mr. Cho emphasizes asking the question "WHY." This encourages deeper understanding—essentially, "ask more, get more." However, merely asking questions isn't enough; he advises students to take notes on what they learn, reinforcing their memory and preventing the overwhelm of trying to memorize too much at once.

2. The Most Challenging Aspect of Being a Teacher

Mr. Cho identifies the most challenging aspect of teaching, particularly in chemistry, as introducing complex and abstract concepts to students. While one might think explaining these ideas is straightforward, effective teaching requires a different approach.

Chemistry involves significant theoretical knowledge, and many fundamental principles cannot be directly observed, making comprehension difficult. Thus, the challenge lies in effectively demonstrating these



concepts to foster genuine understanding.

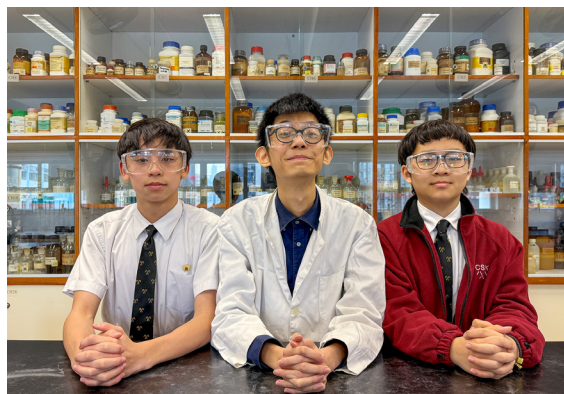
Mr. Cho emphasizes the necessity of concrete explanations and demonstrations. He realized that simply presenting theoretical information was inadequate. Instead, he sought creative ways to illustrate concepts, making the invisible world of chemistry more relatable. He incorporates multimedia resources—animations, images, and videos—into his lessons, helping students better understand chemical reactions and structures.

3. Impression of CSK Students

Upon visiting CSK, Mr. Cho was impressed by the boys' passion for sports. Their enthusiasm contrasted with his expectations, filling the campus with energy. He felt inspired by the spirit of the students engaged in athletic activities. He noted, "CSK's atmosphere was completely different. I felt the joy and camaraderie that I had never experienced before."

Mr. Cho also observed that CSK students are highly engaged and curious. They actively ask science questions and seek interaction, which is rare in other schools. Rather than passively waiting for teachers, CSK students take the initiative in their learning. This proactive approach inspired Mr. Cho to explore new teaching methods, particularly to engage shy students, ultimately improving his effectiveness as an educator.





4. How Would You Manage Your Time Studying?

During the interview, Mr. Cho reflected on his time as a student, where he managed studying four elective subjects while leading the student association. This brought significant pressure due to extensive homework. To manage his workload effectively, he prioritized tasks based on importance and used Excel to create a sequential plan for assignments, allowing for greater efficiency.

5. What Will You Do During Your Free Time?

As a new teacher, Mr. Cho's schedule is packed with teaching responsibilities and administrative duties. He spends considerable time refining his lecture materials. On rare occasions, he enjoys playing contract bridge, a four-player card game that requires strategic communication. Although his free time is limited, he prefers activities that keep his mind sharp, viewing these moments as opportunities to recharge.

6. What Are Your Goals or Ambitions in Life?

Mr. Cho views goals as dynamic milestones guiding him toward his ultimate vision: becoming the "perfect teacher." His goals have shifted over time—from finishing university as a student to now aiming to be a good teacher. The definition of "good" varies, and he prioritizes student voices, helping them engage in both chemistry and life.

By listening to students and embracing self-

improvement, he transforms ideals like "perfection" into daily progress. For him, true success lies in the journey itself: a commitment to inspire, innovate, and care.

7. How Would You Face and Treat Problems?

Mr. Cho approaches problems with a systematic mindset. He detailed his strategy for tackling challenges, emphasizing decomposition and collaboration. To him, problems are interconnected steps, and he seeks the "key step" to build momentum. Solving problems fosters his self-confidence, and he never hesitates to seek help when needed.

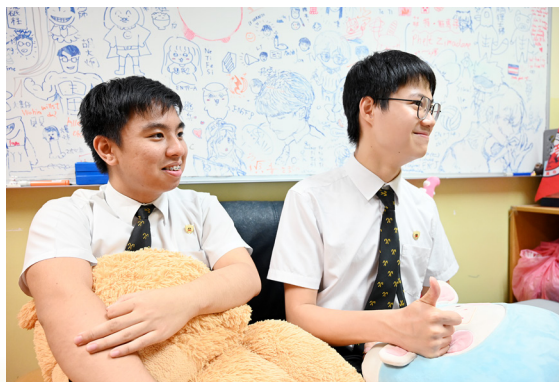
AN INTERVIEW WITH MS. KWAN SUI MAN, IBERIA (COUNSELLOR)

1. What motivated you to become a student counsellor?

I had studied Counselling and Psychology at Hong Kong Shue Yan University for 4 years. I wanted to work as a social worker but was unable to study Social Studies because my score was not high enough. In the end, I studied Counselling and Psychology. Back then, I didn't really know what I wanted to learn or do, but later I found out I wanted to communicate more with teenagers, especially secondary school students, as my age is closer to theirs. I want to learn more about how teenagers think and have more interactions with them.

2. How do your personality traits or strengths help you in your role as a student counsellor?

I am cheerful and always think positively; I'm like a master of positivity and I want to bring positivity to everyone. I am also empathetic, so I can easily think from others' perspectives.





3. How did you feel after becoming a counsellor?

I felt very excited. In the beginning, I was worried about what challenges I was going to face. But now, more and more students are trusting me. Even though sometimes it may just seem like chitchat, to me, it's a counselling session. That's why I feel excited—I'm able to help you all and use the skills I learned in university to assist you.

4. What has been the biggest challenge you've faced at CSK, as well as in your counselling career?

I have to think and adapt quickly in different situations. For example, when talking to parents, I may need to reorganize and change the words I use. I'm in a position between teachers and students, so sometimes teachers may want me to encourage students in an indirect way. I cannot just tell those students directly what the teacher said; I have to change some of the words I use. It is difficult to make everyone happy in the end. If it is not handled well, the situation may worsen.

5. What are your hopes and goals for your future career?

I want to study for a master's degree in clinical psychology and become a clinical psychologist. Clinical psychologists may work in hospitals or schools; they host talks about mental health, like anxiety, for the community to learn what those issues are, how to talk to people, and to identify people with those issues. Clinical psychologists also work privately with clients, perhaps helping to diagnose their issues. Clients may range from children to adults and even the elderly. Through music or art, we can help relieve their issues. But for now, I still want to help CSK boys with all my abilities until then.

6. Is there an encouraging message you would like to share with CSK students?

Believe in your abilities. I always hear students say, "No, I can't do that—find other people to help; don't bother me." I believe you all have the ability to do things well. It is normal to be uncertain sometimes, but you can always chat with people around you. I want you all to realize that you have the ability to shine brightly, but it depends on whether you are willing to take that step.

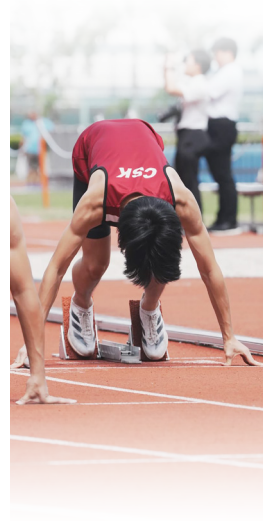
THE 2024 INTER-CLASS ATHLETICS EXTRAVAGANZA AT WAN CHAI STADIUM

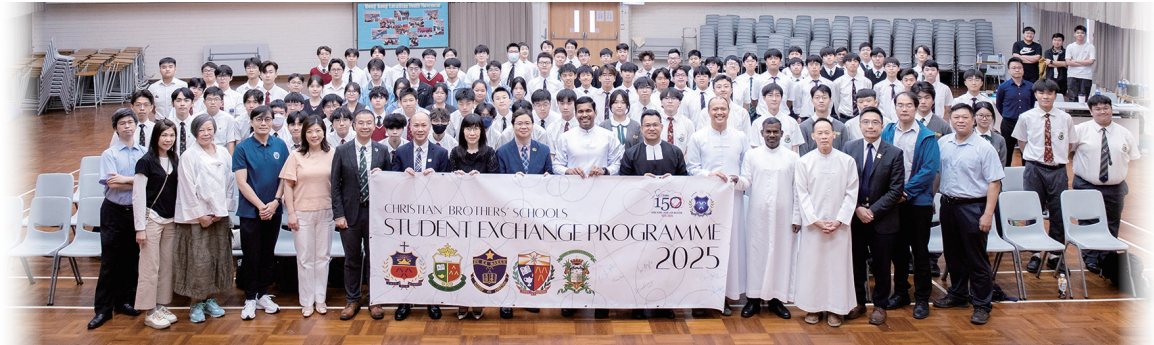

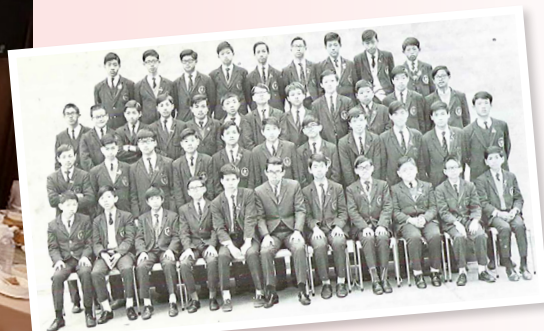

A DAY TO REMEMBER



Life etches countless moments into our hearts, but few days shimmer as brightly as November 9, 2024 - a golden reunion for some twelve former Form 2E classmates from the inaugural cohort of Chan Sui Ki (La Salle) College (CSK). Once the final Form 1E evening class of La Salle College's Boundary Street era (1969), we became pioneers as CSK's first Form 2E class in Homantin. Five decades later, time collapsed as we gathered to celebrate 55 years of brotherhood.

The morning erupted with laughter over dim sum on Waterloo Road. For many, it was our first meeting since parting ways in 1973. Stories spilled forth like uncorked champagne - careers forged, families raised, continents crossed - all compressed into hours of joyous, overlapping chatter.

Then, we stepped into our renovated 2E classroom, now a time capsule of memory. The same walls that once framed teenage daydreams now held men in their twilight years, silver-haired but bright-eyed. "We've become the grandfathers we imagined our teachers to be," someone remarked, sparking knowing smiles.

Here, the past breathed anew: recollections of hiking to the light tower near campus, watching planes from Kai Tak Airport arc into futures we'd soon chase. Five decades later, we'd lived those futures—yet here we were, unchanged at the core. Hong Sir, our de facto historian, wove tales of teachers once feared, now fondly remembered as mentors and friends.

This miracle of reunion began with Form Master Anthony Cheung's spark, fanned by the dedication of teachers Lai Sir, Hong Sir, and Mr. Ravi—our science master and CSK's pioneering Scoutmaster, who flew from India to join us. Principal Ms Fiona Lee's team ensured every detail glowed.

As dusk fell, a banquet sealed the day with clinking glasses and cheers: "To our 55th anniversary!" Though twenty or so classmates couldn't join, their absence hung softly in our toasts - a reminder that friendship, like starlight, endures unseen but unbroken.

In the CSK Alumni Network, we've found more than nostalgia; we've reclaimed the boys we once were, and celebrated the men we have become.

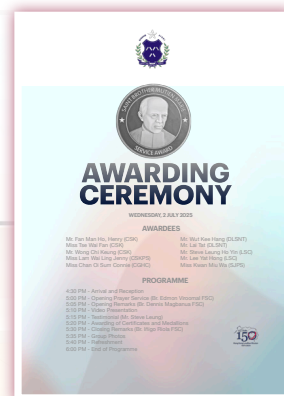
AWARD CEREMONY OF SAINT BROTHER MUTIEN MARIE SERVICE AWARD

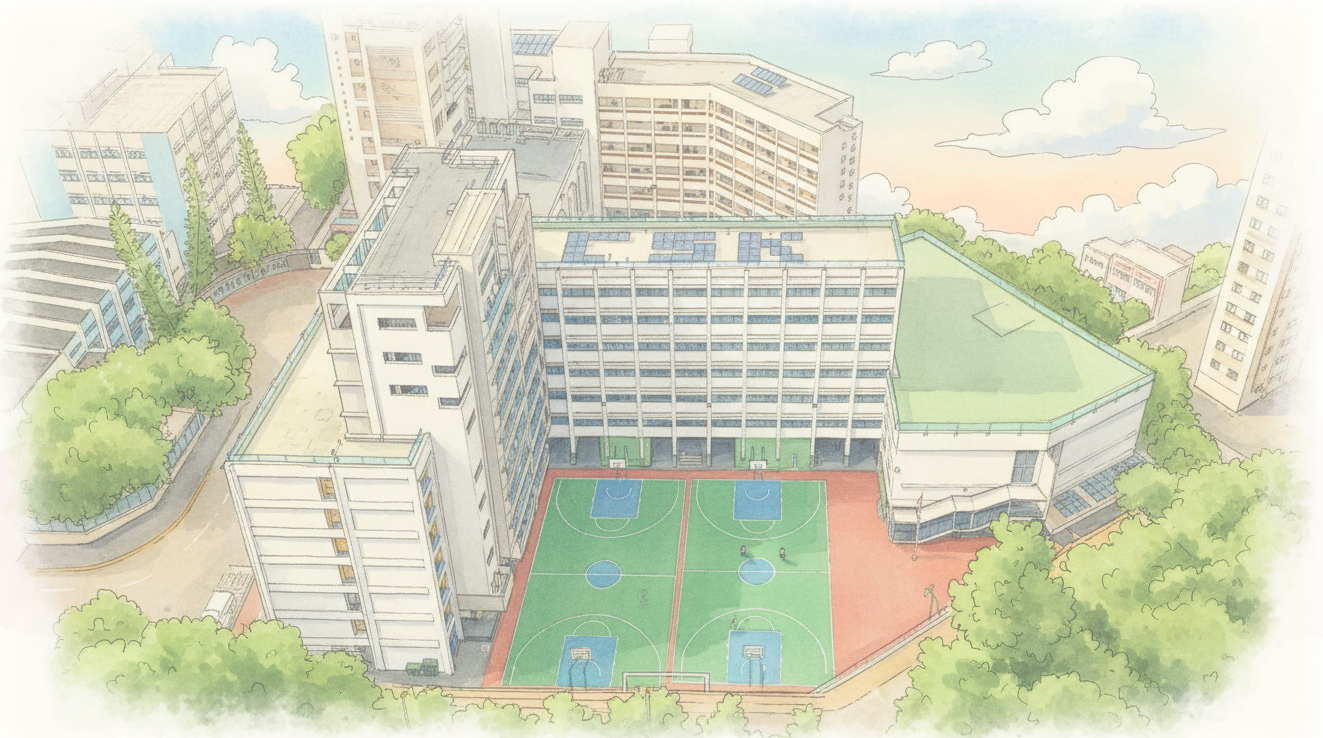

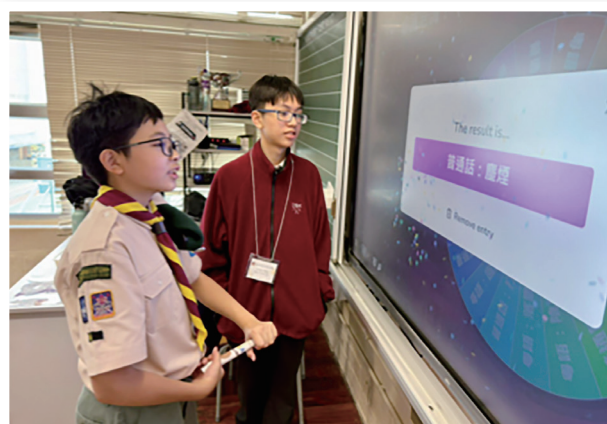

歲月留聲：五十五周年校慶有感

時光就像白駒過隙，轉瞬即逝。原來自己已經陪伴了學校五年，學校邁入五十五周年，對我而言，我認為自己只是一個曾踏足在這所學校的一個「小嘍囉」，每天只等着放學回家，當我在學校慢慢長大後才發現原來在這所學校五年的時間，學校也變了很多。

常聽到師兄們憶述，以前只有幾十名學生，但隨着時光流轉，學校逐漸壯大，從簡陋的校舍，改建為一所有全方位設施，例如教員室，實驗室，電腦室的校舍。他認為這是一段從無到有，從小到大的歷程，更是一部充滿堅韌和奮鬥的成長史。一磚一瓦的堆砌，每一處校園角落的改變，都凝聚着無數人的汗水和心血。學校能夠發展成今天這樣子，是一代代校長、老師，學生共同努力的成果。我聽完師兄們的分享後，我感動落淚，因為自己也能成為推動學校發展的一份子，令學校可以踏入五十五周年，雖然我自知自己只佔了整所學校歷史的很小一部分，但是在任何情況下，我也希望自己能略盡綿力，雖然我這五年為學校所得到的獎項和成就不是很多，我也竭盡所能，為學校爭光，某程度我也算是名留青史吧，最少我也能令我的同學和我的老師都可以替我感到自豪和驕傲！

除此之外，學校的五十五年中，記錄了莘莘學子的希望。每一個進出這所學校的人，心中都珍藏着屬於自己的校園記憶，而這些記憶匯聚在一起，構成學校的歷史和精神。教室裏的聲音，是我在學校記憶中深刻的部分。由我剛進入這間學校到現在中五，我認為教室始終是學校的核心。那裏有老師站在教師桌前的耐心講課，有學生專注上課的恍然大悟，也有課堂上思想激情碰撞那喧鬧的討論聲和笑聲。回憶充滿感慨，同窗們說，儘管當時的教學條件不算太好，但老師們的教學熱情卻絲毫不減。

比如，曾有一位化學老師，為了讓學生理解一些化學原理的誕生，他特意花費將其造成了漫畫版本，令學生可以更容易理解到箇中的知識，從而掌握知識。除此之外，有一位中文老師，在課堂上朗誦《岳陽樓記》，聲情並茂地將文字的美感傳遞給學生。這些點滴成為學生記憶中不可磨滅的片段，也成為學校教育精神的體現。在學校的歷史牆上，我們看到了一張張發黃的照片，那是師兄們在校園裏的青春剪影。他們或許早已步入社會，在各行各業中發光發熱，但當提起這所學校，他們的眼中依舊充滿溫情。他們回憶起當年的操場，可能只是一片泥土地，但那裏承載着他們拼搏的汗水。

他們談起當年的教室，或許沒有空調，卻是他們夢想起動的地方。

當我們再次聆聽校園裏那些熟悉的声音時，會發現他們早已不僅僅是聲音，而是歲月的印記，是青春的回響。

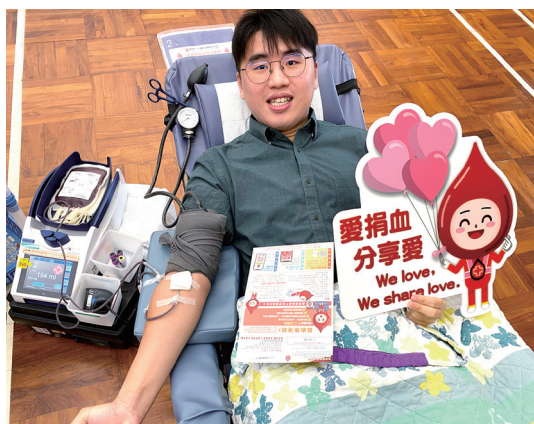
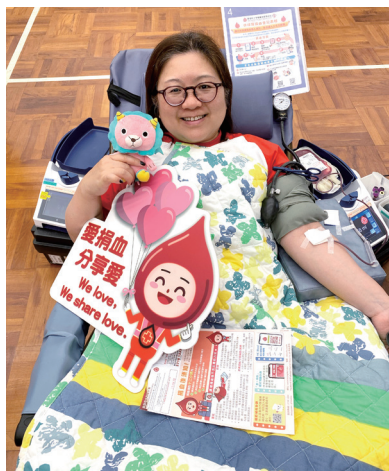
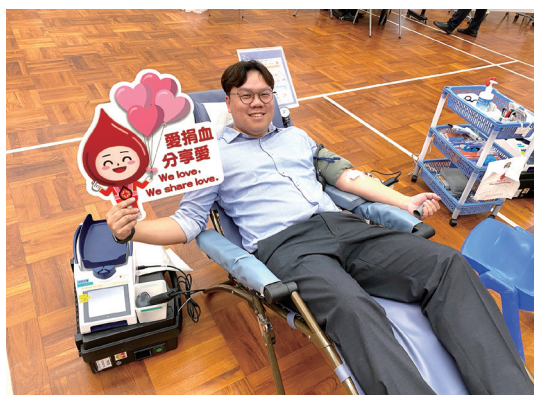
捐血日

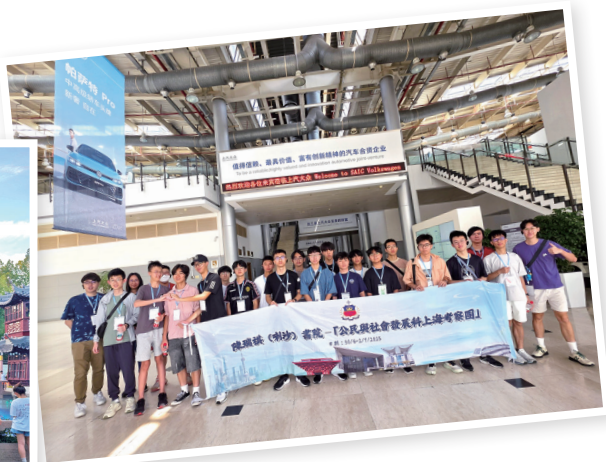
學生感想

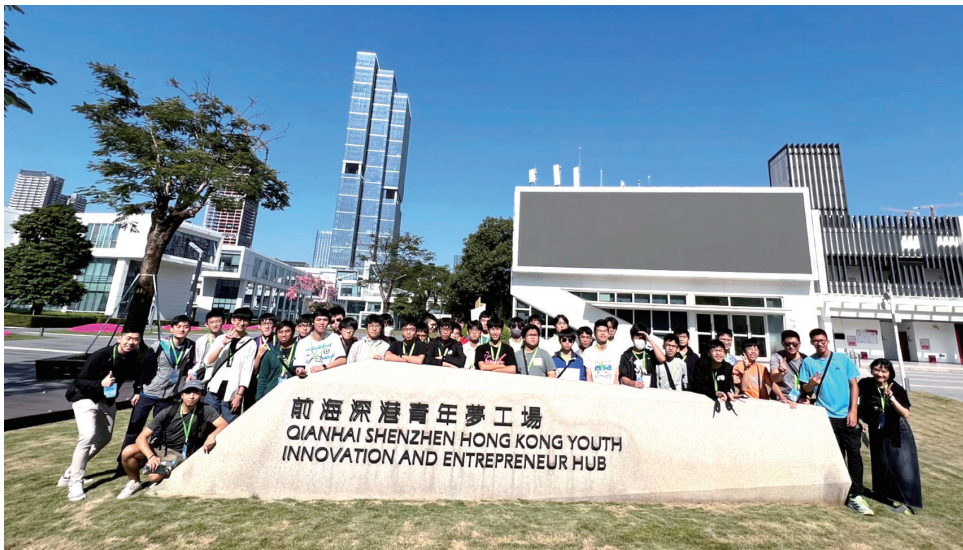

六九年（學校創校之年）入讀中六，七一年畢業的健華師兄，是大學畢業同學中少有的「非公務員」。「我想挑戰自己」，拒絕安穩，遂投身商界。在經營裝修工程四十多年，近年發覺自己以往將清拆可重用的木材送往堆填區，實屬浪費，遂在二零二四年一月與華登師兄創辦協會成為主席，推動長者參與回收協會的工作，亦希望協會可持續發展，並渴望培養傳承者。協會亦得到校友前市建局行政總裁韋志成師兄的支持，提供重建項目暫時空置而待清拆的商舖作為臨時存放回收木材之用。

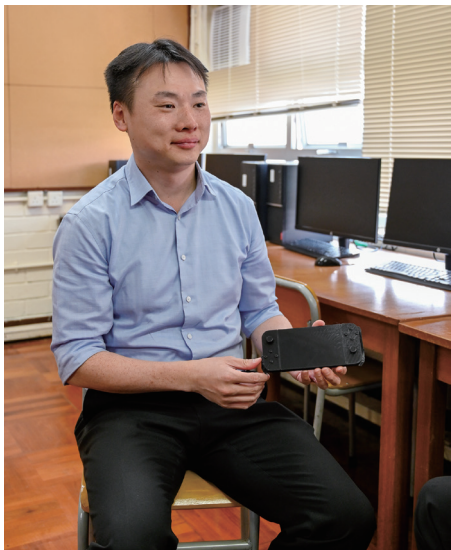


用熱誠啟發獨立思考

資訊科技科主任梁凱威老師專訪

寧可失敗，勝過不試

引言

當梁老師嫺熟地調試著電腦室主機，指尖在鍵盤上敲擊出規律節奏，這個場景恰似他教學哲學的縮影——從早年通識科的宏觀思辨，到如今在資訊科技領域引領着學生們探索不同的事物。作為校內電腦科資深教師兼設備管理負責人，梁老師的身影總穿梭於電腦室與課堂之間。他坦言：「比起傳授技術，我更想讓學生體會『解決問題』的過程。」面對「資訊科技能否帶來未來優勢」的提問，他謙和笑道：「與其說是競爭力，不如說這是一門『腦力體操課』——當你習慣拆解複雜的指令，面對生活難題時，自然能更快找到突破。」

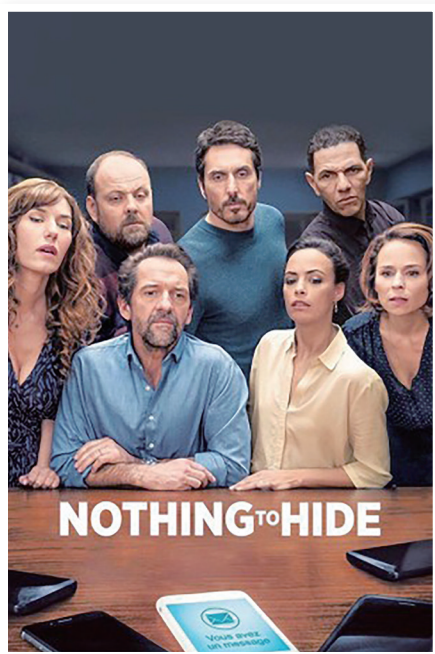
教育與電影的交匯

褪去教師身分，梁老師是個不折不扣的影迷。他提及到自己喜歡觀看不同類型的電影，更是特別喜歡一些小製作及有特別的故事劇情的電影。談及到他最鍾愛的電影——《玩謝私隱》，這部低成本作品用科技隱私議題探討人性本質，證明深刻思考不需要華麗包裝。這種「見微知著」的態度，也體現在他對學生的觀察中：「這代孩子或許較為內斂，但當我看見他

們用立體列印技術改良課室風扇按鈕時，那種純粹想幫助他人的善良，正是教育最珍貴的火苗。」

以經驗塑造教育理念

回憶中學歲月，梁老師坦言自己曾是「對電腦一知半解的普通學生」，直到目睹同學自學關於資訊科技的知識後，自發為校園架設電腦系統，這段經歷形塑了他的教育理念——採訪中他數次強調：「與其要求完美，不如鼓勵學生『在無聊時多嘗試』。就像我的座右銘：每個看似無意義的嘗試，都可能成為改變的起點。在無聊時可以多做些嘗試，可能能夠幫助到別人。」



六、退休生活 發熱發光

退休後，劉老師計劃繼續參與小組治療相關活動：「我會做一些大自然療癒的工作，找到志同道合的夥伴。」她笑言，身心靈療癒是她的新愛好，退而不休，將以更自由的方式延續熱情。訪談結束時，她溫暖地說：「多謝大家，一起拍張照片留念。」

結語

三十四年的音符交響，即將畫上休止符，但劉楊美芳老師的教育熱情，將如餘音繞梁，永駐陳瑞祺（喇沙）書院的校園。透過音樂與關愛，她不僅傳授知識，更點亮無數青春之火。願她的故事，繼續激勵陳瑞祺的各位，在成長路上前行不輟。再一次，衷心感謝劉老師多年對學校的貢獻，祝她的退休生活愉快順利。

三、光芒閃耀 青春共鳴

指導音樂學會多年，劉老師最念茲茲的，是與學生共創舞台的溫度。每年的聖誕音樂會猶如一場歡樂派對：「最精彩的環節當然是新老師演出！」她笑著回憶。為貼近學生，她亦大膽融入流行元素——從《超級無敵掌門人》的懷舊遊戲到《決戰一分鐘》的緊張挑戰，學會成員絞盡腦汁設計互動環節，目的只有一個，就是與全校同歡共樂。

令她驚喜的校外經歷，則是二零一四年參與香港青年協會「Music Alive」計劃。知名樂隊Kolor、Tonick親自指導本校樂隊表演，更在李求恩紀念中學實現同台演出。她眼中閃著光，說道：「能與真實樂隊交流，何其難得！」而這些課外經歷，往往能淬煉成終身興趣。正如她所言，校歌



中「Lead us in our games and studies」早已揭示「引領我們在遊戲與學習中前行」的精神。讀書與活動要兩者並行，她回想歷屆音樂學會主席中，更有成為博士的「讀得又玩得」之才。

四、教育實踐 關愛包容

劉老師自二零零九年起接任輔導主任之職，著手重新設計班主任課課程和舉辦不同的講座及活動，令學生能身心全面的發展。特別難忘的是二零一二年的「火鳳凰奇訓練營」，她與社工帶領三十幾位學生參與了三日兩夜的訓練營，在最後一天劉老師跟參與者分享：「今天是母親節，我本應與我的兒女慶祝母親節，我卻選擇在這裏陪伴你們一同經歷火鳳凰變化的歷程，希望大家能在活動中找到人生的方向。」從學生們的反思和改變，讓她感動不已：「看到他們勇於嘗試，找到新方向，一切都是值得的。」

與此同時，劉老師亦兼任特殊教育需要統籌主任，負責協助有特殊需要的學生融入校園生活。她解釋，這份工作從學校接收首位特殊教育學生開始，便成為她的職責之一：「我們要幫助他們在學習和社交上適應，包括提供調適和小組訓練，幫助他們提升社交技巧。」

同時兼顧教學、輔導與特殊教育的工作，劉老師坦承曾面臨挑戰。面對這些，她調整心態：「接受責任，就邊做邊學。」她回憶，起初因缺乏輔導經驗，曾感到不足，為此她修讀了青少年輔導學碩士課程和參加了無數的工作坊，透過終身學習和實際應用去琢磨成為今天的她。

在與特殊教育學生互動的經驗分享中，劉老師強調理解與關愛：「他們往往直來直往，卻不是故意的，我們要包容他們的困難。」她建議同學們多學習相關知識，避免誤解，並以關愛取代歧視。

五、回顧展望 珍惜感恩

回首三十四年教學生涯，劉老師最珍惜的是與學生共同經歷的時光：「不是課堂內容，而是友情和課外活動的回憶。」她期許學校音樂教育繼續推廣，讓更多學生享受音樂的樂趣；同時，也多辦身心靈的活動，讓學生能健康地成長，獲得均衡的發展。

給年輕教師的建議，她直言：「珍惜機會，一邊做一邊學，不要等到完美才行動。」即將離開陳瑞祺大家庭的學生，她寄語學生：「勇於嘗試學校提供的活動，知足感恩。父母和老師的付出，往往是無形的陪伴與資源。」她感慨，學生常視校園生活為理所當然，卻應珍惜這份幸福。



特殊教育需要統籌主任劉楊美芳老師專訪

「樂育融愛，教澤長流」

前言

在校園的音樂室中，悠揚樂聲伴隨了三十四個春秋。劉楊美芳老師——這位以音樂啟蒙無數心靈、點燃青春熱情的教師，即將結束教學生涯。本文擷取訪談精華，聆聽她以音符譜寫的教育樂章。



一、教育初心 笛聲啟蒙

「其實我是受我的小學音樂老師啟發的。」回溯起點，劉老師坦言中學畢業時曾徘徊於會計與教育之間，未有明確的學習方向。那位音樂老師的一席話，讓她看見了教授學生音樂知識的價值與穩妥，最終選擇踏上雙主修（音樂與數學）的師訓之路。

舊時的香港經濟尚未豐裕，學習樂器堪稱奢侈。懷著樸素心願，她與同儕致力讓學生：「有一技傍身」，劉老師教導每個同學吹奏牧童笛，希望他們懂樂器、明樂理，為他們鋪設未來學習音樂的踏腳石。一支牧童笛，承載著普及音樂、點燃興趣的火種。即便近年因疫情轉向電子教學，她仍會透過平板電腦教導學生彈奏鋼琴。那份讓學生享受演奏的初心，從未改變。

二、樂教創新 薪火相傳

如何讓非專修學生愛上音樂？劉老師是課堂革新的先行者：「音樂室是首個裝有電子白板的課室。」她引入音樂小遊戲，讓學生一邊玩，一邊學習理論，使抽象的樂理知識躍動於互動螢幕之上。

對她而言更難忘的是籌備管樂團的歲月。



一九九九年，她成功申請優質教育基金，創立學校管樂團。最初有二十二名團員，首兩年學費全免，樂器及導師費用由基金資助。這把薪火，終在二零一二年燎原海外——師生四十四人遠赴台灣參加「全球華人管樂名校室內管樂合奏大賽」，勇奪銅獎。「除了學習交流之外，能讓同學跨國觀摩、開闊眼界，無比珍貴。」她欣慰道，當年的團員至今仍有活躍於樂團演奏。劉老師表示，學生的那份熱情，是心中的一團火在燃燒。

對她而言，音樂教育的核心超越技術傳承：「學生未必記得課堂內容，但會銘記一同演奏，共度快樂的時光。」她深信，中學歲月最璀璨的記憶，都來自友情與多姿多彩的課外活動，而音樂正是點亮青春的重要星火。

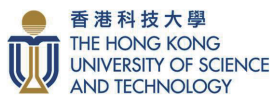
